



#### 0.0 Introduction or Background

#### 0.1 About NG-CDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is established under the NG-CDF Act 2015. The primary objective was to address Poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual ordinary Government revenue for development purposes at the grassroots level. Since inception 2003, Constituency Development Fund has implemented high impact projects, which have revolutionized the development agenda in the country. Garsen NG-CDF is one of the most successful funds with high support rate from the locals. The constituency's main focus has been on infrastructural improvement being in education, security, environment, sports and social security programs.

#### Garsen constituency

Political administration.

Garsen Constituency is one of the three constituencies in Tana River County. It is located along the banks of Tana River and lies along Malindi Garissa Road. It covers an area of 15614 km<sup>2</sup>. Tsavo national park covers 20% of this area. It is home to one of Kenya's largest deltas covering an area of 1,300, km2. The Constituency is sparsely populated with the arid and semi-arid (ASAL) regions. Although Tana River cuts across the constituency, most parts of the constituency experience acute water shortages due to erratic rainfall in most parts of the constituency.

The area also experiences high temperatures ranging between 30c and 42c. In addition, parts of the constituency are prone to heavy flooding when it rains in the Mount Kenya region. This makes the constituency vulnerable to food both drought and flooding in addition to the insecurity threats from the Al-Shabab groups.

Politically Garsen Constituency is divided into six (6) political units. They include Kipini East, Garsen South, Kipini West, Garsen Central, Garsen West and Garsen North wards. - Character of the control of the co

Topography.

River Tana transverses the constituency from Mnazini in the north to the Indian ocean in the south east. As the river transverses downstream, it creates an expansive delta covering about 1,300km2, largely characterized by wetlands and oxbow lakes.

The delta presents great potential for agriculture. It is also a natural habitat for diverse flora and fauna forming and ideal ecosystem for ecotourism. THE delta hosts over 1,500 migratory birds' from 69 bird species. The delta is ideal for grazing during the dry season. It also supports irrigation, the main crops being rice, mangoes, maize, bananas, and soya beans. In addition, there is fishing, forestry and agroforestry.

Apart from Tana River there are several seasonal rivers popularly known as lagas that transverse the district. These rivers originate from Kitui County draining their waters to the Indian Ocean. The beds of these rivers support livestock and are best sites for shallow wells, pans, and sub-surface dams, although they are major bottle necks to road transport.

The constituency has a coastline characterized by sandy beaches interrupted by the Tana delta. These sandy beaches are ideal for beach tourism.

#### b) Climate

The sub county receives low bimodal and erratic conventional rainfall ranging from 300mm and 900mm. long rains occur between April and May while short rains occur in October and November. The Inter Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) determines the amount of rainfall at the coastline. The higher level of rainfall along the coast line support crop production especially around Kipini where cash crops such as cashew nuts, cotton, mangoes, bananas and maize are grown. In addition, it also supports the mangrove forest in Kipini which is a major source of forest products.

In the southern the average temperatures are 30°c with humid conditions along the coastline. The hinterland parts experience dry conditions which support wildlife and nomadic life style.

#### 2.3 Climatic patterns.

The constituency is characterized by substantial wetlands that support considerable levels of pasture and water throughout the year.



Between the months of October and May most of the livestock keepers in the western hinterlands and neighbouring sub counties migrate with their livestock to the rich delta in the south eastern part of the constituency due to dry conditions experienced between April and July.

In the farming areas, mango harvesting season results into migration of traders into the Constituency for business purpose. In addition, some farmers move out of the constituency to other towns in search of markets for their mango crop. The south eastern and north eastern monsoons winds influence fishing along the coastline. This in turn attracts fishermen from other communities like Pemba (Tanzania) and Vanga in Kwale County. The fishermen arrive in October for deep sea fishing in search of lobsters. Generally, insecurity has forced most in the constituency to live together for protection communities tend to settle in places near Sub County divisional or locational and sub locational level where their security and that of their animals is assured.

#### c) Human settlement.

Human settlement is influenced by urbanization with 7% living in urban areas, climatic conditions, soils and accessibility to water points. Most villages of farming and fishing communities are found along the Tana River wetlands.

The pastoralists live in manyattas which are found in the hinterland in areas with animal watering points and pasture. The pastoralists migrate frequently between Garissa county and the Tana River county depending on the rainfall patterns. Nearly 93% of the people in Tana Delta live in rural areas. The main source of livelihood amongst the people include crop farming and fishing along the river and within the delta and livestock keeping. This in turn is linked to livelihood zones, mainly growing of crops, fishing and cattle rearing. Others are mixed farming, ranching,

#### 2.2 Population Size and Composition

Garsen Constituency is sparsely populated with a population density of 6.197 people/km². It has an approximate total population of 96,664 people with a growth rate of 3.4% per annum and a poverty index of 76.9%. Of this population, 50.38% are male with the rest being female. Life expectancy is at 52.7 years with a very high fertility rate evident in household size of 4-6 members at 42% and. The population is generally youthful. The constituency is populated by the Pokomo (farmers) and the Orma (pastoralist). The constituency is characterized by various needs which cross cut across the constituency. This include: High illiteracy levels, low crop and livestock production, Destruction of infrastructures and displacement of people, diseases outbreak (Rift valley fever) which is caused by harmful traditional practices; boy-child leaving school to look for animal's pasture and water and discrimination against girl child denying her to chairman NG-CDFC education, early marriages, erratic rains and high temperatures and floods respectively.
