## 1,0 INTRODUCTION

### DADAAB CONSTITUENCY

Dadaab is a semi-arid town in Garissa County, and an electoral constituency in Kenya. The constituency has a population of 148,869 and an Area in Sq. Km (Approx.): 6,781.40 The Constituency hosts both Local community (Kenyan) and Refugees from Somalia, Sudanese and Ethiopians estimated population of 350,000 people in three camps: Ifo, Dagahaley and Ifo 2. The camps cover a total area of 50 square kilometers and are within an 18 km radius of Dadaab town.

Dadaab constituency is one of the newly created constituencies which commenced its operation in FY 2013/2014, and was initially part of the Greater Lagdera Constituency. It borders others Wajir South on the North, Fafi on the East, Lagdera on the West and Garissa Township on the south.

#### Dadaab Constituency Position, and Size.

Dadaab Constituency is one of the six (6) constituencies in Garissa County, Kenya. The constituency is situated along Kenya-Somalia (Jubaland) border. The Constituency has a population of 148,869 people and covers approximately 6,781.40 areas in Sq. KM. Dadaab is unique constituency because it houses the biggest refugee population in Africa as well as the oldest refugee camp in the World.

#### Administrative and Political Units.

Administratively, Dadaab Constituency covers the whole Dadaab Sub-County which is divided into six divisions, which are subdivided into six locations. The locations are sub-divided into eleven (11) sub-locations. The table below shows the distribution of administrative and political units in Dadaab Constituency.

### **Political Units in Dadaab Constituency.**

Politically, Dadaab Constituency is divided into six (6) wards. They include Dadaab ward, Dertu ward, Labasigale ward, Damajaley ward, Liboi ward, and Abakaile ward

### **Dadaab Refugee situation.**

The registered refugee population declined by 1.3 per cent from 494,863 in 2016 to 488,415 in 2017. This was partly due to the voluntary repatriation of refugees from Dadaab complex. Adult refugee population increased by 2.2 percent from 210,718 to 215,312 while child refugee population reduced by 3.9 per cent to 273,103 in 2017.

## **1.1 About NG-CDF**

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NGCDF) is under the Ministry of Planning and National Treasury.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

## **1.2 About Dadaab NG-CDF**

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is established under the CDF Act 2013. The primary objective was to address Poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual ordinary Government revenue for development purposes at the grassroots level.

### **Progress interms of Infrastructure Development**

#### **Education Sector**

The last two financial years (2022-2023 and 2023-2024) constituency experienced significant progress in terms of infrastructure development for schools and sponsorship of needy students in secondary schools and tertiary institutions under the patronage of Hon. Farah Maalim. The committee initiated the establishment of; fourteen (14) new primary schools and two (2) secondary schools, construction of fifty three (53) new classrooms, two administration blocks, three staff houses, twenty (20) latrines for primary and secondary schools and renovation works of sixteen (16) classrooms, distribution of four (400) hundred desks and three hundred (300) lockers and chairs for primary and secondary schools respectively, supplied and distributed three hundred (300) beds and mattresses for four secondary schools. The committee introduced free secondary school program for all students in the eight public secondary schools within the constituency. This amounts to an average of three thousand (3000) learners. The committee also extended full sponsorship for one hundred and fifty four students (154) pursuing Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery at Kampala University in Uganda. Also sponsored are three hundred and fifty (350) students pursuing Education Program for both Secondary and Primary in various universities and colleges. Other seven hundred (7000) students pursuing Nursing courses at KMTC, Engineering and social sciences in various public and private institutions are partially sponsored.

### **Security Sector**

Security in Dadaab constituency continues to face challenges emanating from terrorism especially police posts near the Somalia border such as Hamey, Liboi and Damajalew wards, porous borders, poor education, mistrust and fear of community from police, high unemployment rates and drugs and substance abuse. These can be addressed by construction of administration police posts and housing. Police staff morale and support will be improved by fortifying of police post fencing as well as digging of defense trenches and kips that will ultimately impede terror attacks. Encouragement of Nyumba Kumi initiatives Campaign through Jua Jirani activities in the constituency. The committee initiated construction of five new houses, two amory, renovation of ten latrines and distribution of 21 10,000Litres plastic water tanks.

### **1.2.1 Overview of Fundable Projects under NG-CDF**

#### **Eligible Projects Fundable as per NG-CDF Act 2016**

The eligible project fundable by NG-CDF as stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF (Amendment) Acts 2016 as those that are in:

- Must be community best to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a wide spread cross- section of the inhabitants of a particular area.

#### **The ineligible projects include:**

- Projects support religious bodies or religious activities
- Project supporting political bodies or political activities
- Recurrent costs of completed projects
- Personal awards
- Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya

### Establishment of Dadaab NG-CDF Committee

The Dadaab Constituency Development Fund Committee is established under the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act of 2015 amended 2023. The Committee is expected to play the following roles:

- Allocation of funds to various projects, determining the quantum of installments to various projects in the constituency, taking into account the disbursement received and the requirement of different projects;
- Submission of a list of constituency based projects to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board within the stipulated time;
- Determination of the allocation of the emergency reserve in accordance with the NG-CDF Act, 2015;
- Making appropriate consultations with the relevant Government departments to ensure that cost estimates for the projects are as realistic as possible; and
- Ranking the constituency projects in order of priority, among other activities.

### Implementation of Projects in Dadaab

As has been stipulated in NG-CDF Act 2015 amended in 2023, the Dadaab Chairperson of the NG-CDFC, has been convening open forum public meetings in the four (4) wards of the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and the constituency. Each Ward prepares a list of priority projects and submits to the NG-CDF for deliberations. All the NG-CDF projects are implemented by the project management committee with the assistance of the relevant department of Government officers.

### Review of Key Achievements

Between 2022 and 2024, the Dadaab National Constituency Constituency Development Committee disbursed a total of **Kshs. 336 million** towards the implementation of various projects in the sectors of Education, Security, Bursary, Climate change and mitigation activities. All the projects were done to completion and currently in use.

To improve on retention rates, a total of **Kshs. 165 million** was used as bursary to assist needy students continue with their education at both secondary and tertiary schools. The constituency allocation for bursary attained allowable ceiling of 40% of the total annual allocation.

### Major Lessons Learnt

- Bottom-up approach in priority identification enhances project/programme ownership;
- If well managed, devolved funds can go a long way in improving accessibility, affordability and availability of services to communities. This would in turn improve the living standards of the constituents;
- The fund has empowered the Dadaab Community to realize their priority needs in development;
- The fund has accelerated development at the grass-root level; and
- Devolved funds have the capability of easing social burdens e.g. payment of school fees, protection of water wells around schools.

## 2.0 Documentation of the Ward Reports

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 as amended in 2022 provides that the chairperson of the shall within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency. The Committee shall deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn.

## 3.0 Ward Meetings

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow stakeholders that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the development programmes.

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development programmes in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. The NG-CDF Committee through public participation identifies public concerns and values that will help them develop a broad consensus on sustainable programmes in the constituency. The Chairperson shall therefore ensure adequate consultation with local leaders and shall publicize public ward meetings so as to reach as many constituents as possible. The main purpose for the public forum is to:

- Sensitize the community on matters NG-CDF especially on the key mandate and functions adducible to the Fund
- Give the community opportunity to deliberate on development matters in the wards and in the constituency.

The expression and harmonization of the mentioned challenges informs key programmes to be considered for Funding through NG-CDF Programmes in the constituency.
