1.0 INTRODUCTION

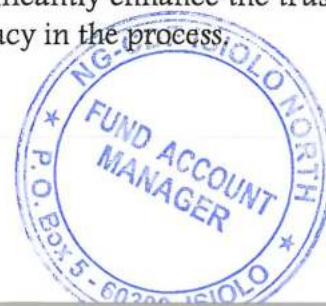
The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from.

The principle of public participation is anchored in the constitution, with **Article 1(2)** summing it all that All sovereign power belongs to the people of Kenya and that the people may exercise their sovereignty directly or through their elected representatives while **Article 10 (2) a, b and c** reinforces the national values and principles of governance as; *democracy and participation of the people; inclusiveness; good governance, integrity, transparency and accountability*. The COK 2010 further through **Article 27 and 35** guarantees public participation as a way to promote equality and non-discrimination and the right to access information by citizens respectively. This will thus contribute and strengthens democracy and governance process as it provides the public with opportunity to exercise their constitutional rights, making the process more representative.

Despite this progressive provision in the constitution and clear NG-CDF Project cycle (Identification, planning, implementation and monitoring), in the past very little happens in terms of public participation in project formulation and information sharing compromising on the quality of the project. The few attempts over the years to organize a public participation have ended in public acrimony and apathy due to skewed process and discrimination of some ethnic groups and regions (wards) in the NG-CDF projects. Such poor project identification, planning and poor targeting of different groups especially youths, women and people living with disability (PLWD) in the process reduce ownership, consequently affecting quality and successful implementation of the projects.

With studies showing that the level of public participation increases with knowledge and awareness, this process, greatly contributes to transparency and accountability besides providing the public, with platform on which they can engage with decision makers and or service providers. A well planned public participation will thus significantly enhance the trust between the NG-CDF and the public consequently increasing legitimacy in the process.



Process overview

Public participation involves planning and identifying who should be involved in the process and this entails, engaging with both the community and other organized interest groups. This step is therefore designed to enrich the process by creating platform or opportunities for producing public views and opinion the identification and management of NG-CDF projects unlike in the past, where the process has been 'political' and or skewed or derived from top bottom approaches. Public participation thus reduces instances where politicians have influenced concentration of investment in areas largely perceived as their home turf or vote hunting ground.

At community level, the team engaged differently with both the youths, women and people with disabilities (PWD) and as well as local and other opinion leaders through either direct (focus group discussions, round tables and public hearing) or indirect participatory methods such as the use of local FM radio stations during prime hours for a 'call in' session, where communities will get an opportunity to engage with an 'expert' or Fund patron or manager on the NG-CDF plans.

The process was also used to map stakeholders and any other community structure for support during the identifications, implementations and monitoring of the projects and as well provides additional skills and insights that might not have been considered. These structures will also go a long way in managing conflicts between the different interest groups in the communities while enhancing ownership of projects. The stakeholder analysis will then further be used to identify strength of each stakeholder and area of operation as a framework for developing collaborative strategy between the institutions and NG-CDF.

With a clear guideline by the NG-CDF act on the areas of support, the fund has a clear budget line on which this money has to be spent, for instance the Act stipulates that the bulk of this funding classified as statutory goes into social security programmes such as bursary scheme at 35%, emergency 5%, administration 5-6%, monitoring and evaluation 3% and 2% for sport and environment respectively. The balance, 46% of the disbursement goes into funding of community projects (building of schools and security projects) generated through participatory process. This process will further be used to compliment future need assessment for education and security, where targeting or funding is done based on the felt need of the community.

1.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act,



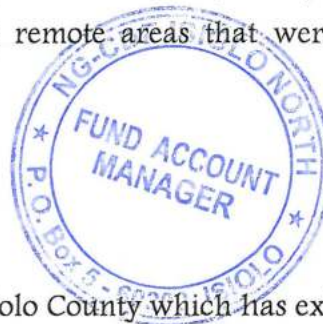
2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.



2.0 ABOUT ISIOLO NORTH NG-CDF

2.1 Constituency Overview

Isiolo North is one of the two constituencies in Isiolo County which has existed since 1966. The constituency covers Isiolo central and Merti sub counties. The Constituency has and seven (7) electoral wards. Isiolo town where constituency office is located is designated to become one of the resort cities in Kenya and a major regional transport hub. It is endowed with rich and largely unexploited natural resources including diverse flora and fauna, mineral resource, wind, sunshine, salt licks, springs, rivers and vast land. The strategic position of the constituency is irresistible and attracts both local and international investors. Two national reserves i.e. Shaba and buffalo springs are located in the constituency while the only tarmac road in the county which is part of Nairobi- Addis Ababa international highway passes through Isiolo central sub county in the constituency. Pastoralism is the main source of livelihood in the constituency with an estimated 80% of residents relying on livestock rearing and related enterprises.

2.2 Position and Size

Isiolo north constituency borders Marsabit County to the North, Samburu and Laikipia Counties to the West, Wajir County to the North East, and Meru County to the south West. It covers an area of approximately 15,700 km² which is approximately 62% of Isiolo County's land mass. Isiolo town which is the constituency headquarters lies 285 kilometers north of Nairobi, the Capital City of Kenya by road.

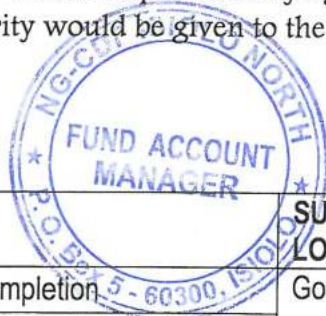
