Roselyn Kinuthia stated that work was ongoing in Wangunyu Primary school as the roofing has been done together with the plastering while the wall finishing was ongoing. John Wamwiri reported to the committee on Karuri Police Station and said that the upper floor has been done; alignment of collars is yet to be done while the wall plastering was not well done. He also reported that work at Kiambaa hall had begun and is ongoing while in Muthurwa two classrooms have been constructed but no plastering yet.

The chairman also reported on Muchatha primary school construction of a toilet which is underway with only the plastering remaining.

There was also report on Kawaida primary school masonry wall which is at sub stretcher level, while in Upper Kihara there are 6 classes underway with the roofing and terrazzo finished but the painting yet to be done. Karura primary school was also reported on with the external and internal painting and verandah walling done.

At Karura secondary school there is a suspended slab for the toilet.

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) formerly Constituencies Development Fund (CDF), is a fund established in 2003 through an Act of Parliament, the CDF Act 2003. The Act was later reviewed by the CDF (Amendment) Act 2007, and repealed by CDF Act, 2013 which was subsequently succeeded by the current NG-CDF (Amendment) Act 2016.

The Fund is domiciled within the ministry in charge of national economic policy and planning, currently the Ministry of Devolution and Planning. The main purpose of the Fund is to enhance infrastructural and socio-economic development at the grass root level in order to reduce poverty by dedicating a minimum of two and half per cent (2.5%) of all National Government's share of annual revenue towards community projects identified at constituency level by the communities.

The fund is managed by National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board (NG-CDF Board) established under Section 14(1) of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) Act, 2015. The NG-CDF Board is the organ responsible for the overall management of the Fund at the National level. It ensures that administration of the fund is done efficiently and effectively.

NGCDF Committee is established under section 43(1) of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015. The Committee is mandated to administer the fund at the constituency level. Key responsibilities are to identify projects, allocate funds to projects, and disburse the funds to project implementation committee, monitor the implementation of the fund and report to the NGCDF board.

Projects

In the last financial year (2019/2020) the NG- CDF allocation was Ksh. 109,040,875.52. The funding was distributed to education, environment and security sectors among other. The following is the summary of completed and ongoing projects.

The allocation of funds per project was not enough for most project resulting to 14 projects being prioritized as ongoing projects in the financial year 2019/2020. There were delays in disbursement of funds from NGCDF Board resulting to a big number of projects incomplete.

REPORT ON WARD MEETING.

The meetings were done in the five Wards of the constituency. The NGCDF office invited management of schools, security officers within the constituency and the community at large. The announcements were done in churches and letters written to the stakeholders. The attendance was good that saw the presence of area Member of Parliament including other leaders in the community.

The area Member of Parliament thanked the community for electing him and promised to work together with other elected leader in delivering the development agenda of Kiambaa Constituency. The Member of Parliament told the communities benefiting from the projects to be vigil and provide social audit on projects. He however asked the project management Committees to provide returns once the project is complete and be accountable to each and every coin funded to the project. He vowed to complete all projects he initiated and asked the CDFCs to proper monitoring and evaluation of the projects and to adhere to procurement procedures.





The Patron cautioned the County Government executive of taking over projects once funded by CDF without proper handing over. He termed it illegal asked the County Government to follow the right procedures while taking over project that had initially been funded by CDF.

The chairman welcomed all for the meeting, introduced the new team of CDFCs. He thanked the area chief and assistant Chief for the support they are giving in the implementation of the NG-CDF projects in the area. The chairman urged the community to play the oversight role on projects being implemented within their area and report to the relevant offices in case of anomalies. He also advised the PMCs to shun corruption and see that projects are implemented to completion within the stipulated time.

FAM thanked the Public for honouring the call for the meeting. She noted that Section 27 (1) of the NG-CDF Act 2015 as amended in 2016 requires that the chairperson of the Constituency Committee shall within the first year of the commencement of new Parliament and atleast every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters.

The FAM explained on eligible and ineligible projects under the Act. She also sighted section 49 of the NG-CDF Act where part funding is allowed other than the fund. She also noted as per section 46 (2) of the Act priority will be given to ongoing projects. She informed the public the Projects to propose should be related to Education, Security, Environment and Sports.
