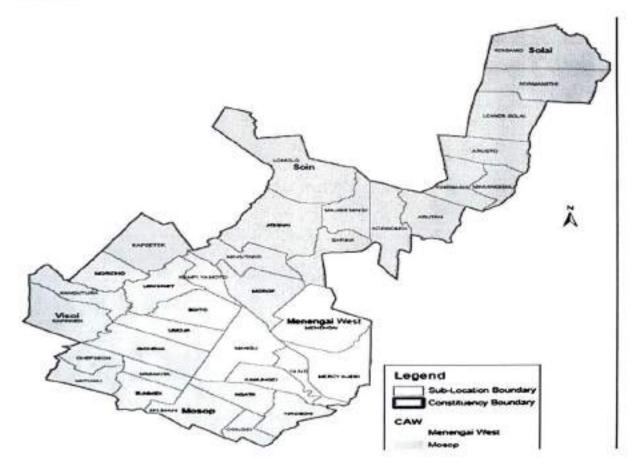

#### PUBLIC PARTICIPATIPATION MEETING HELD FROM 4<sup>TH</sup> TO 9<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2023

#### INTRODUCTION

Rongai Constituency is located in Nakuru County. Rongai Constituency has five administrative units which correspond to its political units. The five political units (wards) are: Mosop, Soin, Menengai West, Solai, and Visoi. The Constituency is within Rongai Sub County which has 17 Locations and 35 Sub Locations. The Constituency population as per the KPHC 2019 was 199,906 whereas the number of registered voters as per IEBC report (2022) were approximately 84,625. In the NG-CDF framework, management of the Fund at the Constituency level is done by the National Government Constituencies Development. Rongai constituency is a cosmopolitan constituency and a neighboring Nakuru West constituency which hosts Nakuru County headquarters, Bahati Constituency, Subukia, Mogotio, Eldama Ravine and Njoro Constituency. Its strategic position gives its residents advantage to access services and goods and markets to the producers especially farmers and manufactures. Its expansive in terms of area coverage and being a home for most Nakuru residents provides a challenge for the high number of residents to compete for limited Economic and social amenities.



#### SION WARD

The ward borders Baringo County, Mogotio Constituency. It has large sisal plantations and informal settlements that provides cheap labour to plantations in addition to settling of Internally displaced persons of 2007 post-election violence. The poverty level is so high and public resources available are already strained.

#### REMARKS FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The chairman welcomed the constituents to the open public meeting on NGCDF projects. He introduced the NGCDF committee. He explained to residents the importance of the public participation as anchored in the constitution. The chairman took the constituents through the projects which Rongai NGCDF had been implementing in the ward and the challenges NGCDF has encountered as well as success. He informed the public of some of the projects that have been done and are completed and in use other are ongoing.

#### REMARKS FROM THE FUNDS ACCOUNT MANAGEER

The constituents were taken through the various sections of the NGCDF Act 2016 relevant to identification of the projects for consideration for FY2022/23. The following areas were explained in depth for the participant's understanding;

1. Eligible projects

2.Ineligible projects

3. The need to ensure the ongoing project take precedence.

4. The need to ensure projects funded comply with the Law, Strategic plan and National Development Goals.

5. Public participation in projects prioritization.

6. Adherence to statutory ceiling per sector.

The Fund manager reminded the constituents that the NGCDF is a National Fund and therefore focus will be put on funding National Government functions as provided in schedule 4 of the

Constitution of Kenya. The constituents heard that some functions which were under the domain of the NGCDF would be left to the County Government. He however explained that the NGCDF and County Government were not in competition but rather complementing each other in service to the public. He thanked the public for the support and corporation and reiterated that the NGCDF will continue to the quality service to all.

#### REMARKS FROM THE AREA CHIEF.

The Chief started by thanking the constituents for their attendance, cooperation and understanding. He repeated the need to ensure transparency and accountability in the identification and implementation of NGCDF projects.

The area chief appreciated the Rongai NGCDF for the good work they have been doing especially their support for the security projects across the constituency. He pledged to ensure at most cooperation and support to the NGCDF from his office. He reiterated that consultation is Key in the implementation of the NGCDF programmed and added that his role will be to ensure that there is peace and stability which is the great ingredient for sustainable development. He requested the constituents to prioritize security projects including police lines, chief's offices, as the level of insecurity are on themise in the area. She also requested NGCDF to support the youth who are so much engaged in drug abuse due to desperation and lack of Jobs. Wished the constituents well as they continue issuing their proposals. The chief categorised constituents as per the number of sup-locations to ensure that each member present aired their views.

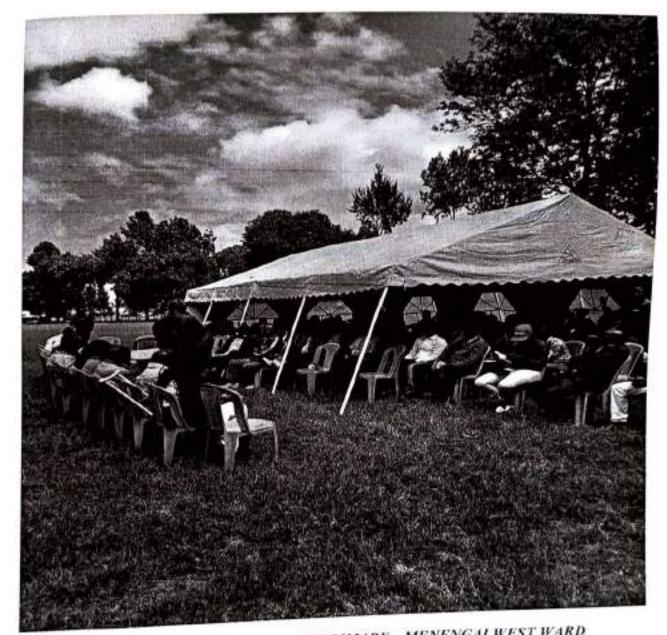

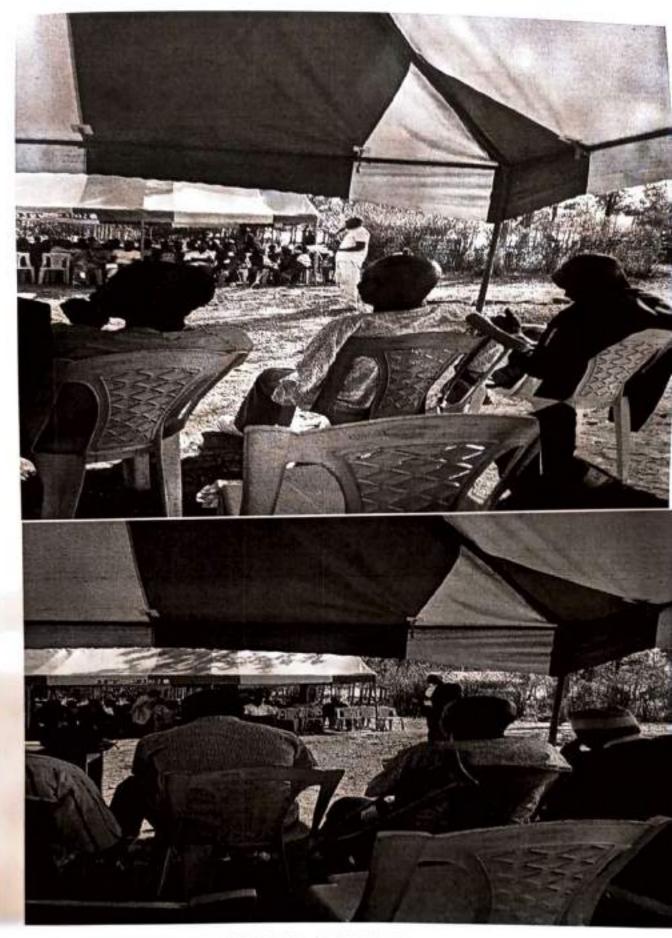

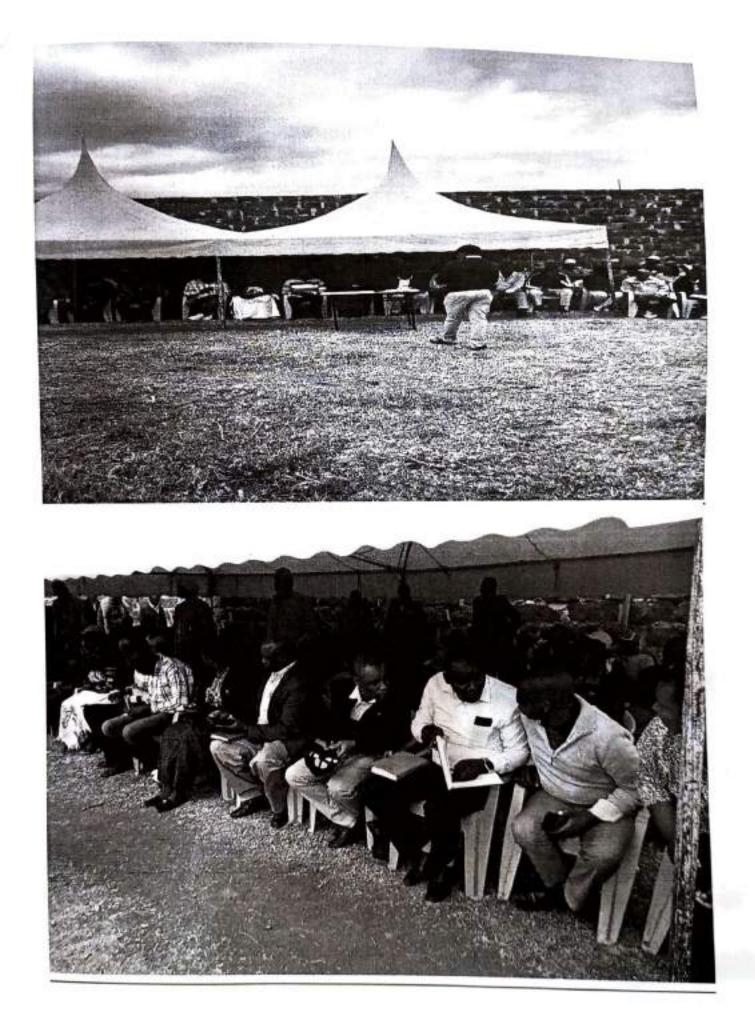
