1.0 Introduction or Background

This report gives an overview of Garissa Township Constituency in the context of National Government Constituency Development Fund.

It talks about NG- CDF in general and Garissa Township National Government Constituency Development Fund in particular. The report also highlights the projects funded in the last financial year 2018/2019 and further analyses the same per sector, ward, number of completed projects, number of ongoing projects, Bursary allocations and analysis per ward and the total number of beneficiaries.

The report also focuses on ward stakeholders meetings for projects identification for the financial year 2021/2022 in terms of when the meetings were conducted, attendant, projects priorities from the wards and challenges facing implementation of NG-CDF projects in Garissa Township Constituency.

1.1 About NG-CDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was established under the CDF Act 2003 amended in 2007, 2013 and 2015. The primary objective was to address Poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual ordinary Government revenue for development purposes at the grassroots level.

The Constituencies Development Fund (Amendment) Act of 2007 introduced key changes to the management of the Fund. Key Highlights of the 2007 Amendment included replacement of one of the top management Structure, the National Management committee with the CDF Board; and transformation of the Management from a committee under the Ministry of Finance to a State Corporation under the Ministry of State for Planning, National Development and Vision 2030

1.2 About Garissa Township Constituency

Garissa Township is one of the sub counties in Garissa County. It was curved from the larger former Dujis constituency that gave bath to Garissa Township and Balambala constituencies in the delineation done in 2013 after the promulgation of the new constitution in 2010. The Constituency has a total area of 9km² It borders Fafi and Madogo sub counties to the North.; fafi to the East; and Balambala to the South. The Constituency also enjoys the benefits of River Tana and the Major highway connecting to Nairobi , Wajir and Mandera Towns. It lies on the latitude 0° 26° to 0° 90° and longitude 34° 10'E 34° 35'E.

Politically and administratively the constituency is one of the 6 sub-counties that together make up the Garissa County. Administratively, the constituency is made of two divisions (Township and Korakora), and four electoral wards Galbet, Iftin, Township and Waberi Wards. In total it has 18 sub locations. Table 1 below illustrates the number of sub locations in each of the constituency's electoral and administrative wards.

The Chairman asked the members to identify at least two or three projects that they think could make an impact to the community. After deliberation, the members unanimously settled for the establishment of Burburis Police station (office block, staff quarter and toilets), as the presence of station and availability in the area will bring services to the people closer. The members also resolved to construct of Four classrooms and toilets at Towfiq Primary School to allow decongestion and improve learners' performance.

b. Regional Sporting activities

The manager informed the community of a new directive by the Board in the issued Circular to consider participating in at least one regional sport tournament. He also informed members that the regional sports committee come up with a budget of Kshs. 600,000 to be contributed by all the constituencies in Garissa County towards facilitation of Regional Sports tournament. The committee after deliberation agreed to split the allocation of sports vote to cater for the regional activities.

c. Constituency Oversight Committee budget

The Committee was informed of the new development on a provision of not more than 1% of the constituency allocation towards facilitation of the Constituency Oversight Committee activities in a financial year. The committee upon deliberating on this matter approved Kshs. 1,382,150.33 /= for the COC activities and requested the Fund Manager to help in coming up with a proper plan on how the COC shall conduct its activities.

d. Funding of Strategic Plan

The committee considered funding of strategic plan at a cost of Kshs. 3,000,000, the manager informed members of the Board's directive that every Constituency to ensure developing of its Plan. This was deliberated and approved by the committee.

e. Environmental Projects

The committee considered constructions of toilets at various Schools to improve sanitations for funding under environment. Funding of planting of trees was suspended due to lack of sufficient water in most of the public areas.

f. Prioritization of other projects for 2022/2023

The Fund Manager gave an elaborate concerns on the project activities that is required by the Board. Key items is to ensure that;

1. Projects are funded to completion
2. Projects of high magnitude are allocated adequate funds that will enable them to be funded within 3 financial years
3. Projects activities must be clear and SMART

In allocating funds to projects, adequate consultation with the public works is done to ascertain realistic project costings

The chairman also informed the members that during the ward forums and subsequent visit to some education projects, members noted that the allocation of Kshs. 900,000 for construction of classrooms was not adequate and the floors were wearing out faster. The committee resolved to consider doing construction and renovations of education infrastructures upto placement of terrazzo and tiles. This therefore increase the figure to Kshs. 1,25,000 and Kshs. 1,000,000 in some projects. For the schools identified for purchase of laboratory equipment, the committee concluded that there is need as proposed by the schools to carry out Installation and plumbing of water and Gas systems that were never catered for alongside purchase of laboratory equipments. On other projects members deliberated and after lengthy deliberations as summarized above and based on priorities forwarded from the ward meetings, and other stakeholders and all the statutory provisions as provided for in the NG-CDF Act, 2015, the members approved the projects to be factored in the financial year 2022/2023 project in all the four wards in the Constituency as tabulated below: -


