NORTH HORR NG-CDF  
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He told the members that over the years, North Horr constituency have been clearing first term fees for all form ones admitted to schools in and outside Marsabit County. He gave the following breakdowns on how fees have been awarded to students:

- First Term fees cleared for 1,119 Form one students for Ksh. 19,290,000.00
- Fees form 2-4 918 students for Kshs. 4,590,000.00
- College fees for 155 students for Ksh 1,240,000.00 
- University Fees for 1,145 students at Ksh 10,000 each for Ksh 7,750,000.00
- Tuition fees for 48 KMTC students for Ksh. 960,000 

In view of earlier discussion and consensus by the NG-CDFC that all special students with special needs be given consideration in disbursement and these are orphans, disabled children, children from very poor background and best performing students in expensive schools with limited family capacity to pay their fees. The total expenditure for this category came to Kshs. 1,340,000.00 for 42 students.

Further, the committee deliberated and agreed that, because bursary is allocated bulk of the total constituency budgetary allocation, the disbursement of the fund be handled specially to avoid any audit query and ensure the right beneficiary gets the fund. The fund manager was therefore tasked to ensure the implementation to the latter.

**MIN 5: 10/09/2020: BUDGET CEILINGS AND STATUTORY COMPUTATIONS FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2020/2021**

The Fund Manager was tasked to take the Committees through the Budget Breakdowns and computations of the Statutory Ceilings to which he gave the following vide board circular NG-CDFB/CEO/BOARD CIRCULARS Vol 11 (024) dated 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2020 referenced call for submission of constituency project proposals for the 2020/2021 financial year on or before 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2020.




