The youth who apply for the contracts do not have the pre requisite documentation for the them to qualify for the Jobs.




The security issue is still critical and this has always increased costs for projects in combination with water scarcity

The stakeholders agreed to equip the already established institutions instead of registering new schools






Kalapata Ward

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


Katilu Ward



Lokichar/Lochwa Ward

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
