VOI/NG-CDFC/MIN 6/28-11-2024: PROJECT PROPOSALS FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025

The Fund manager brought to the attention of members the provisions of the Board's circular Ref No: NG-CDFB/CEO/NG-CDF CIRCULARS/VOL III (001) dated 22nd October 2024 on the preparation and submission of constituency project proposals for 2024/2025 financial year. He informed members that the constituency had been allocated a total of Kshs. 188,649,643.34 for the current Financial Year and that the following key guiding areas as per the circular and shall guide the preparation and submission of the proposals to the Board for consideration:

1. Project identification through ward forums
2. Consultation with the appropriate agencies on realistic project cost estimates
3. Consideration of ongoing projects
4. Budgeting of administration and Monitoring expenses
5. Consideration of climate change mitigation and adaptation activities
6. Financing of Constituency Digital Hubs
7. Projects considered under Appropriation in Aid
8. Aligning Projects to BETA, Constituency Strategic Plan and other National Policies


a. Deliberation on the Ward Report

The Chair tabled to members the ward report that was conducted between 04th November, 2024 to 11th November, 2024. From the report, the communities were guided on types of projects and the basis of consideration which included the amount allocated to the constituencies, constituency strategic plan and the National Government guiding policies. Each ward came up with several projects majorly in education, security and climate change areas as captured in the ward report (annex 3).

d. Statutory ceilings for administration and Monitoring and Evaluation

The manager briefed members of the key guidelines by the Board and informed members that the Board laid more emphasis on the following areas;

- Provision of a detailed budget with clear breakdown of each component towards funds for administration and recurrent expenditure
- Allocation of funds to staff salaries to be informed by a documented staffing structure approved by the Committee with clear job description for each employee and must conform to the government guidelines on minimum wage.
- Consideration of other statutory deductions such as housing levy, National Social Security Fund (NSSF) and Social Health Insurance Fund (SHIF)
- Costing of the funds allocated to Monitoring and Evaluation to be informed by a proper work plan as provided in annex 2.

The said budgets were tabled by the manager and upon deliberations having considered the constituency allocation and the needs of the community, the committee members approved as provided in annex 1:

e. Climate change mitigation and adaptation activities

The manager tabled a guideline on climate change issues by the Board. The committee after deliberation considered funding of Planting of 100 trees, Purchase of a 10,000 litres water tank, construction of a tank base and installation of pipes and gutters to 12 schools that had requested for the same as tabled below:

The Fund Account Manager was assigned to request the beneficiary institutions to bring concurrence letter to grow and sustain the planted trees seedlings.

f. Constituency Digital Hubs

The Fund Account Manager informed members that Ministry of Information Communication and Digital Economy (MoIC&DE) has released guidelines for rollout of digital hubs in constituencies and




what to be considered. Members were then explained the four options and after deliberation, they resolved to approve option number two: standard model (with a plinth area of 750SQM)

They further approved it to be constructed at Rukanga in Kasigau ward since there is good road infrastructure, security, Internet connectivity and enough Government land next to Assistant Chiefs Office.

Earlier communication had been done to the public works after wards report and The Public works had prepared and advised the costing to be ksh. 7,183,729

g. Projects considered under Appropriation in Aid

Members were informed that a sum of Ksh. 235,591 was received as Appropriation in Aid in the financial year, 2023-2024 and the NG-CDF Board has included in Voi Constituency allocation. The source of these funds were as follows:

- a) Hire of the Dan Mwanzo Social Hall- Ksh.52,500
- b) Unutilised funds from the PMC Accounts- Ksh. 183,091

After deliberations members resolved to utilize it in the purchase of 39 pieces of 3-seater desks to Birikani primary school.

h. Proposed establishment of Security projects

A request was received from OCS, Tausa police station requesting for the construction of a modern Police station in Tausa area since the current one is not in a good taste. After deliberation members resolved to allocate Ksh. 7,361,214 for the construction of a new police station in Tausa. The estimates were given by the Public Works Office.

i. Proposed purchase of school buses and vans

During the public participation, the Principal Marungu Secondary school had proposed the purchase of a school bus since in the whole Ward there was no school bus to be used a means of transport during school tours, games etc. Members deliberated the need and resolved to allocate Ksh. 11,482,000 for the purchase of a school bus for Marungu Secondary School after receipt of a Profoma Invoice from Ryce Motors Limited.

j. Final project proposed with list of all prioritized projects

After a lengthy deliberation and consideration all areas as advised by the Board including but not limited to public participation, adequate consultation with public works, ongoing project, work plan and budgets for administration and monitoring vote, aligning project to BETA, constituency strategic plan and other National Government Policies, the committee agreed on the below listed projects to be forwarded to the Board for consideration and approval.



1.2 About Voi NG-CDF

Voi Constituency is an electoral Constituency in Kenya which was established for the 1966 General elections and is one of the Four Constituencies in Taita Taveta County.

With an approximate population of 90,000 people and an approx. area of 3,270 sq. KM, Voi constituency consists of six electoral county assemblies' wards namely; Mbololo, Kaloleni, Ngolia, Sagalla, Kasigau and Marungu.

The constituency lies along the Mombasa- Nairobi highway starting from Macknon town upto Mtito Andei town bordering Kwale County and Makueni County.

Voi Constituency has a metropolitan town which lies at the junctions of key highways of Mombasa- Nairobi and Voi-Taveta which heads to Tanzania.

Voi town provides a key market for agricultural, mining and meat products from Sagalla, Kasigau and Taita Hills as well as other surrounding areas. Voi town has experienced

rapid growth due to its location along major means of transport including Roads, SGR, Railway, Airstrip, Fiber Optic Cables and Electricity.

Voi constituency is also a major tourist hub as it neighbour's the world famous Tsavo East & West National parks, good Safari lodges and entertainment joints within Voi.

Voi Constituency is currently represented by Hon. Khamis Chome Abdi as the Area Member of National Assembly.

1.2.1 Overview of Fundable Projects under NG-CDF

Under the NG-CDF Act of 2015, the fund is mandated to implement education and security projects in public institutions. This includes provision of bursary to needy students in secondary and tertiary institutions, infrastructure development in public primary and secondary school as well as in security sector including construction of police station/post and administrative offices.

Projects should be allocated enough money to enable timely completion since delays causes increase of costs due to various factors like inflation, insecurity, wear and tear.


