NGCDFC/02/30/09/2021: READING AND CONFIRMATION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES



1.0 Background on NGCDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is established under Section 4 of the NG-CDF Act 2015 as amended in 2016, with an objective of addressing poverty and regional development imbalances by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the National Government share of annual revenue as divided by the annual Division of Revenue Act enacted pursuant to Article 218 of the Constitution. The funds are geared towards community driven development projects in every constituency identified and implemented at grassroots level.

The Fund is managed by the NG-CDF Board, which is a Body Corporate established pursuant to Sections 14, 15 and 16 of Act. At the constituency level, the day to day management of the Fund is vested on the National Government Constituency Development Fund Committees that are in place in each of the 290 constituencies countrywide.

The main mandate of NG-CDF Board is to consider project proposals submitted from various constituencies in accordance with the Act, approve for funding those projects proposals that are consistent with the Act and send funds to the respective constituency fund account of the approved projects.

2.1.3 Comments

By the Chair NGCDFC

The Chairman introduced the meeting by welcoming everybody present. He highlighted the need for the residents of Tirioko Ward to be proactive in their approach and assured them that NGCDF would partner with them to ensure development goals are achieved. He insisted in order for Tirioko to be developed, the residents must work together with all development partners. He encouraged residents of Tirioko Ward to identify projects that would benefit them most. He assured them that NGCDF will do all that it takes to implement the projects they identify.

By the Deputy County Commissioner (DCC)

The Deputy County Commissioner highlighted the need for security in the area. He argued that development cannot be achieved without security. He asked residents of Tirioko Ward to embrace community policing to help them achieve their development goals.

By Hon. William Kassait Kamket - Area MP

The area member of Parliament asked the community to identify wisely projects that would have maximum benefit to the community.

Comments by FAM on the nature of projects with respect to NG-CDF Act

The fund manager shared with the congregation briefs of the NGCDF Act highlighting the nature of eligible projects to be proposed. He informed the gathering of the need for community based projects identification and distribution of projects across the Ward that would have widespread benefit. He asked the meeting to pay attention to the separation of functions and restrict themselves to the National Government functions of Education and Security.

2.1.5 Challenges

- The public could not clearly distinguish the separation of functions. A number of proposals suggested belonged to the devolved functions of County governments.
- The public demanded that all project proposals be started all at once.
- Security concerns particularly on border points that hinder implementation of development projects
- Lack of water in the entire ward for construction and for general use is a challenge to development projects.
- Vast area with limited resources hence raising transportation cost of hardware materials.
- Limited funds compared to the community needs
- Below average literacy levels.
- Vast and Poor road network hinder access to schools, markets and other areas of need.


2.1.6 Way-forward

The meeting resolved that other than the collected project proposals, the Wards proposals as captured by the strategic plan will be considered in implementation of projects.

The community asked the County Government to join in provision of water in order to support NGCDF implement most development projects especially construction of classrooms with ease and complete on time.

The community was thankful to both the National government and County government for the continuous support and they agreed to embrace participation on developmental issues, they also promised to get involved and ensure that all projects are implemented successfully.


The NGCDFC representative Mrs. James Lomeri appreciated the input of forum for making the meeting successful. The gathering requested NGCDFC to consider distant and remote places in allocating more funds to projects due to the higher transportation cost involved.
