INTRODUCTION

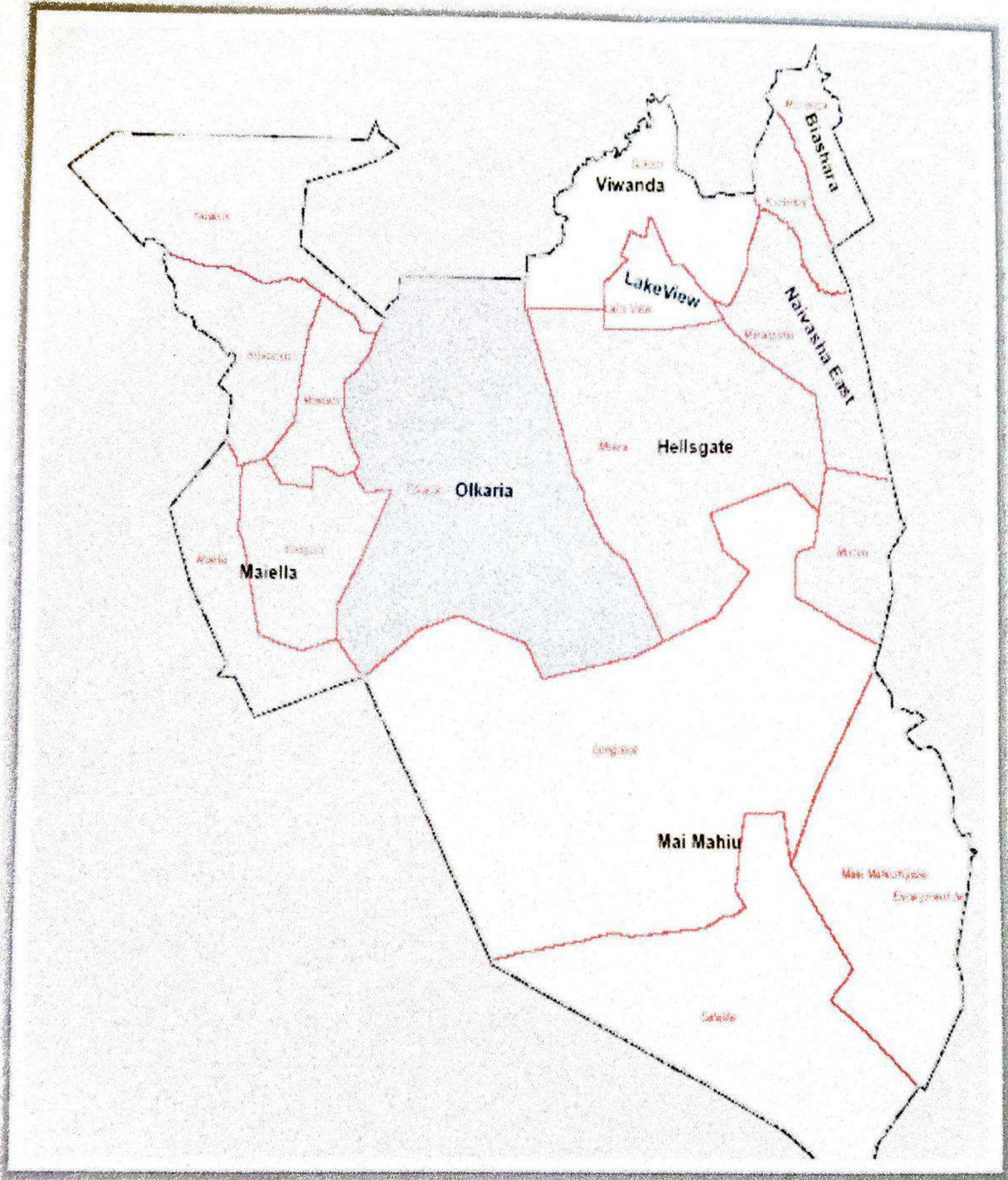
