1.0 Introduction or Background

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of the National treasury and Planning. The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government development Agenda at the constituency level.

2.0 About Lafey Constituency:

Lafey Constituency is an electoral constituency in Kenya. The constituency is among one of the newly created eighty (80) constituencies after the promulgation of the new constitution in August 2010. Lafey Constituency is in Lafey Sub-County of Mandera County. Lafey was carved out from the larger Mandera East Constituency. It's composed of **five wards** namely; **Warangara, Lafey, Sala, Alungu-Gof and Fino**. Lafey Constituency had a population of 153,149 inhabitants as per the figures of the last census in 2009. It has borders with Mandera East from North, Mandera South from south, Mandera North from West and is about 20km from the border of Somalia from East. The current MP for the Constituency is Hon. Abdi Mude Ibrahim who was elected on 8th August, 2017 on an EFP ticket.

Lafey constituency was allocated **Ksh.951,363,137.00** since its inception in the financial year **2013/2014 to 2020/2021** from NG-CDF Board. The breakdown of the allocations is indicated in the table below.

Out of these allocations Education Sector was the largest beneficiary getting a total of **Ksh.547,624,698** which is **58%** of which **36%** was bursary fund. Security sector was the

second and got 17% of the total allocation. Water sector got 2.8% while Health sector and Roads & Bridges got 1.8% and 2.5% respectively.


22.0: Challenges


The public also complained about the delayance of implementation of projects due to rampant clan clashes between Alungu and the neighboring Constituencies.

There is need for a heightened grassroots capacity building and awareness creation on the roles of each type of Government as per the 4th Schedule of our Constitution.




