

3. To resubmit the declined reallocation above.

Regarding the reallocation of funds for Kitum Girls Secondary; the committee deliberated and clarified that there are 2 classrooms that were funded and constructed at St. Paul's Kitum Girls during the 2015/2016 financial year at ksh 1,000,000. The committee regrets that in the reallocation done by the committee to the board the name Kitum Girls Secondary School was used. The committee resolved to stick and use the initial name of St. Paul's Kitum Girls Secondary School. The third incomplete classroom in the school was funded by the county government of Trans-Nzoia. After consultation, the committee also resolved to use the funds to only fund completion of the 2 classrooms (plastering, flooring, fittings and painting) funded by the NG-CDF.

As for reallocation of funds for St. Pius primary School; the committee deliberated and clarified that at the time of submitting the 2018/2019 proposal St. Pius Primary school was a new school operating but was in the process of acquiring registration status. The process has however taken unnecessarily long while the funds lie unutilized in the constituency account. Yet there are other projects ongoing that desperately require additional funding. The committee deliberated and resolved to request the board to consider and approve the reallocation of the funds to be utilized in the construction of dormitory at Japata Secondary school.

The case of the Innovation hub and its supposed role in equipping the youth with ICT and information skills and knowledge could not be overemphasized. The committee discussed and resorted that the project name is Endeless Constituency Innovation Hub as opposed to calling it a resource centre. Now aware that community libraries fall under devolved functions, the committee resolved that the project will not be a library or have a section of it for the purpose of library service. In fact referring to the Bill of Quantity, the project has a large open space area, a reception area, a store area, and an office room. The committee assigned the fund manager to on behalf of the committee, write to the board clarifying all the above areas.

MIN 34/END/NG-CDFC/11.10.2019 PROJECT PROPOSALS.

The monitoring and evaluation chairperson Ann Chebet tabled a report of the public meeting held in the wards for purposes of identifying projects to be funded. The committee adopted the report for discussion. The report highlighted the various projects that the people in the wards would like to be funded. The members deliberated on the report; analyzed project by project.

The fund account manager also tabled NG-CDF Board circular Ref: NG-CDFB/CEO/BOARD CIRCULARS Vol. II (014) of September 24, 2019 regarding preparation and online submission of constituency project proposals for the 2019/2020 financial year. According to the circular, the constituency was allocated ksh 137,367,724.14 as its budget ceiling. Therefore the committee was mandated to prepare and prioritize projects totaling to Ksh 137,367,724.14.

During the discussion the committee in unison agreed and resolved to prioritize funding to ongoing projects especially the committee's mega projects (twin laboratories) that were partly funded in 2019. Priority was also given to statutory ceilings like social security programmes, education bursary schemes, emergency, sports activities, environment, monitoring and
