The secretary read through the minutes of 22nd October 2018 which was confirmed by members as a true record of what was deliberated upon. The minutes were proposed by Mr. Museve and seconded by Ms. Wambui.

MIN NG-CDFC/NKR.WEST/004/005/029/ 2018-2019 PROJECT PROPOSAL PRIORITIZATION, ALLOCATION & SUBMISSION FOR FY 2018-2019

The manager tabled a Circular from board on preparation and submission of Constituency Project Proposal for FY 2018/2019 dated 30th October 2018 to the members.

The manager took the members through the budget ceilings and guidelines for the project proposal preparation and submission. The manager informed members that all constituencies are to work on an equal ceiling of **Kshs. 109,040,875.52** (One hundred & nine million, forty thousand, eight hundred and seventy-five shillings and fifty-two cents).

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Following the circular, the manager guided the committee on the basis of identification of project proposal. The NG-CDF committee to use the list of projects identified from the public forum which was conducted previous year. The NG-CDFC members discussed on the criteria to award funds to the project for the financial year under review.

The manager informed members to follow the guidelines to the later and ensure the CDFC align the project proposal with the government development policy as outlined in the Big Four Agenda and vision 2030.

Eligible projects were also emphasized as per section 24 of the NG-CDF Act as amended in 2016. Eligible projects are projects falling within the functions of the national government under the constitution and must be community based to cover a cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area. Members agreed to fund projects such as schools, security projects, road projects following within national government mandate.

The issue of co-funding was mentioned by the manager but the members noted that there was no project which needed co-funding this financial year. Members in case the co-funding arises the members will notify the Board through writing for approval.

The manager informed the members that the issue of Ongoing project was very key in this year project proposal and submission. The issue was discussed at length. Member agreed to give priority to all ongoing projects, since it is a presidential directive. It was also agreed to ensure the projects are funded with funds which can complete the project or ensure the project is usable to avoid wastage of public funds.

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It was reported that members have to adhere to statutory ceilings as provided for in the guideline to avoid under budgeting or over budgeting in the submission of projects.

The members deliberated on bursary ceiling bearing in mind allocation for bursary within the constituency is not less than 25% of the funds allocated to a constituency for bursaries and should not exceed 35% of the total allocated to the constituency in a particular financial year. Members agreed to have the bursary set at 25% of the funds allocated to the constituency. The members were informed that the total amount for bursary kitty is Kshs 27,260,218.88. It was noted that funds for development are needed to complete the ongoing projects.

After deliberation members agreed to allocate the following to bursary to cater for needy and deserving students as follows: -
