MIN 1/15/04/2021 OPENING PRAYERS

The meeting started with a word of prayer from Benedicta Gatune. The chairman welcomed all members to the meeting. He also welcomed the new fund account manager.

MIN 2/15/04/2021 READING AND CONFIRMATION OF THE PREVIOUS MINUTES

Chairman asked secretary to read minutes of the previous meeting, secretary read the minutes and they were confirmed as of the true record by Benedicta Gatune and seconded by Joel Laaria.

MIN 03/15/04/2021 MATTERS ARISING

There were no matters arising from the previous meeting minutes

MIN 04/15/04/2021 PENDING PMC BILLS

The fund account manager advised members that it would not be possible to pay the pending pmc bills because of the following reasons.

1. The PMC Accounts are opened in Dhabiti Sacco that is not authorized to transact government Money
2. The pmc members who are signatories to the accounts are not the authorized persons to run and operate PMC accounts. This is contrary to NG CDF regulations that states that PMC accounts should include the stakeholders of the projects ie in a learning institution the principal and chairman of the BOM should be signatories of the PMC accounts.
3. The contractors awarded the contracts were not in adherence to the public procurement and asset disposal Act. There were no list of prequalified contractors and supplies. It is not clear where the contractors were gotten from
4. The files do not show any tender advert
5. There should be tender opening minutes signed by the procurement officer, with the tender opening committee being an adhoc committee. there were no appointment letters from the accounting officer for the tender opening committee and the minutes are not prepared by the Sub county procurement officer
6. The procurement documents used are not the standard documents for small works, only the BQ is attached to the file.
7. The BQs are prepared and signed off by Mr Benard M Njogu who is a retired works officer hence the BQs and the certificates of payment are not authentic. NG-CDF
8. The NG CDFC members appear to have sat in the PMC meeting and even authorize payments. This is contrary to the NG CDF Act where a member of the NG CDFC should not sit in the PMC in opening and evaluation committees.

Sitting the above reasons that contravene the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act and the NG CDF Act the accounting officer could not authorize the payment of the pending bills projects in the PMC Accounts. The accounting officer sought to be given more time to clarify on the issues.

MIN 05/15/04/2021 PREQUALIFICATION OF TENDERS AND SUPPLIES

NG CDFC Tigania East had advertised prequalification tenders on the Star Newspaper. However, the standard prequalification documents were not attached which was an oversight. The accounting officer advised the NG CDFC to do another advert and seek advisory opinion from the sub county procurement officer.

The NG CDFC committee members have agreed that we start the process of prequalification of tenders and supplies afresh.

MIN 06/15/04/2021 AIE DISBURSEMENT

The Fund Account Manager informed the committee that the constituency had received AIEs totaling to 29 million which they needed to disburse to various projects as per the code list to the PMC accounts. After deliberations the committee agreed to disburse the money as follows:-

2. Administration and recurrent Expenditure – Kshs 1,000,000

MIN 07/15/04/2021 BURSARY TERTIARY INSTITUTIONS

The CDfC members deliberated on the Bursary money they had received. The committee expressed concern on the time the schools would be open again. After deliberations the NG CDfC Members were of the view to train 1,000 Boda Boda riders and award them with driving licenses. The fund Account manager informed the committee that they needed to do a project reallocation for unspent amount from Bursary Tertiary Institutions, Kshs 15,000,000- approved in 2020/2021 Financial year Code list to Bursary Vocational Colleges, Kshs 15,000,000- Payment for training and awarding 1,000 needy boda boda riders with driving licenses from NTSA Accredited Institutions. The committee agreed to re-allocate the amount and fast track the project re-allocation from the NG CDF Board

MIN 08/15/04/2021 KIGURU DAY SECONDARY SCHOOL CSR PROJECT

The NG CDfC deliberated on the CSR project for construction of 4 classes at Kiguru Secondary School. The NG CDfC members agreed on this project on need basis. The students in this Ward travel long distances before they can access any secondary school. The community also expressed concern on the same and requested for a school nearby as also indicated in the constituency five year strategic plan and ward report.

The NG CDFC also committed themselves to monitor the project as other NG CDFC Projects and also facilitate the Sub County Works Officer who would be in charge of the project. The committee requested the Fund Manager to Forward the BQ and Drawings to the NG CDF Board.
