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#### INTRODUCTION

Citizen participation in development planning, project planning, management and implementation requires the involvement of concerned stakeholders. This includes identifying public concerns and values and developing a broad consensus on planned initiatives. It is also about utilizing the vast amount of information and knowledge that stakeholders hold to find workable, efficient and sustainable solutions.

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow those that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the process. Community participation motivates the stakeholders to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and own the projects in their localities.

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development Initiatives in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. It is important that all stakeholders are involved in the development of projects and not just direct beneficiaries of an initiative.

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from.

### 1.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2 NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all

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constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government development Agenda at the constituency level.

Nyali constituency is one of the six constituencies that form Mombasa County. With the promulgation of the new constitution in August 2010, Nyali Constituency was curved out from the larger Kisauni Constituency.

The sister constituencies are Kisauni, Mvita, Jomvu, Likoni & Changamwe.

The Constituency borders the Indian Ocean to the East and Kisauni Constituency to the West and North.

Nyali is cosmopolitan and strategically placed. It covers an area of 22.88 sq. km with a population of 1,855,990 as per the national census (2009). This population is still growing.

The Constituency has five (5) County Assembly wards namely: Frere Town, Ziwa la Ng'ombe, Mkomani, Kongowea, Kadzandani.

# OVERVIEW OF FUNDABLE PROJECTS UNDER NG-CDF BY NYALI CONSTITUENCY

Eligible Projects Fundable by NYALI NG-CDF

The eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF as stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF (Amendment) Act, 2016 as those that are in:

- Respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution.
- Must be community based to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area.

The ineligible projects include:

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- Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities
- Projects supporting political bodies or political activities
- Recurrent costs of a completed projects
- Personal awards
- Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya

As per section 24 of the NG-CDF Act as amended in 2016, eligible projects are only those that are in respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution, which must be community based in order to ensure that the benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area. In addition, eligible projects shall be those that foster sustainable development, promote human dignity and protection of the marginalized as per Article 10 of the constitution on national values and principles of governance.

National Government Constituency Development Fund Committee Nyali shall therefore exclude project proposals that do not meet the eligibility criteria under the NG-CDF Act such as:

- Projects supporting political bodies or political activities
- Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities
- Recurrent costs of a completed project
- Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Personal awards
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution.

### CROSS CUTTING PROJECTS.

Its was also observed that all schools requires a modern kitchens and Dining halls to adopt the food for all program being run in Khadija, Freretown primary schools, Solar panels, soak pits to

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help drain rainwater in schools, desks due to high enrollments of students, boreholes as source of water and water purifiers/desalination machines for clean drinking water and fully equipped modern libraries. There is also need of revision books in both secondary and Primary Schools. There is need to train both primary and secondary school students on effects of drug abuse, hiv/aids, sex education and other antisocial activities, support interschool competition, organize Nyali Career/education day for the schools in the constituency and reward best performing students, teachers and schools and advise form fours on careers through other relevant education and career stakeholders.

It was also agreed that there is need to better our environment through installation and purchase of tanks for water harvesting in all the schools, chiefs Offices, ACC Offices, All Police Stations and DCC office, having tree planting in schools and constituency In all National Government Offices in the Constituency, soak pits to help drain rain water, trash collection and dustbins strategically placed within the constituency, organize for beach cleaning and mangrove tree planting to conserve our aquatic life.

In security, participants observed the need to have at least one police post, chief and/or assistance chief offices in each ward in the constituency. In sports and other activities, they observed the need to have sports tournament and the winning team to be supported by the constituency to play against a club in Kenya premier league, all football clubs in the constituency to have full football jersey, football balls, transport facilitation for away games and first aid kits.


Also the construction of Technical Training Institute in Nyali was supported from all the wards as it will benefit the whole constituency.

#### **CHALLENGES**

- 1. Members expressed concern on the restrictive nature of the projects fundable by NG-CDF, especially in the health and roads sectors.
- 2. It was noted that there is overreliance on NG-CDF funds by the community.
- 3. Late disbursement of project funds leads to projects not being implemented in time which lead to rise in project costs due to factors like inflation due to time value f money and bursaries not awarded to students when the schools open, hence students and pupils' retention in learning institutions is greatly affected negatively.

#### CONCLUSION

- Frequent development forums should be held to give the public information concerning the
  development initiatives being undertaken by all the development partners and the various
  funding agencies.
- Allocations to projects should also be adequate, to enable completion of project once started, since if completion is delayed the project cost rises due to factors like inflation and wear and tear.


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


