0.0 BACKGROUND

1.0 ABOUT NG-CDF

Constituencies Development Fund was established by an Act of Parliament in 2003. Its purpose was to alleviate poverty in the country by dedicating a minimum of 2.5 % of the government revenue to fund grassroots development of community based projects such as Schools, Security, water, health and roads. The Act was amended in 2007 and 2013. The NG-CDF Act 2015 replaced the CDF Act 2013 with effect from 19th February 2016.

The fund is managed by the NG-CDF Board at the national level. NG-CDFC are charged with the responsibility of ensuring participatory project identification, planning, monitoring and evaluation of projects in each constituency.

The NG-CDF is a huge success. Through its funding, education infrastructure likes classrooms, laboratories, dormitories, administration block have been built. Security personnel have benefited from Chief's offices, Police stations, staff houses, office blocks, etc. Bridges have been constructed to ease transport of goods and people. Needy students in the community have benefited from yearly bursary schemes.

0.2 ABOUT CHANGAMWE

Changamwe is one of the six constituencies of Mombasa Count, other constituencies being Nyali, Jomvu, Kisauni, Likoni and Mvita. It borders Jomvu constituency to the East, North and West and Mtongwe creek to the South. It comprises of five wards and four locations. The constituency has a population of 146,613 according to the 2009 population census. The constituency has been funded for all financial years since inception of NG-CDF by the Board.

0.3 DOCUMENTATION OF THE WARD REPORTS

There are five wards in Changamwe Constituency namely, Chaani, Kipevu, Changamwe, Portreitz and Airport. According to Schedule 4 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 projects eligible for funding by the National Government under the NG-CDF Act fall in the Education and Security sectors.

Changamwe NG-CDF conducted consultative meetings with the residents on the eligible projects in each ward for the purpose of deliberating on and coming up with priority projects to be funded under the National Government Constituency Development Fund. These priorities would be forwarded to the National Government Constituency Development Fund Committee for deliberation and subsequently to the NG-CDF Board for approval as per NG-CDF Act 2015.

1.0 PORTREITZ WARD MEETING

The meeting was conducted at Mwangeka parking area. The MCA, ward representative and members of the public were invited.

1.1 Comments by Chairman.

The Chairman introduced the NG-CDFC members and the staff who were present. He welcomed the residents to the meeting and informed them of the importance of holding public participation meetings in order to enhance ownership of the projects by the community.

1.2 Comments by AACI

He thanked the residents for showing up for the meeting. He stressed the importance of enhancing the security of the residential areas. He encouraged those present to always attend these kind of meetings and to be free in giving out their proposals and views on the kind of projects they need.

1.3 Comments by FAM

The Fund Account Manager informed members about the projects eligible for funding under the NG-CDF Act and pointed out the key criteria which were widespread benefits to the community, projects not supporting specific group or religious/ political activities

CHALLENGES RAISED

1. The Uwezo Fund applications are taking very long time to be processed
2. There is demand for skills training for women
3. Most youths are still not aware of tendering procedure and requirements needed to access the 30% government tenders
4. Bursary form issuance has been a challenge where long queues are experienced since the process is centralized
5. There is a problem with the design implementation of most cabro paved roads done by KERRA where storm water causes havoc to residents
6. There is demand for driving school bursary
7. Need of awareness for Drug abuse and HIV Aids for youths
8. There is need of holding forums with the community after project identification to inform them of the projects approved
9. Lack of land for new projects

WAY FORWARD

1. The stakeholders were informed that their proposals would be deliberated upon by the NG-CDF Committee and needs prioritized, giving first priority to ongoing projects in each ward.
2. Bursary issuance process will be deliberated upon and the NG-CDFC will come up with a new way.
3. Need for construction of storey buildings for all new projects to mitigate on the unavailability of land

CONCLUSION

The projects done so far since 2013 have made a huge impact in the way of life of the Changamwe community. The constituency needs more new public schools especially in Airport Ward. The bursary award has helped needy students in acquiring formal education and there is need of more funds to be allocated especially for tertiary and vocational training.
