

ENDEBESS CONSTITUENCY DEVELOPMENT FUND WARD PROJECT REPORT.

1.1 Background Information on NG-CDF

The National Government Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF) formerly Constituencies Development Fund (CDF), is a fund established in 2003 through an Act of Parliament, the CDF Act 2003. The Act was later reviewed by the CDF (Amendment) Act 2007, and repealed by CDF Act, 2013 which was subsequently succeeded by the current NG-CDF (Amendment) Act 2016. The Fund is domiciled within the ministry in charge of national economic policy and planning, currently the Ministry of The National Treasury. The main purpose of the Fund is to enhance infrastructural and socio-economic development at the grass root level in order to reduce poverty by dedicating a minimum of two and half per cent (2.5%) of all National Government's share of annual revenue towards community projects identified at constituency level by the communities.

1.2 Background Information about Endebess Constituency.

1.2.1 Position and Size of the constituency

Endebess constituency is one of the five constituencies that make up the larger Trans-Nzoia County. The constituency was carved out of the larger Kwanza constituency and created by the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) gazette supplement No. 83 , Legal notice 185 in line with article 89 (delimitation of electoral units) of the constitution of Kenya 2010. The constituency lies between latitude 1° 4' 0" North and Longitude 34° 51' 0" East. It borders Uganda to the West, Kwanza constituency to the North East and Saboti Constituency to the South East. According to 2009 population and housing census, Endebess constituency had a population of 91,192 disaggregated by gender as; male – 45,875 and female – 45,317. This population was projected to be: 130,708 (male – 65,754 and female – 64,954) in 2019. This is expected to grow to 135, 499 (male – 68,164 and female – 67,335) in 2022. The Constituency is largely cosmopolitan with enriched ethnic and cultural diversity. The Constituency covers a total area of 680 Km². It is the largest constituency in Trans-Nzoia County.

1.2.2 Administrative and political Units

The constituency has three administrative wards: Endebess ward, Matumbei ward and Chepchoina ward. It's located in western Kenya Trans-Nzoia County. The management of NG-CDF activities in the constituency is carried out by the National Government Constituency Development Fund Committee for Endebess constituency. Since its inception in 2013 the committee has funded projects in the following sectors of the Kenyan economy: Education, Roads, Health, Agriculture, Security and the environment in the year 2013.
