In 2015, the CDF Act 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new one enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG CDF Act 2015 which is under the Ministry of Planning.

## **About Tetu Constituency**

It borders Othaya constituency to the North, Nyeri Town Constituency to the South, Mukurweini and Mathira Constituencies to the east and Aberdare National park to the West.
