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## **1.0 Background on NG-CDF**

The National Government Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF) is established under Section 4 of the NG-CDF Act 2016, with an objective of addressing poverty and regional development imbalances by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the National Government share of annual revenue as divided by the annual Division of Revenue Act enacted pursuant to Article 18 of the Constitution. The funds are geared towards community driven development projects in every constituency identified and implemented at grassroots level.

The Fund is managed by the NG-CDF Board which is a body corporate established pursuant to Sections 4, 15 and 16 of Act. At the constituency level, the day-to-day management of the Fund is vested in the National Government Constituency Development Fund Committees that are in place in each of the 290 constituencies county wide.

The main mandate of NG-CDF Board is to consider project proposals submitted from various constituencies in accordance with the Act, approve for funding those projects proposals that are consistent with the Act and send funds to the respective constituency fund account of the approved projects.

Baringo South is an electoral constituency in Kenya. It is one of the constituencies in Baringo County.

- V. Projects targeting a specific club or group of people

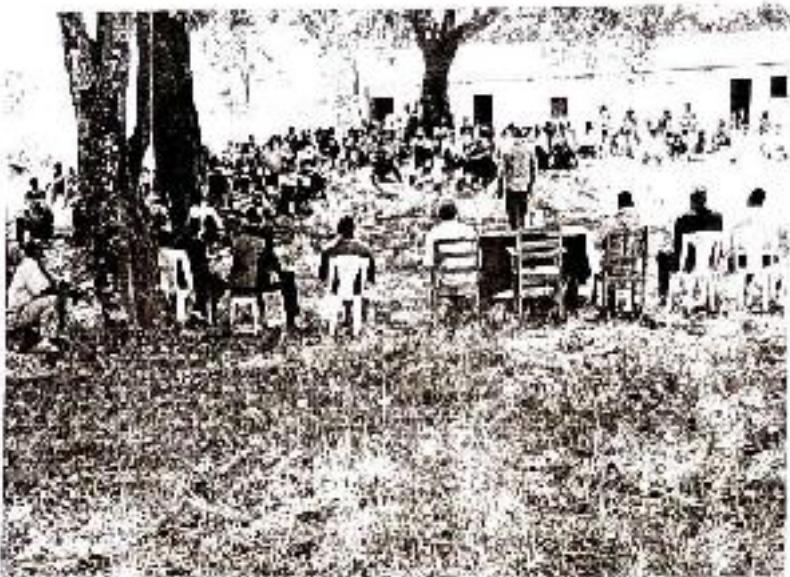

He further advised the residents how they will participate in projects that will directly benefit them.

He further explained to the members of the public that the project proposal priorities will be running for the next two financial years i.e. 2022/2023 and 2023/2024.

#### **By the Deputy County Commissioner (DCC)**

He called upon the stakeholders to preach constructive development agenda that would spur socio economic growth in the region and refrain from retrogressive policies. He promised to propel equitable distribution of resources in line with other national government agencies hand in hand with the county government.

#### **By Vincent K Sibilo-Accounts Assistant the Nature of Projects in respect to NC-CDF Act**

Mr Vincent Sibilo alluded that NG-CDF only funds community-based projects meant to serve community needs in the constituency and have long-term positive effects on people's well-being and also gave a briefing on the ineligible projects.

He further asserted that Co-funding is also allowed where a project can be financed from sources other than the Fund; so long as the other financiers or donors of that project have no objection and provided that the part funding for the project availed pursuant to the NG-CDF Act 2015 shall go to a defined unit or any part thereof phase of the project in order to ensure that the particular portion defined in the allocation is completed with the funds allocated under this Act.

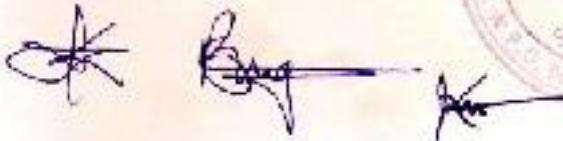
