1.0 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NGCDF) is under the Ministry of Planning.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

1.1 BACKGROUND INFORMATION - BALAMBALA CONSTITUENCY

About CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) is established under the CDF Act 2013. The primary objective was to address Poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual ordinary Government revenue for development purposes at the grassroots level.

BALAMBALA CONSTITUENCY

BALAMBALA is a semi-arid town in Garissa County, and an electoral constituency in Kenya. According to the independent electoral and boundaries commission (IEBC). The constituency is number 028 of 290 constituencies in Kenya. Balambala is one of the new 80, new constituents created by IEBC in 2012 after the then Dujis was split in two Garissa township and (027) and Balambala 028.

Administrative and Political Units.

Administratively, BALAMBALA Constituency covers the whole BALAMBALA Sub-County whichis divided into five divisions. The table below shows the distribution of administrative and political units in BALAMBALA Constituency.

Political Units in BALAMBALA Constituency.

Politically, BALAMBALA Constituency is divided into five (5) wards. They include Balambala ward, Danyere ward, Sankuri ward, Jarajara ward, and Saka ward

Security and Governance Issues

Areas of importance is to reduce security incidences within the constituency, reduce human -wildlife conflicts and to achieve harmonies coexistence.

The interventions:

- Construct police posts, police residences as well as provide sanitation.
- Install street lights for lightening and encouragement of operationalization of markéts at night.
- Promote adoption of nyumba kumi initiative.

Environment, water and sanitation

Areas of importance is to prioritize planting of trees throughout the constituency, implement sub catchment plans and encourage solid waste management activities through unemployed youth.

Supporting other National Government functions: Most towns and constituents within the constituency have very limited access to getting government services due to lack of offices and human resources to deliver services. The strategy that will be rolled out will reduce and eventually eliminate these problems and include building government structural institutions such as those of registration of persons, office of public prosecution, magistrate courts, among others. During the last five financial years offices for registration of persons and children protectionsoffices were constructed and are currently in use.

3.7.0 Emergency services: Balambala Constituency is an ASAL area thus challenges of drought, famine and animal disease out breaks are not uncommon. Balambala NG- CDF

will plan to undertake tracking of water services to draught affected communities and building of water tanks as well. Response plan and mitigation measure to other natural calamities will be put in place to control and secure properties and populations of constituents.

Eligible Projects Fundable as per NG-CDF Act 2016

The eligible project fundable by NG-CDF as stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF (Amendment) Acts 2016 as those that are in:

- Respects of works and services falling within the function of the National Government
- Must be community best to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a wide spread cross- section of the inhabitants of a particular area.

The eligible projects include:

- Projects support religious bodies or religious activities
- Project supporting political bodies or political activities
- Recurrent costs of completed projects
- Personal awards
- Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya

Establishment of Balambala NG-CDF Committee

The BALAMBALA Constituency Development Fund Committee is established under the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act of 2015. The Committee is expected to play the following roles:

- Allocation of funds to various projects, determining the quantum of installments to various projects in the constituency, taking into account the disbursement received and the requirement of different projects;
- Submission of a list of constituency based projects to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board within the stipulated time;
- Determination of the allocation of the emergency reserve in accordance with the NG-
- Making appropriate consultations with the relevant Government departments to ensure that cost estimates for the projects are as realistic as possible; and
- Ranking the constituency projects in order of priority, among other activities.

Implementation of Projects in Balambala

As has been stipulated in NG-CDF Act 2015, the BALAMBALA Chairperson of the NG-CDFC, has been convening open forumpublic meetings in the four (4) wards of the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and the constituency. Each Ward prepares a list of priority projects and submits to the NG-CDF for deliberations. All the NG-CDF projects are implemented by the project management committee with the assistance of the relevant department of Government officers.

Review of Key Achievements

Between 2017 and 2024, the BALAMBALA Constituency Development Committee disbursed a total of Kshs. 819 million towards the implementation of various projects in the sectors of Education, Security, Environment, Sports and Bursary. All the projects were done to completion and currently in use.

To improve on retention rates, a total of Kshs. 195 million was used as bursary to assist needy students continue with their education at both secondary and tertiary schools. The constituency allocation for bursary has been increasing since 2013/14, from Kshs. 16 million to Kshs. 50 million in 2023/2024, representing 87 per cent increase.

Major Lessons Learnt

- Bottom-up approach in priority identification enhances project/programme ownership;
- If well managed, devolved funds can go a long way in improving accessibility. affordability and availability of services to communities. This would in turn improve the living standards of the constituents;
- The fund has empowered the BALAMBALA Community to realize their felt needs in development;
- The fund has accelerated development at the grass-root level; and
- Devolved funds have the capability of easing social burdens e.g. payment of school fees.

RATIONALE FOR PUBLIC WARD FORUMS 1.2

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 as amended in 2022 provides that the chairperson of the shall within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency. The Committee shall deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn.

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow stakeholders that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the development programmes.

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development programmes in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. The NG-CDF Committee through public participation identifies public concerns and values that will help them develop a broad consensus on sustainable programmes in the constituency. The Chairperson shall therefore ensure adequate consultation with local leaders and shall publicize public ward meetings so as to reach as many constituents as possible. The main purpose for the public forum is to:

 Sensitize the community on matters NG-CDF especially on the key mandate and functions adducible to the Fund

 Give the community opportunity to deliberate on development matters in the wards and in the constituency.

The expression and harmonization of the mentioned challenges informs key programmes to be considered for Funding through NG-CDF Programmes in the constituency.
