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4.2 On going projects

The Fund Manager informed the members that it was a requirement by the Board as per the Circular issued that all the ongoing projects should be given the first priority during preparation of the project proposal for Financial Year 2024/2025.

The committee deliberated on the project implementation status report and the On going report prepared on 31st August. 2024 as part of the Annual Reports which was submitted to the Board 12.11.2024 however two of the projects have since been completed; i) Mbauro Primary School and has new scope of activities as well as the Wundanyi Assistant County Commissioner Administration Offices. The Members therefore have excluded the two from the On going Status Report as proposed by Zighani and Seconded by Evelyn.

4.3 Digital Hubs

The Fund Account Manager, informed the members that they have to implement the Digital Hub project as it is one of the five pillars of Government Initiatives of the Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA) aims to improve the lives of young Kenyans through Digital superhighway and creative economy. The 5 pillars are:

- i) Agricultural transformation and inclusive growth Devolved Function
- ii) Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSME) economy County & National Government
 - iii) Housing and settlement County & National Government
 - iv) Healthcare Devolved Function
 - v) Digital superhighway and creative economy National Government Function

Resolution: Member resolved to implement the basic Standard at Wundanyi Assistant County Commissioner's Administration complex and Wundanyi Youth Empowerment Centre by refurbishing and equipping the ground floor resource centre hall as proposed by Zighani and seconded by Evelyn

Objective:

- To complete the resource centre and make immediate use
- To utilize the Digital Hub allocation in completing the halls

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iii) To add value to the halls

4.4Climate Change projects

The Fund Account Manager, took the members through Climate Change Initiatives due to the impacts of global warming and erratic weather patterns. The National Policy Initiatives include: Climate adaptation: Reducing emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation: Afforestation and Reforestation: Landscape Restoration: Climate-smart agriculture; Geothermal and Clean energy development; Energy efficiency; and drought and flood risk management

Mitigation activities

- Increasing the proportion of renewables in the national grid to 100% by 2030
- Improving energy and resource efficiency across all sector
- · Promoting climate-smart agriculture
- Plant 15 billion trees in the next 10 years from 2024

Resolution: Member resolved to implement three initiatives on climate change projects, establish a tree nursery seedbed for production of tree seedlings, tree planting and solar energy as proposed by Liverson Kilelu and seconded by Clemence

Sensitization: Member resolved to implement two a sensitization programme using two front initiatives

- Wall mural on climate change on drawn by an artist depicting impact and hope of climate change initiatives on every project on Climate Change
- Plant trees during public activities of NG-CDF including bursary applications, handing over and commissioning of projects, public participation and quarterly drives during M&E activities

4.5 REREC Electrification Matching Fund

The Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation (REREC) of Kenya has several objectives, including: establishing strategic collaborations with stakeholders. The Chairman informed the members that during Public Participation in Mgange/Mwanda; villagers in the higher areas of Ikonde village expressed their frustration that they are still in the dark ages.

4.6 JSS FUNDING OF JSS SCHOOLS

The manager tabled to members a report by the Ministry of Education on the need to fund Junior Secondary School especially construction of Grade 8/9 classrooms. As per the Ministry of Education, the below schools required additional classrooms.

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015(As amended in 2023) stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from.

Citizen participation in project planning, management and implementation planning requires the involvement of concerned stakeholders. This includes identifying public concerns and values and developing a broad consensus on planned initiatives. It is also about utilizing the vast amount of information and knowledge that stakeholders hold to find workable, efficient and sustainable solutions

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow those that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the process. Community participation motivates the stakeholders to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and own the projects in their localities

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development Initiatives in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. It is important that allstakeholders are involved in the development of projects and not just direct beneficiaries of an initiative.

1.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies

Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In
2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being
the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act,

NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The NG-CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency level, grassoot development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

1.2 ABOUT WUNDANYI CONSTITUENCY

1.2 About Wundanyi Constituency Background InformationConstituency General Information

Location and Size

Wundanyi Constituency is one of the four constituencies of TaitaTaveta County. It lies approximately 40km from Voi town and borders Mwatate, Voi and Taveta constituencies. According to the Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (2011), Wundanyi constituency occupies 3,376.00 Square Kms. The constituency is divided into seven administrative locations, and four wards namely Wundanyi-Mbale, Werugha, Mgange-Mwanda and Wumingu-Kishushe. It has seven locations namely; Werugha, Wundanyi, Mbale, Kishushe, Wumingu, Mghange and Mwanda

Fig 1: The Map of Wundanyi Constituency in the Context of TaitaTaveta County





Fig 2: Wundanyi Constituency Map



Physiographic and Natural Conditions

Wundanyi Constituency is segmented into two zones: The upper zone of Taita Hills and the lowlands of Kishushe and Paranga. The Taita Hills are considerably wet, covering an approximate area of 1,000 Km2, rise to a maximum elevation of 2,208 metres above sea level and experience relief rainfall. The mean annual rainfall in the constituency ranges from 500 mm in the lowlands to over 1,200 mm in the upper zone. The hills experience two rainy seasons - the long rains between the months of March and May; and the short rains between October and December.

The temperatures get as low as 18.20C and rise to about 250C. The highest point in Coast region with an altitude of 2,208 metres above sea level (Vuria Peak) is found at Wundanyi. Others are lyale Hill, Ngangao Forest and Wesu Rock. The hills are home to the Taita Thrush, Taita Falcon and the TaitaApalis which are endemic bird species.

Demographic Features

According to KNBS (2009). Wundanyi Constituency had a population of 58,600 with an estimated 14,532 households and covers 3,376.00 Km2. The TaitaTaveta County CIDP (2018/2022) projects that the population would rise to 64,469 by 2018. This represents a population density of 97.63 and sex ratio of 34,170females to 34,299males (1:1.003).

Infrastructure

The constituency is served by various road networks. Only about 6Km is bitumen class while the rest is earth. The constituency has no railway line and no airstrip. The Wundanyi-Mwatate road is the only tarmacked link to other constituencies.

Poverty

The constituency has high poverty levels. The population that is worst affected by overall poverty are the elderly and children. The high level of poverty in the county is partly attributable to erratic and inadequate rainfall especially in areas dependent on rain-fed agriculture and poor agricultural practices.

According to CIDP (2018/2022), the vicious cycle of poverty leads to low savings, low investments, low productivity (incomes), increase in unskilled labour and undue pressure on the arable land. Furthermore, the poor are not in a position to afford essential drugs, transport to the nearest health facility, or a balanced diet. Hence, poverty remains the main cause behind high rates of illiteracy, crude death, infant mortality, and low life expectancy.

Economic activities

Economic activities in the constituency include crop farming, ranching, livestock keeping, mining, tourism and trading. The Kishushe region is generally flat and vast making it suitable for ranching. There has been an increase in dairy milk production in the constituency prompting the establishment of a milk cooling plant with an estimated capacity of preserving 30,000 litres per day. The plant has created employment both directly and indirectly and improved daily income for households through milk sales.

The Taita Hills are a source of water to the lower regions making them suitable for fish farming, although it has not been fully exploited. The weather conditions for Wundanyi make it possible for farmers to grow trees on their farms where they harvest forest products including timber, building poles, firewood and to some extent charcoal. Generally, both exotic and indigenous tree species are grown in the Wundanyi. These include Cypress

(Cupressuslusitanica), Silky Oak (Grevillearobusta), Blue Gum (Eucalyptus saligna) and Scot's pine (Pinussylvestris).

Kishushe is prospected to have enormous deposits of iron ore. The iron ore resources at Kishushe have a great potential for creating value addition industries that can create employment and improve household incomes. Other mining activities include building stone, murram and ballast quarrying, and sand harvesting at Mwarungu and Mbale

regions. The Iyale, Wesu, Wanyumba and Paranga rocks form an array of potential rock climbing and filming spots whereas the Ngangao forest, Iyale forest and Shomoto are excellent camping sites.

While the constituency is endowed with good weather, biodiversity, natural beauty, good soils, minerals, among others, the potential of the constituency remains largely unexploited. When optimally exploited, it will improve the economic livelihoods of the constituents.


