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MIN03/NG-CDFC/22/2024: MATTERS ARISING

There were no matters arising from the previous Minutes.

MIN04/NG-CDFC/22/2024: ONGOING PROJECTS

The Fund manager brought to the attention of members the provisions of the Act on ongoing projects that must be given first priority when consideration projects to be funded. He however informed members that all the projects were done to completion and there are no ongoing projects.

MIN05/NG-CDFC/22/2024: PROJECTS PROPOSAL FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025

The Chairman informed the members that the committee is required to submit project proposals for the Financial Year 2024/2025 to the NG-CDF Board in the shortest time possible and in any case not later than 6th December 2024. The Fund Account Manager informed members that the Constituency had been allocated a total of Kshs. 179,441,954.47 for the current Financial Year.

The members were briefed on the guidelines for project proposal presentation as documented by the Circular sent by the NG-CDF Board. Below are the key highlights of the deliberation on items presented to members.

a. STATUTORY CEILINGS

The manager informed members of the various statutory ceilings as provided for in the Act and as guided by the Board. The manager highlighted the following to members as conditions given by the Board:

- Committee to provide a detailed budget with clear breakdown on each component to justify allocation for the administration and recurrent expenditure, Monitoring and Evaluation/Capacity building.
- The committee to factor in the Affordable Housing Levy as guided
- The committee to factor in the new rates of NSSF as guided

The said budgets were tabled by the manager and upon deliberations having considered the constituency allocation and the needs of the community, the committee members approved them as given below:

Budget for Monitoring and Evaluation/Capacity Building

The manager tabled to the committee a monitoring and evaluation and training work plans as the basis for expenditure from the monitoring, evaluation and capacity building vote (Annex I). With few amendments on the work plans, the committee finally approved the below budget for consideration and approval by the Board.

The committee after a long deliberation approved the budget for 6% administration/recurrent, 3% Monitoring and Evaluation/Capacity building as tabulated above.

b. BURSARY/SOCIAL SECURITY PROGRAMME ALLOCATIONS

The chairman has brought to the attention of members that the social security programme has challenges regarding the current status of Social Health Authority and its transition under the new Social Health Authority (SHA) and that there is no allocation for the Social Security Program in the financial year 2024/2025. This is due to the transition to the SHA, which is still in the process of establishment and operational clarity. The chairman further informed the committee that the registration for SHA in Mandera East constituency remains notably low, posing a challenge for the program's implementation. Therefore, the NGCDFC has resolved to wait until

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SHA finalizes the registration process and the scope and coverage of the authority become clear before moving forward.

c. Funding of JSS Schools

The manager informed members of the report by the Ministry of Education on the funding of Junior Secondary School especially construction of Grade 9 classrooms. The proposed schools requiring funding as per the Ministry of Education are:

However, due to constrained resources amidst numerous competing needs, the committee deliberated on the matter and resolved to visit nearly all junior secondary schools within the constituency during the ward-level public participation forums. The purpose of these visits was to assess the specific needs of each school. As an initial measure to optimize the use of available resources, the committee decided to prioritize the renovation of dilapidated classrooms in some schools and construct new classrooms in others.

Finally, the committee resolved to prioritize funding for the schools listed below, as they are the most populated among the needy schools, while considering the remaining schools for funding in subsequent financial years.

d. CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION ACTIVITIES

The manager informed the members of the committee about the 5% allocation requirement outlined in the new Act of 2023, as well as the related board directives. The committee deliberated extensively on the matter but concluded that it could not allocate the full 5% due to other pressing needs in the vast constituency and the constraints of the available budget. However, the committee committed to allocating more funds to this requirement in subsequent financial years. After thorough discussions, the committee resolved to allocate funds to the following projects

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e. CONSTITUENCY DIGITAL HUBS

The Fund Account Manager tabled to the committee guideline by the ministry of Information and communication & Digital Economy(MoIC&DE) for the rollout of digital hubs at the constituencies where NG-CDF Committees will be responsible for site identification, resources allocation for the digital hub construction and payment of recurrent costs for utilities and maintenance of constituency digital hub in line with section 25(2A) of the NG-CDF Act. The MoIC&DE and agencies under it will be responsible for policy guidelines for the implementation of the digital hubs programme, recruitment of resource ICT officer, provision of bandwidth, technical support and digital support. The FAM also laid before the committee the BQs, plans and designs from <https://jitume.konza.go.ke/#/home/downloads> as advised by the NG-CDF Board. However, the committee is yet to acquire appropriate site with security, road network and the right population. The NG-CDFC is the process of acquiring a suitable site and will consider fund allocation to the constituency digital hub in the subsequent financial years.

f. REVIEW OF THE PRIORITIZED PROJECTS UNDER NORMAL ALLOCATION FOR 2024/2025 FINANCIAL

The manager informed members that the Board issued guideline vide NG-CDGB/CEO/NG-CDF CIRCULARS/VOL III(001) , requiring NG-CDFC to review their proposals to conform with the provision of the newly amended act of 2023. The new Act does not provide for sport and constituency oversight committee. On the basis of allocation of funds to the projects, the manager reminded the committee of the provisions of regulation in the circular and further clarified that the funding must be for a complete project or a defined phase. The committee after lengthy deliberations approved the below projects inclusive of the other statutory provisions as above to be factored in the financial year 2024/2024 for consideration and approval by the Board.



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1.0 Introduction or Background

This report gives an overview of Mandera East Constituency in the context of National Government Constituency Development Fund.

It talks about NG- CDF in general and Mandera East National Government Constituency Development Fund in particular. The report also highlights the projects funded in the last financial year 2024/2025 and further analyses the same per sector, ward, number of completed projects, number of ongoing projects, Bursary allocations and analysis per ward and the total number of beneficiaries.

The report also focuses on ward stakeholders' meetings for projects identification for the financial year 2024/2025 in terms of when the meetings were conducted, attendant, projects priorities from the wards and challenges facing implementation of NG-CDF projects in Mandera East Constituency.

1.1 About NG-CDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was established under the CDF Act 2003 amended in 2007, 2013, 2015 and 2023. The primary objective was to address Poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual ordinary Government revenue for development purposes at the grassroots level.

The Constituencies Development Fund (Amendment) Act of 2023 introduced key changes to the management of the Fund. Key Highlights of the 2007 Amendment included replacement of one of the top management Structure, the National Management committee with the CDF Board; and transformation of the Management from a committee under the Ministry of Finance to a State Corporation under the Ministry of State for Planning, National Development and Vision 2030

1.2 About Mandera East Constituency

Mandera East constituency is the Headquarters of Mandera county and largest town is Mandera. The constituency is bordered by Ethiopia to the north, to the east and by Wajir County to the southwest. According to the 2019 census, the constituency has a population of 159,638 and an area of 2505.8 km². The main economic activity in the constituency is pastoralism, while others include cross-border trade with Ethiopia, artisanal mining, beekeeping and agriculture along the Dawa River.

Politically and administratively the constituency is one of the 6 sub-counties that together make up Mandera County. Administratively, the constituency is made of Five divisions (Central, Khalalio, Libehiya, Hareri and Arabia), and five electoral wards Arabia ward, Libehiya ward, Khalalio ward, Neboi ward, and Township ward. In total it has 42 sub locations. Table 1 below illustrates the number of sub locations in each of the constituency's electoral and administrative wards.

3.5.8 Way-forward


Need for more funding by NG-CDFC so that it takes shorter period to complete projects started by the fund.
