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1.0 INTRODUCTION

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from.

Citizen participation in project planning, management and implementation planning requires the involvement of concerned stakeholders. This includes identifying public concerns and values and developing a broad consensus on planned initiatives. It is also about utilizing the vast amount of information and knowledge that stakeholders hold to find workable, efficient and sustainable solutions.

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow those that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the process. Community participation motivates the stakeholders to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and own the projects in their localities.

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development Initiatives in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. It is important that all stakeholders are involved in the development of projects and not just direct beneficiaries of an initiative.

1.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

1.2 ABOUT TIGANIA WEST NG-CDF

Tigania West Constituency is an electoral constituency in Kenya. It is one of the constituencies in Meru County. Its Constituency Number is 054 and has a population of 135,980 according to the 2019 Census. Tigania West Constituency covers an area of 455.1sq. Km. The constituency is currently represented by Hon.Dr John Kanyuithia Mutunga. The Constituency is made up of the following County Assembly Wards:

Kianjai Ward has approximately a population of 36,874 people. The Ward has an area of approximately 126.50 square kilometers. The Ward Comprises of 16 sub locations namely; Kiandiu, Miathene, Urru, Antubeia, Kianjai, Mutionjuri, Muthiru, Nairiri, Muramba, Thau, Lairang'i, Mumui, Rei, Kalithiria, Mituntu and Ithamare sub location in Meru county.

Akithi Ward has approximately a population of 35,646 people. The Ward has an area of approximately 74.10 square kilometers. The Ward Comprises of 10 sub locations namely; Limbine, Mweronkanga, Twale, Maanthi, Karii, Muili, Kaliati, Ntiba, Kitheo and Mucuune sub location in Meru county.

Athwana Ward has approximately a population of 18,127 people. The Ward has an area of approximately 149.60 square kilometers. The Ward Comprises of 6 sub locations namely: Ntulili, Kibiru, Laciathuriu, Kuani, Matiru, Kandebene sub locations in Meru County.

Nkomo Ward has approximately a population of 24,361 people. The Ward has an area of approximately 53.9 square kilometers. The Ward comprises of 6 sub locations namely; Kunene, Limauro, Kilenchune, Ntoombo, Kamaroo, Amwari sub locations in Meru County.

Mbeu Ward has approximately a population of 20,972 people. The Ward has an area of approximately 51.0 square kilometers. The Ward comprises of 6 sub locations namely; Kiorimba, Machegene, Kieru, Kibuline, Kimirii, Mbeu sub locations in Meru county.

The Forum started with sub locations based Community. The forum was attended by 234 Members of Public, 10 NGCDF Committees, 3 oversight committee members, community elders, Youths, Women representatives, School Head teachers, Assistant Chiefs, Chiefs and the Area Member of Parliament.



Athwana Ward

The forum was attended by 168 Members of Public, 10 NGCDF Committees, 3 oversight committee members, community elders, Youths, Women representatives, School Head teachers, Assistant Chiefs, Chiefs and the Area Member of Parliament.

3.2.3 COMMENTS BY THE CHAIRMAN, NGCDFC

3.3.2 CHALLENGES

1. Lack of civic education among the locals on the roles of NG-CDF with the community presenting proposals that are not within the scope of work of NG-CDF.
2. Despite the national government announcing post-covid recovery measures, clear guidelines have not been spelt on how we can help our people to recover economically. This has led to continued increase of poverty levels within the society which affects the office indirectly.
3. There have been many challenges since some sectors were devolved and therefore could no longer be funded by NG-CDF. Due to this some projects have stalled and this has caused a lot of complaints from the community members. For instance, some bridges and roads that were in the past being improved through NG-CDF have been neglected after they were handed over to county government and it is a challenge to satisfactorily make the public understand the shift of roles.

3.3.3 WAY FORWARD

Community Members were urged to discuss their problems during community meetings or elders' meetings whenever they meet and send their proposals to the Office for record purposes. The Present Members of the Community were requested to hold sensitization meetings on the feedback of the forums once they arrive home. That is to call community gatherings and inform the people of what transpired at the public forum.

3.3.4 CONCLUSION

- The Community Members were informed that Issues raised in this Public Forum will be financed during the Financial Year 2022/2023 and in case of change of idea they will be notified of the changes.
- The Community Members were requested to Monitor the activities of the Contractors without interference and ensure that they provide quality services. In Case the community is not satisfied with the nature in which the projects were done, they were requested to notify the office in time.
