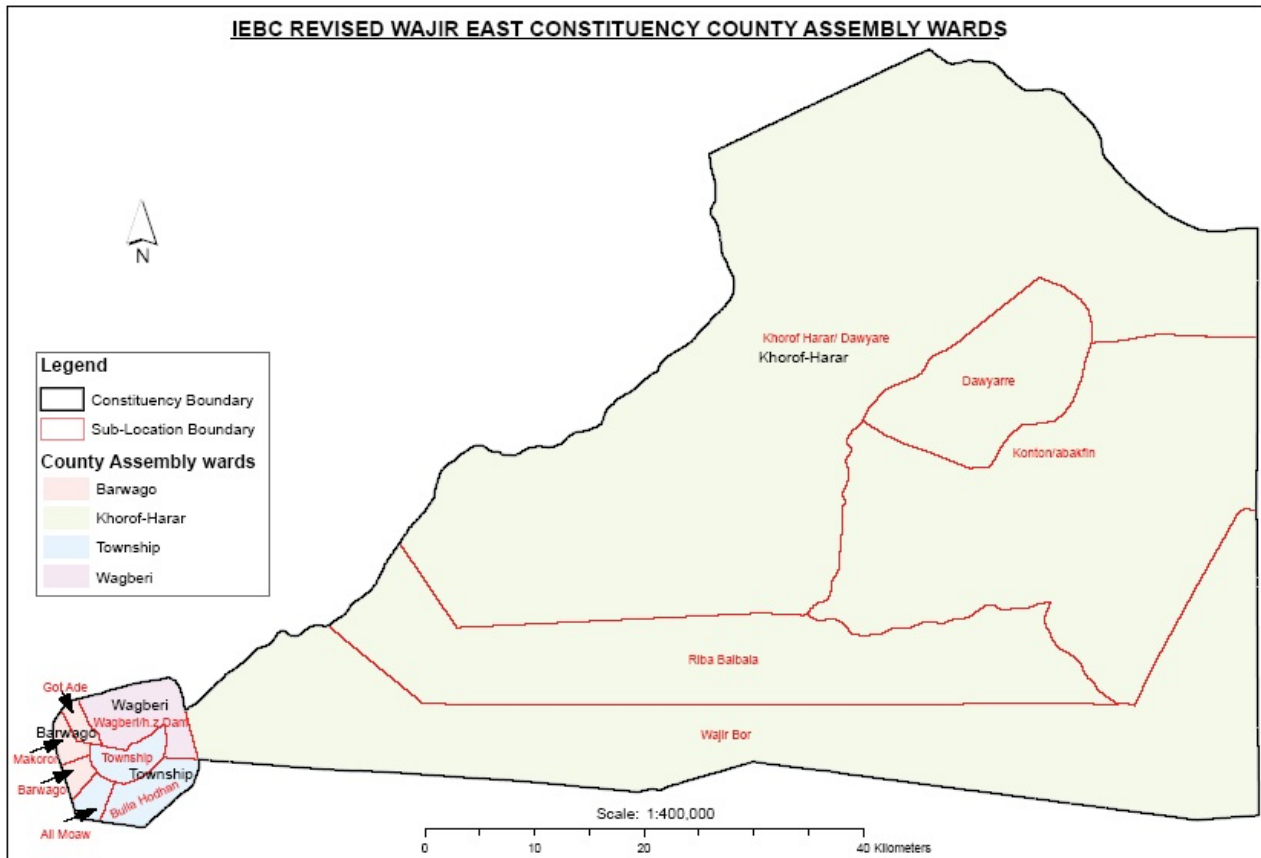

WARD PUBLIC PARTICIPATION FORUM REPORT

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1.0 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NGCDF) is under the Ministry of Planning.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government development Agenda at the constituency level.

The NG-CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

1.1 BACKGROUND INFORMATION – WAJIR EAST CONSTITUENCY

1.1.1 Introduction

Wajir East Constituency is an electoral constituency in Kenya. It is one of six constituencies in Wajir County. The constituency has four wards namely Township, Barwaqo,, Waberi and Khorofharar Wards ; Wajir East constituency was established in 1966.Wajir east constituency has a population of 110,654 people according to the 2019 national census. The constituency has a land of 4,055. Square kilometer. The constituency is made of two sub counties namely Wajir East sub county and Khorofharar sub county .The Constituency has eight divisions , 30 locations and xx sub locations .

Wajir east Constituency boarders Somalia to East, Mandera County and Tarbaj constituency to the North , Wajir west and Eldas Constituency to the West and Wajir South to the South . . The residents of the Constituency are predominately pastoralist with those in Wajir town running small Business enterprises, Wajir town which is the headquarters of the constituency doubles as county headquarter,

1.1.2 Population Projections

Based on Kenya National Population and Housing Census, Wajir East Constituency had a population of 112,572. The population density is 37 and is projected to increase to 44 by 2022 (see table 1-2).

The Population projections are based on a projected growth rate of 3.22 per cent for rural areas of whom majority are pastoralists.

1.1.3 Key Development Challenges in the Constituency related to key function of under NG-CDF Programme and beyond

Low Literacy Levels: The constituency has low literacy levels. This is due to early marriages, female genital mutilation and pastoralism way of lives that inhibits schooling at early ages. Staffing levels are low both in Primary and Secondary levels. Wajir East NGCDF should device projects and Programmes **to address both socio-economic and cultural factors effecting education in the constituency**. Most of the schools (especially secondary) lack adequate learning facilities and equipment. These factors have contributed to poor quality of education in the constituency which is manifested by poor performance in the national examinations. Especially Secondary Schools. **To improve the education concerted efforts must be put in place by all stakeholders in the constituency. To address the inadequacy physical infrastructure, staffing and learning facilities Should be enhanced.**

Environmental Degradation: Degradation of the constituency forest covers through charcoal burning, tree cutting, overgrazing and overstocking have led to Monumental environmental degradation. A proper waste disposal system is lacking in all market centres, medical institutions and hotels. This led to accumulation of non-degradable and hazardous waste in the Public Public places across the constituency.

Insecurity and Clannism: Inter-clan conflicts caused by fighting over land, water and grazing land. The constituency has urban and semi urban setting especially in Wajir town with soaring urban crimes especially use of hard drugs, mugging and robberies. The Constituency also shares a porous borders with Somalia leading to numerous terror attacks by Alshabab resulting in death and destruction of properties.

The constituency population is inhabited by the Somali people who identify themselves through the clans. The main clans include: Degodia, Ajuran and Masare. Clannism is a factor to consider in development planning and distribution of resources. Most of the conflicts experienced are related

to sharing of resources especially water and pasture for livestock.

Inadequate Water Supply and Sanitation: The constituency is faced with acute water scarcity with only 40 per cent of the population having access to safe water. Most of the constituency population lives in rural areas and mostly uses unsafe water direct from the laggas, boreholes, shallow wells and pans. The average distance to the nearest water point is 30 Km. Water trucking has aided in providing water to settlements experienced with acute water problem. Further, as low as 23 per cent of the population use pit latrines, 4.9 per cent use bucket while 58.2 per cent use other means of sanitation such as bushes. This poses a health hazard in terms of disease outbreak such as cholera.

Poor Roads: The constituency has a poor road network consisting of only earth surface roads. Roads are the most common mode of transport in the constituency despite their poor state. The entire feeder road network is in bad condition. All roads are rendered impassable during rainy season thus curtailing all movements by road within the constituency. The constituency lacks proper bridges hence drifts are commonly used along the laggas which are rendered impassable during floods hence need for proper bridges.

Inadequate Health Facilities and Services: Provision of health services is affected by the few health facilities available within the county. The doctor patient ratio is 1: 132,000 which is very low comparing with the national ratio of 1:5,000. ***There is need for the county government to invest in more doctors.*** Due to scarcity of the facilities, residents travel long distances to access health services with an average distance to the nearest health facility being 30Km. In addition, poor road network leads to many patients opting to forgo treatment. ***There is need, therefore, to put up staff houses and equip more health facilities so that community access healthcare within 10 Km.***

Low Agricultural and Livestock Production: Low agricultural productivity has been witnessed in the constituency. Lack of access to farm inputs such as fertilizers, improved seed varieties, pesticides, machinery, and water shortage for effective irrigation form the bottlenecks to increased farm productivity. Poor access to markets for local farmers to sell their produce and earn income maintains them in the vicious cycle of poverty. The constituency lacks processing plants for value addition to agricultural and livestock products. The value addition is expected to increase products penetration to the wider markets.

Food Shortage: A large percentage of the constituency population (72%) is food poor. This is caused by over reliance on rain fed farming, poverty, lack of modern farming methods and high dependency on relief food. According to the 2015/16 Kenya Integrated Household Budget Survey (KIHBS) report, Wajir County headcount poverty rate stands at 62.6 per cent with 10.5 per cent hardcore poverty rate. Nationally, three sources account for three-quarters of all food purchases, namely; general shops (27.9%), open markets (26.6%) and kiosks (22%). Most of the purchases in the arid counties are sourced from kiosks with Wajir County accounting for the highest share (73.6%), followed by Turkana (57.1%) and Mandera (52.6%). Only a paltry 10.1 per cent of Wajir residents get food from their own sources. ***There is, therefore, need to introduce modern farming methods such as green houses and provide sufficient water for irrigation farming.***

Poor Access to Markets: Due to poor state of the road infrastructure, markets are inaccessible especially during the rainy season. This leads to agricultural and livestock produce not reaching to the markets in time hence huge losses to farmers. Inadequate market information is a big hindrance to market access and also price trends.

The constituency lacks appropriate technology and skills to process and preserve agricultural and dairy products. Lack of market information and skills amongst the farmers and business community has hampered the expansion of the market for products from the constituency. Poor storage facilities affect production with 90 per cent of farmers using traditional storage methods. Inactive farmers, cooperative societies and associations coupled with poor roads are a hindrance to the marketing process. Livestock farmers are forced to bear with exploitative middlemen due to the lack of proper marketing strategies and cooperative movement in the constituency. ***There is need to strengthen***

farmers,, institutions to improve marketing of farm and livestock products.

Human Wildlife Conflicts: The constituency lacks protected wildlife conservancy hence increased cases of human wildlife conflicts exhibited through snake bites, attacks of livestock by hyenas and lions. The common wildlife types are gazelles, giraffes, hyenas, ostrich and lions which are left to move freely. There is need to establish a protected area to avert these conflicts.

Land Ownership: All land in the constituency is held in trust by the government hence populace hold no title deeds. This limits farmers, capacity to develop their land for sustainable development. Consequently, this has led to poor land use systems leading to environment degradation. Land adjudication, survey and issue of title deeds should be addressed urgently.

Inadequate Power/Energy Source: In the entire county, only Wajir, Eldas and Habaswein towns are connected to power, with 3.4 per cent of the proportion of population connected to sustainable power source. Due to the rural inclination of most of the constituency populace, there is need to increase household and more market centres connectivity to the national grid.

Limited Financial Inclusion: The constituency lacks a sharia banking compliant financial institution. This is a major challenge in convincing the community to consume banking services. Lack of collateral has led to low credit uptake.

Population Growth: Like Wajir County, the constituency has a population growth rate of 3.22 per cent which is higher than the national one at 2.9 per cent. In addition, 62.9 per cent of the population lives in poverty; hence an increase in population has direct impact on the basic needs like food, water, health and education for all ages. According to the 2015/16 Kenya Integrated Household Budget Survey (KIHBS) report, those between 0 and 17 years, contribute 62 per cent of the total county poverty. The high population growth has been brought about by strong religious and cultural beliefs which advocates against use of family planning, polygamy and high illiteracy levels.

Culture: Some cultural practices have led to low development in the constituency. These include early and forced marriages of the girl child thus denying the youth opportunities to advance in education. Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) is at a high rate of 90 per cent. This has exposed the girl child to risks such as HIV and AIDs infection. There is need to advocate and sensitize the population to do away with such negative cultural practices and pursue alternative channels of initiation.

1.1.4 Eligible Projects Fundable as per NG-CDF Act 2016

The eligible project fundable by NG-CDF as stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF (Amendment) Acts 2016 as those that are in:

- Respects of works and services falling within the function of the National Government under the constitution
- Must be community best to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a wide spread cross- section of the inhabitants of a particular area.

1.1.5 The eligible projects include:

- Projects support religious bodies or religious activities
- Project supporting political bodies or political activities
- Recurrent costs of completed projects
- Personal awards
- Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya

1.1.6 Establishment of Wajir East NG-CDF Committee

The Wajir East Constituency Development Fund Committee is established under the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act of 2015. The Committee is expected to play the following roles:

- Allocation of funds to various projects, determining the quantum of installments to various projects in the constituency, taking into account the disbursement received and the requirement of different projects;
- Submission of a list of constituency based projects to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board within the stipulated time;
- Determination of the allocation of the emergency reserve in accordance with the NG-CDF Act, 2015;
- Making appropriate consultations with the relevant Government departments to ensure that cost estimates for the projects are as realistic as possible; and
- Ranking the constituency projects in order of priority, among other activities.

1.1.7 Implementation of Projects in Wajir East

As has been stipulated in NG-CDF Act 2015, the Wajir East Chairperson of the NG-CDFC has been convening open forum public meetings in the four (4) wards of the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency. Each Ward prepares a priority list of projects and submits to the NG-CDF for deliberations. All the NG-CDF projects are implemented by the project management committee with the assistance of the relevant department of Government officers.

1.1.8 Review of Key Achievements

Between 2017 and 2022, the Wajir East NG- Constituency Development Committee was allocated a totaling of **Kshs.618,776,031** towards the implementation of various projects in the sectors of Education, Security, Environment, Sports and Bursary. All the projects were done to completion and currently in use.

1.1.9 Major Lessons Learnt

- Bottom-up approach in priority identification enhances project/programme ownership;
- If well managed, devolved funds can go a long way in improving accessibility, affordability and availability of services to communities. This would in turn improve the living standards of the constituents;
- The fund has empowered the Wajir East Community to realize their felt needs in development;
- The fund has accelerated development at the grass-root level; and
- Devolved funds have the capability of easing social burdens e.g. payment of school fees, protection of water wells/springs protection.

1.2 RATIONALE FOR PUBLIC WARD FORUMS

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 as amended in 2022 provides that the chairperson of the shall within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency. The Committee shall deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn.

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow stakeholders that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy

to have input into the development programmes.

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development programmes in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. The NG-CDF Committee through public participation identifies public concerns and values that will help them develop a broad consensus on sustainable programmes in the constituency. The Chairperson shall therefore ensure adequate consultation with local leaders and shall publicize public ward meetings so as to reach as many constituents as possible. The main purpose for the public forum is to;

- Sensitize the community on matters NG-CDF especially on the key mandate and functions adducible to the Fund
- Give the community opportunity to deliberate on development matters in the wards and in the constituency.

The expression and harmonization of the mentioned challenges informs key programmes to be considered for Funding through NG-CDF Programmes in the constituency. For clarity and confirmation of the same, NG-CDF Committee undertook public ward forums that was scheduled for 4th January 2023 to 9th January2023. The exercise was carried out for five days covering all the four wards in the constituency namely as per the notice below

b) Remarks by the Area Chief

The area chief of Hodhan Location welcomed members to the meeting after an opening prayer. He thanked the members present for attending the important Ward NGCDF Wajir East development forum. He introduced the various stake holders, various chiefs and Assistant Chiefs, School Board members and Development committees from the ward from the other three locations and appreciated their efforts towards development on the area.

c) Remarks by the Deputy County Commissioner

He explained to the members about the NGCDF development achievement since its inception aimed at the grassroots level development and has been one of the key agendas of the Kenyan government. .

He hailed NGCDF as very successful Government programmes and Court cases against it as misplaced .He confirmed the Government position on NGCDF and its operation and urged the Wajir East NGCDF to ensure compliance with the law.

He hailed the Ward Public Participation forum to enable residents to identify the project proposal for funding.

d) Remarks by the Area Member Of County Assembly

The Township Member of County assembly appreciated the open Ward public participation forum in the constituency and called upon the members to work for the betterment of the area. He urged the members to identify their prioritize in terms of development especially projects under national Government functions .He described the forum as one of the legal requirement before submitting project proposals ,this is a vital road map towards people's driven development.

e) Remarks by the Fund Account Manager

The Fund Account Manager made remarks on the eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF and ineligible projects which are fundable by devolved systems, He also talked about bursary and other statutory ceilings specified in the NG-CDF Act He also Highlighted that all projects proposed in the meeting may not be funded despite Meeting the conditions due to budget constraints and equality among the wards. He further elaborated that the NGCDFC will rank the projects in order of priority and that the on-going projects shall take precedence over all other projects.

f) Remarks by the NG-CDFC Chairman

The chairman appreciated the members concern for development. He highlighted that NGCDF has achieved a lot towards development in the constituency, and the overall aim of this is to ensure active participation of people in the achievement of sustainable development.

g) Remarks by the Area Member Of National Assembly

He mentioned that if the public is involved in the full decision-making process during projects identification, their concerns may be met early on in the planning process when changes may be easier to make, rather than late in the process when even small changes may cost both time and money.

He informed the meeting that NG-CDF was established with the aim of improving service delivery, alleviating poverty, enhancing economic governance, and ultimately to spur development in the constituencies thereby contributing to socio-economic development of all the constituencies.

b) Preliminaries

b) Preliminaries

The area chief called the meeting to order and called upon one volunteer to lead in opening prayers.

c) Remarks by the Area Chiefs.

The meeting was attended by three Area chiefs for locations in the ward who jointly thanked the NG-CDF for organizing a forum where the public have the opportunity to front the projects that they would like NG-CDF to implement within their framework.

d) Remarks by the deputy County Commissioner.

He commended the participants for their attendance and appealed to the participants to actively participate in all development programs. He encouraged everyone to develop a positive attitude and dedication towards development, since development cannot be initiated and owned by foreigners but by the residents themselves.

e) Remarks by the Fund Account Manager.

He informed the meeting on the nature of eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF as community based to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area and those in respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution.

Further he also highlighted the ineligible projects which include: Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities, projects supporting political bodies or political activities, recurrent costs of a completed projects, personal projects, private projects and projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others.

f) Remarks by the NGCDFC Chairman

The chairman thanked the constituents for attending the meeting. He explained the relevance of the meeting and the need for NG-CDFC to convene open forum public meetings in every ward within the constituency to deliberate on development matters and project priorities in the ward and the constituency.

g) Comments By The Area Member Of National Assembly

He reiterated on the need of equitable distribution of resources as opposed to equal distribution, to enable all the areas in the constituency get the requisite development initiatives for better livelihood and stressed on stewardship of funds by the community members since they are the development consumers and community watch dogs.

i) Challenges

Members expressed concern on the restrictive nature of the projects fundable by NG-CDF, especially in the agricultural, health and roads sectors, but the area member of national assembly urged them to forward the projects to the area member of county assembly who was also present in the meeting.


j) Way Forward

The meeting resolved that all the funds disbursed to projects be spent judiciously to promote value for money and boost the livelihood of the residents.

CONCLUSION

- The meeting vested the area member of national assembly with the responsibility of appealing to the NG-CDF Board to release funds to the constituency in time within the financial year to help projects development and payment of school fees to bright but needy students.
- Frequent development forums should be held to give the public information concerning the development initiatives being undertaken by all the development partners and the various funding agencies.
- There should be a joint forum where NG-CDF, County Government and other development stakeholders plan together to avoid duplication of projects.
- The meetings resolved that ongoing project shall be given precedence, to fast track their utilization to enable the beneficiaries get value for money.
- Allocations to projects should also be adequate, to enable completion of project once started, since if completion is delayed the project cost rises due to factors like inflation and wear and tear.

The Chairman informed the members that the committee is required to submit project proposals for the Financial Year 2022/2023 to the NG-CDF Board by 13th January, 2023 subject to the provisions of Section 28 of the NGCDF Act, 2015. The Fund Account Manager informed members that the Constituency had been allocated a total of **Kshs. 138,215,033.00** for the current Financial Year.

The members were briefed on the guidelines for project proposal presentation as documented by the Circular sent by the NG-CDF Board. Below are the key highlights of the deliberation on items presented to members.

a. Deliberation on Ward Report/Meetings

Having conducted public ward forums for all the four wards of the Constituency namely: Barawao, Khorofharar, Township and Waberi Ward. The Fund Account manager tabled before members a summary of the ward report that showed the list of projects considered by the community in each ward. The manager emphasized on the need to do more of such public forums to inform the community of the need to ensure adequate project sustainability.

It was noted that community has a lot of expectation on NGCDF programme especially on education, water and security projects. Few concerns were also reported on other sectors but the community were informed of the distinction between the functions of the county government and that of the National Government. The committee resolved that each ward should at least benefit from a project, however wards with more challenging issues would be considered for more projects.

b. Regional Sporting activities

The manager informed the community of a new directive by the Board in the issued Circular to consider participating in at least one regional sports tournament. He also informed members that the regional sports committee comes up with a budget of Kshs. 600,000 to be contributed by all the constituencies in Wajir County towards facilitation of Wajir Regional Sports tournament. The committee after deliberation agreed to split the allocation of sports vote to cater for the regional activities.

The Committee was informed of the new development on a provision of not more than 1% of the constituency allocation towards facilitation of the Constituency Oversight Committee activities in a financial year. The committee upon deliberating on this matter approved Kshs. 1,000,000 for the COC activities and requested the Fund Manager to help in coming up with a proper plan on how the COC shall conduct its activities.

d. Funding of Strategic Plan

The members approved KShs 2,000,000 for Funding of the strategic plans including its launching, public participation and the consultancy fees.

e. Constituency Moto vehicle

Wajir East constituency is a vast constituency with a porous border sharing with Somalia .Car hire services is an expensive venture making Monitoring and evaluation practically a very expensive to undertake. Based on the above statement Wajir East NGCDF have approved to fund the purchase of a land cruiser hardtop to the tune of 12,000,000 to help in the transport and logistics activities in the constituency.

f. Environmental Projects

The committee discussed at the length issues on environmental activities. It was reported that for the last 4 financial years, the committee has been financing planting of trees in schools. The challenge that was recorded on the tree planting programme was the issue of sustainability. The committee resolved to fund only one schools on planting of trees and on the other hand to consider other environmental projects such as supply of two Energy saving jikos .

g. Prioritization of other projects for 2022/2023

The Fund Manager gave an elaborate concerns on the project activities that is required by the Board. Key items is to ensure that;

1. Projects are funded to completion
2. Projects of high magnitude are allocated adequate funds that will enable them to be funded within 3 financial years
