## 1.0 Introduction or Background

This report gives an overview of Garissa Township Constituency in the context of National Government Constituency Development Fund.

It talks about NG- CDF in general and Garissa Township National Government Constituency Development Fund in particular. The report also highlights the projects funded in the last financial year 2020/2021 and further analyses the same per sector, ward, number of completed projects, number of ongoing projects, Bursary allocations and analysis per ward and the total number of beneficiaries. The report also focuses on ward stakeholders meetings for projects identification for the financial year 2021/2022 in terms of when the meetings were conducted, attendant, projects priorities from the wards and challenges facing implementation of NG-CDF projects in Garissa Township Constituency.

### 1.1 About NG-CDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was established under the CDF Act 2003 amended in 2007, 2013 and 2015. The primary objective was to address Poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual ordinary Government revenue for development purposes at the grassroots level.

The Constituencies Development Fund (Amendment) Act of 2007 introduced key changes to the management of the Fund. Key Highlights of the 2007 Amendment included replacement of one of the top management Structure, the National Management committee with the CDF Board; and transformation of the Management from a committee under the Ministry of Finance to a State Corporation under the Ministry of State for Planning, National Development and Vision 2030

### 1.2 About Garissa Township Constituency

Garissa Township is one of the sub counties in Garissa County. It was carved from the larger former Dujis constituency that gave birth to Garissa Township and Balambala constituencies in the delineation done in 2013 after the promulgation of the new constitution in 2010. The Constituency has a total area of 1120km<sup>2</sup>. It borders Balambala sub counties to the North.; Fafi to the East; and Bura Tana to the South. The Constituency also enjoys the benefits of River Tana and the Major highway connecting to Nairobi , Wajir and Mandera Towns. It lies on the latitude 0° 26° to 0° 30° and longitude 34° 10'E 34° 35'E.

Politically and administratively the constituency is one of the 6 sub-counties that together make up the Garissa County. Administratively, the constituency is made of three divisions (Korakora Township and Sankuri), and four electoral wards Galbet, Iftin, Township and Waberi Wards. In total it has 12 sub locations. Table 1 below illustrates the number of sub locations in each of the constituency's electoral and administrative wards.
