MIN: NG-CDFC/JOMVU/03/28 NOVEMBER 2024: DECLARATION OF INTEREST

The Chairman gave opportunity to members to declare if they had any interest in the agenda. No member had any interest in the agenda, hence the Secretary was invited to read the minutes of the previous meeting.

MIN: NG-CDFC/JOMVU/04/28 NOVEMBER 2024: READING AND CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

The Secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting held on 22nd November, 2024. The minutes were proposed by Mr. Yusuf Jelle and seconded by Ms. Tima Mwaita as a true record of the discussions.

MIN: NG-CDFC/JOMVU/05/28 NOVEMBER 2024: MATTERS ARISING

There was one matter arising from the minutes of the previous meeting as follows:

<u>SOCIAL SECURITY PROGRAM (SHIF)</u>: The committee was informed that funds relating to 2023/2024 financial year have remained unutilized on the constituency account due the long time it took to update the list of beneficiaries. The funds currently in use relate to 2022/2023 financial year.

The FAM had communicated with the SHIF Mombasa branch requesting information on the current status and the way forward for the program and was awaiting feedback. The information would be helpful in determining how the program would continue in subsequent financial years.

Members therefore resolved that the project should not be funded this financial year as funds from the previous year are available. The matter would be deliberated with the objective of charting the way forward for the program after communication is received from the SHIF.

MIN: NG-CDFC/JOMVU/06/28 NOVEMBER 2024: PROJECTS PROPOSALS FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025

The FAM reminded members about the Board Circular on preparation of constituency project proposals for 2024/2025 financial year and the constituency allocation for the current financial year of Kshs. 161,497,759.02. The ward forums had been successfully carried out and the following key guiding areas were discussed in considering this year's project proposals:

- b. Consideration of ongoing projects
- c. Consideration of climate change mitigation and adaptation activities
- d. Funding of Constituency Digital Hubs
- e. Balances from the previous financial year

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a. Deliberation on the Ward Report

The Chair tabled to members the report of ward meetings that were conducted between 14th and 15th November, 2024. From the report, the communities had been guided on types of projects and the basis of consideration which included the amount allocated to the constituency, the constituency strategic plan and other guiding policies under the National Government. Each ward came up with several projects majorly in education, security and digital hubs areas as captured in the ward report annexed. A summary of the projects considered from the ward report per ward is as below:

b. Consideration of Ongoing Projects

The committee was informed that there was one ongoing project and two pending projects within the constituency. Tendering was underway for the ongoing project involving construction of 4 classrooms for special needs education at Miritini World Bank Primary School.

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Members deliberated on the matter and agreed that, additional funding of Kshs. 3,712,740.00 to cover the engineer's estimates be allocated to the ongoing project. Meanwhile follow up would be made with Mombasa County for a letter on land ownership for the two pending projects: Owino-Uhuru Primary School and Mombasa West High School.

c. Consideration of Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Activities

It was observed that the schools that had expressed interest in the tree growing program do not have reliable sources of water. Project sustainability should be discussed with interested institutions in order to make the tree growing program workable. Members therefore decided not to fund the project this financial year. Other diverse projects under Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation activities shall be considered in the next financial year once project sustainability and impact have been discussed.

d. Funding of Constituency Digital Hubs

The committee was informed of the funding options that were available for the program. After taking into consideration the sites proposed during the ward meetings, members adopted the basic option due to limited space available at Jomvu Kuu. The hub is to be constructed on the first floor of Jomvu Kuu Chief's office. Modifications may be needed to make the space workable according to the Ministry's specifications.

e. Balances from previous financial year

The FAM reported that at the close of the financial year, there was a balance of Kshs.560,000 on Administration - NG-CDFC allowances sub-vote. Hence, the committee should allocate the balance of funds required to cover the meetings to be held during the current financial year.

BACKGROUND

0.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya. Its purpose was to alleviate poverty in the country by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the ordinary government revenue to support constituency-level grass root development through funding of community-based projects such as schools, water, Health and roads. The Act was amended in 2007 creating the CDF Board to replace the then National Management Committee (NMC) as the top management organ of the Fund at the national level.

In January 2013, the CDF Act 2003(as amended in 2007) was repealed and replaced with CDF Act 2013. The enactment of the CDF Act 2013 was mainly aimed to ensure that the law governing CDF is aligned to the constitution of Kenya 2010.

In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act enacted; being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015 in recognition of the fund as falling under functions of the National Government. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NGCDF) falls under the Ministry of Planning.

Flow of Funds

The funds are disbursed to NG-CDFC in quarterly tranches. The funds are then disbursed to project management committees.

Success of NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund is a huge success. Through it classrooms, laboratories, administration block, dormitories, perimeter walls and dining halls have been and continue to be built in schools. Staff houses and offices have been availed to the AP, Police personnel and chiefs. Roads and bridges have been constructed to ease transport of people and goods. Bore holes and dams have enabled communities to access water for domestic use.

Bursaries to needy students have enabled many children from disadvantaged families to get education. The transition rate from Primary to Secondary has been on the increase.

0.2 ABOUT JOMVU

Description of the Constituency

Jomvu is one of the six constituencies of Mombasa County which is part of the former Coast province, other constituencies being Changamwe, Mvita, Likoni, Kisauni, and Nyali. Jomvu constituency was curved out of Changamwe constituency by the IEBC through the boundaries delimitation process. It has a population of 163,566 according to the 2019 National population census and covers an area of approximately 29.0 Square kilometers.

There are three wards within Jomvu constituency:

- Miritini Ward covering approximately 3.8 Square kilometers
- Mikindani Ward covering approximately 6.2 Square kilometers
- Jomvu Kuu Ward covering approximately 19.0 Square kilometers

The constituency is densely populated due to the low cost of housing, ease of access to Mombasa CBD and security.

The constituency has been funded for all financial years by the NG-CDF Board since the financial year 2013/2014 when it came into existence. The NG-CDFC has been viewed as the key driver of socio-economic development within the constituency. The fund focuses on projects that have immediate socio-economic impact with a view to improving lives, alleviate poverty and address general development.

ii. Jomvu Constituency Development Fund Committee

The committee is established under the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act of 2015. The Committee is expected to play the following roles among others:

- a. Allocation of funds to various projects, determining the quantum of installments to various projects in the constituency, taking into account the disbursement received and the requirement of different projects;
- Submission of a list of constituency based projects to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board within the stipulated time;
- Determination of the allocation of the emergency reserve in accordance with the NG-CDF Act, 2015;
- Making appropriate consultations with the relevant Government departments to ensure that cost estimates for the projects are as realistic as possible; and
- e. Ranking the constituency projects in order of priority, among other activities.

0.3 DOCUMENTATION OF THE WARD REPORTS

Section 24(5) of the NG-CDF Act requires that the Chairperson of the CDFCs in Consultation with the Member of Parliament of the Constituency, the Sub-County Administrator for the Constituency and the ward administrator for every ward shall within the first year of a new parliament and at least once every two years thereafter convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and constituency.

According to Schedule 4 of the Constitution of Kenya 2020, the projects eligible for funding by the National Government under which the NG-CDF falls are in the sectors of Education and Security. Hence, Jomvu NG-CDFC conducted consultative meetings with the residents on the eligible projects in each ward for the purpose of deliberating on and coming up with priority projects to be funded under the National Government Constituency Development Fund. These priorities would be forwarded to the National Government Constituency Development Fund Committee for deliberation and subsequently to the NGCDF Board for approval as per NG-CDF Act 2015.

Jomvu NG-CDFC held meetings in the three wards of Jomvu constituency namely: Jomvu Kuu, Miritini & Mikindani with the following objectives:

- · To sensitize the community about the NG-CDF and its functions.
- To enable residents to participate in identification of the projects to be funded under the NG-CDF.
- To provide a platform to other stakeholders to sensitize residents about their programs.

The Deputy County Commissioner, Area Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs, County ward administrators, Area Member of Parliament, Parliamentary Service office, various stakeholders and the public were invited.

1.1 JOMVU KUU WARD

The meeting was opened with prayer at 11:00 a.m. by Mr. Dennis Zuwa followed by playing of the national anthem. A village elder, Mzee Mwadilifu, welcomed area residents to the meeting before handing over the program to the NG-CDF Secretary. The NG-CDFC Secretary coordinated the introduction of NG-CDFC members, staff and guests attending the meeting.

· Comments by Area Chief

Mr. Mwinyinguti introduced all chiefs present and thanked the NG-CDF for construction of Jomvu Kuu Chief's Office. He encouraged area residents to present their views and desires on development in a calm manner. He then welcomed the NG-CDFC Chairman to address the gathering.

• Comments by the NG-CDFC Chairman

He thanked the residents of Jomvu Kuu ward and other invited guests for attending the meeting. He pointed out that the reason other stakeholders were invited, is to allow for their input into matters raised by the constituents and also for their action on areas identified within their mandate. He welcomed the next speaker.

Comments by Jomvu Uwezo Fund Committee Chairperson

She introduced the committee members present and sensitized residents about Uwezo Fund touching on the following matters: the target population, qualification criteria, terms & conditions of the loans and the procedure of application. She highlighted the change to

online applications in the current set-up. She mentioned that funds are available and called upon groups to apply for loans. She also encouraged those who had benefitted previously to repay.

Comments by Fund Account Manager

The FAM informed members about the projects eligible for funding under the NG-CDF Act and pointed out key criteria as follows: projects falling strictly under the functions of the National Government, widespread benefits to the inhabitants, not targeting specific groups, not supporting religious or political activities and not recurrent costs of a facility, excluding projects addressing devolved functions.

The NGCDFC Chairman welcomed the residents to identify and present the development needs of the ward. He invited the Deputy Constituency Office Manager who coordinated the presentation of the views of the people on behalf of the area member of parliament. They were recorded by the NG-CDFC staff and other stakeholders present according to their mandates.

- The Chair Uwezo Fund clarified that groups funded can also include men provided that the core membership i.e. women, youth or PWDs form 70% of membership and leadership positions.

Mr. Ali Ngao gave the vote of thanks and closed the meeting with prayer at 2.30 p.m. after which the national anthem was played.

1.2 MIRITINI WARD

The meeting was opened with prayer at 3:00 p.m. by Pastor Joshua Makangi followed by playing of the national anthem. A village elder, Ms. Zeinab Omar, welcomed residents and invited the area Chief to take over the program.

Comments by Area Chief

Madam Binti led introduction of all chiefs present and called on those gathered to present their views on development in an orderly manner. She observed that due to the increase in population, it may be necessary for a third primary school to be constructed in the ward. She handed over the meeting to the NG-CDFC Chairman.

· Comments by the NG-CDFC Chairman

He thanked the residents of Miritini ward for attending the meeting and invited the NG-CDFC members and other guests present to introduce themselves. Thereafter the Chair pointed out that the other stakeholders were invited to give their input into matters raised by the constituents and also to capture action to be undertaken on needs falling within their mandates.

Comments by Jomvu Uwezo Fund Committee Chairperson

She introduced the committee members present and sensitized residents about Uwezo Fund touching on the following matters: the target population, qualification criteria, terms & conditions of the loans and the procedure of application. She highlighted the change to online applications in the current set-up. She mentioned that funds are available and called upon groups to apply for loans. She also encouraged those who had benefitted previously to repay.

Comments by Fund Account Manager

The FAM informed members about the projects eligible for funding under the NG-CDF Act and pointed out key criteria as follows: projects falling strictly under the functions of the National Government, widespread benefits to the inhabitants, not targeting specific groups, not supporting religious or political activities and not recurrent costs of a facility, excluding projects addressing devolved functions.

The NGCDFC Chairman welcomed the residents to identify and present their development needs. The NG-CDFC Secretary coordinated the presentation of the views of the people on behalf of the area member of parliament. They were recorded by the NG-CDFC staff and other stakeholders present according to their mandates.

Projects priorities identified at the ward were as follows:

 - a. Construction of library, science and ICT laboratories
 - b. Construction of Additional Toilets
 - c. Modernization of school playground for football, netball and basketball
 - d. Construction of 4 additional classrooms

 - g. Construction of an ECDE block within Maganda Primary School
 - h. Additional teachers to be provided for the School
 - i. Construction of a borehole for the pupils
 - j. Support in tree planting activities within the school
- 2. Construction of Maganda Access road
- 3. Construction of gabions in Maganda area to mitigate Land slides
- 4. Provision of Security lights in Maganda
- 5. Miritini Primary School presented various needs as follows:
 - a. Construction of a perimeter wall
 - b. Construction of administration block
 - Construction of a computer laboratory, modern library and science laboratories at Miritini Primary School for the JSS section
 - d. Provision of desks for grade 9 at Miritini Primary school
 - e. Construction of Special needs unit in Miritini Primary for albinism, the hearing and visually impaired with provision of SNE teachers and physiotherapy
 - f. Construction of 20-door girls' toilets for the 803 girls and 20-door flush toilets for the 896 boys at Miritini primary school
 - g. Provision of 349 desks for grade 9 students

- 6. Improvement of KTDA-Vikobani road, water supply for Vikobani area and the establishment of Educational program for GBVs and child abuse victims i.e. adult education and second child program in Miritini ward
- 7. Establishment of a Vocational/TVET center within the Constituency
- 8. Construction of Vikobani-Rabai ndogo access road
- 9. Construction of Miritini-Kitola-Vikobani access road
- 10. Improvement of school playgrounds through fencing, provision of seats and other amenities for all schools within Miritini ward
- 11. Construction of an access road in Dhome area
- 12. Construction of chief's offices for Miritini Station sub-location and Miritini location
- 13. Construction of an access road with cabro paving and floodlights from KTDA Fortune
- 14. Provision of awards i.e. trophies in order to improve academic performance at the educational institutions within the constituency
- 15. Provision of a public library that is fully equipped with IT within the ward
- 16. Formation of a multi-sectoral team to handle land issues touching on various sites like the Mwamlai Settlement Scheme where 6 acres of public land need to be reclaimed.
- 17. Establishment of a police post in Chamunyu area
- 18. Establishment of a public primary school in Chamunyu area with Classrooms, Administration Block, Laboratories and ICT Centre to feed the junior school
- 19. Coming up with climate change mitigation measures i.e. planting of trees.
- 20. Mwamlai Secondary School requires the following to be a fully-equipped junior school
 - a. Construction of additional classrooms
 - b. Construction of Administration Block
 - c. Construction of computer and science laboratories
 - d. Construction of kitchen
 - e. Improvement of the sports infrastructure
 - f. 1.000-litre water tank
 - g. Extension of access road to the school
- 21. Provision of WIFI in all schools
- 22. Upgrading of Mwamlai zone football pitch
- 23. Construction of Chamunyu SDA Church road

24. Construction of KCC- Agol access road

Reactions were allowed from various stakeholders who gave responses as summarized:

- Land to be identified by area residents for construction of ECD classrooms, TVET and social hall in Maganda area
- Water supply is not adequate for the current demand. Supply pipes to be laid once
 Mwache Dam is completed.
- Consultation to be made on the way forward for movement of transformers for fixing of lighting masts
- CDF hospital to be expanded to accommodate more patients at the maternity ward
- Beaconing to be done once funding is availed
- GBV issues to be handled by the Gender & Children's offices and SHOFCO to carry out awareness
- Fiber optics to be connected to schools to optimize connectivity
- ICT hubs to be established to encourage 24-hour economy if captured under NG-CDFC
- Titles for land parcels without issues to be followed up on.

Mr. Mohamed Abdallah gave vote of thanks and closed with prayer at 6:00 p.m. after which the national anthem was played.

1.3 MIKINDANI WARD

The meeting started at 10:30 a.m. through opening prayer led by Mr. Joseph Oluoch followed by playing of the national anthem. The meeting was graced by the NG-CDFC Chairman.

Comments by the NG-CDFC Chairman

He thanked the residents of Mikindani for attending the meeting and introduced the NG-CDFC members, staff and other invited guests. He called upon the other stakeholders invited to capture action points that require their action and also to shed light on matters raised by the constituents that fall within their mandate and which could be outside the scope of the NG-CDF.

Comments by Jomvu Uwezo Fund Committee Chairperson

She introduced the committee members present and sensitized residents about Uwezo Fund touching on: the target population, qualification criteria, terms & conditions of the loans and the procedure of application. She highlighted the change to online applications in the current set-up. She mentioned that funds are available and called upon groups to apply for loans. She also encouraged those who had benefitted previously to repay.

Comments by Fund Account Manager

The FAM informed members about the projects eligible for funding under the NG-CDF Act and pointed out key criteria as follows: projects falling strictly under the functions of the National Government, widespread benefits to the inhabitants, not targeting specific groups, not supporting religious or political activities and not recurrent costs of a facility, excluding projects addressing devolved functions.

Comments by Sub-County Director of Education

The Sub-County Director of Education informed the residents that senior schools under the CBC program would start in 2026 and called for their support. She pointed out that for each institutional category there were requirements to be met. She requested that the playgrounds at Amani and Kwashee Comprehensive Schools be upgraded.

Other departmental heads and County officials present were given opportunity to address the gathering.

The NGCDFC Chairman thereafter welcomed the residents to identify and present the development needs of Mikindani ward. He invited the NG-CDFC Secretary to coordinate the presentation of the views by area residents on behalf of the area member of parliament. Priorities given were recorded by the NG-CDFC staff and other stakeholders present according to their mandates.

Projects priorities identified at the ward were as follows:

- 1. Construction of Kwa Kipofu Blue estate cabro access road
- 2. Construction of a New school at Kwa Kipofu Village
- 3. Construction of a functional ICT Hub in Mikindani
- 4. Construction of a public Library in Mikindani
- 5. Kwashee Comprehensive school requested the following:
 - a. Renovation and extension of the perimeter wall
 - b. Construction of an Administration block
 - c. Provision of water harvesting storage tanks or for the County to unblock and equip the borehole
- 6. Construction of Kopakopa Aldina road (200m)
- 7. Survey of land in Kopakopa area for title deeds to be issued
- 8. Kajembe High School requested:
 - a. Construction of Administration block
 - b. Construction of 2 additional classrooms
 - c. Restructuring of the school perimeter wall
 - d. Drilling of a borehole
 - e. Repair of fans and lighting system in the school hall
 - f. Supply of 25 additional desktop computers
- 9. Construction of a TVET in Mikindani ward
- 10. Construction of KMTC in Mikindani ward
- 11. St. Mary's Bangladesh Comprehensive School requested:
 - g. Construction of 6 additional classrooms
 - h. Construction of toilets: 4-door toilet for boys and 4-door toilet for girls

- i. Construction of an Administration block for JSS and Primary
- j. Upgrading of the school perimeter wall
- k. Provision of water for the school
- I. Construction of ECD classrooms
- m. Improvement of the access road to cabro standards
- 12. Provision of streetlights in Bangladesh area to enhance security
- 13. Construction of an access road at Jitengeni area
- 14. Provision of security lights at Jitengeni area
- 15. Provision of security lights at Darajani
- 16. Construction of an access road at Darajani
- 17. Construction of a dispensary at Darajani
- 18. Construction of Giriamani area access road
- 19. Change in bursary application form and award criteria.
- 20. Monitoring and evaluation of strategic plan
- 21. Publication of contractors details when constructing government projects
- 22. Construction of Runyu SDA church Darajani road
- 23. Amani Primary school requested for:
 - a. Modernizing of Amani Primary school playground
 - b. Construction of 7 additional classrooms for Grade 9
 - c. Removal of asbestos roof and replacement with iron sheets for 10 classrooms
 - d. Construction of a modern computer laboratory
 - e. Renovation and extension of the perimeter wall
 - f. Purchase of a 51-seater school bus
- 24. Mikindani Comprehensive school requested for:
 - a. 345 desks for grade 9 classes
 - b. Renovation of school classroom floors, verandahs and staircases as well a painting of the roofs for the entire school
 - c. Construction of 4 Classrooms
 - d. Water solution to the school preferably through desalination
 - e. A School bus
- 25. Construction of a rescue center

- 26. Construction of Assistant Chief's office at Kwa Mwanzia
- 27. Construction of a youth Empowerment center in Mikindani

Reactions were allowed from various stakeholders as follows:

• The Ward Administrator informed the residents that water supply is still not adequate for the current demand. He pointed out that most water bowsers are not from the County Government but are privately owned assured them that county water bowsers only deliver water to government institutions.

The meeting closed with prayer at 2:10 p.m. after which the national anthem was played.

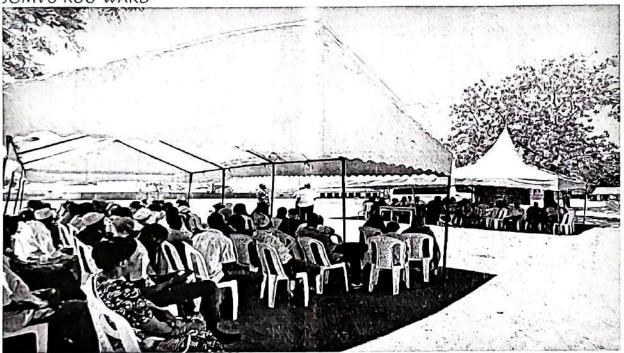
1.4 CONCLUSION/WAY FORWARD
