

Background About CDF

The National Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was established under the CDF Act 2003. The primary objective was to address poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual Government Revenue for development purpose at the grassroots Level.

The Constituencies Development Fund (Amendment) Act of 2007 introduced key changes to the management of the fund. Key highlights of the 2007 amendment include replacement of one of the top management structure i.e the National Management Committee with the CDF Board, and the transformation of the management from committee under the ministry of finance to state Corporation under the ministry of state for Planning, National Development and vision 2030. The CDF Act 2003 was then repealed in 2013 to realign it to the constitution that had been promulgated in 2010. The high court declared the CDF Act 2013 unconstitutional in 2014. The NG-CDF Act 2015 was enacted in December 2015 and NG-CDF Regulations 2016, enacted in March 2016.

The funds allocation is now equivalent to minimum of 2.5% percent of the National share of the total government ordinary revenue.

In distributing the funds to the constituencies 5% is allocated to the NG-CDF Board and 5% of the balance is allocated for a emergency cases in the constituencies and the balance is divided equally among the 290 constituencies in the country.

At the constituency level the funds are allocated as follows:

- Education Bursary Scheme and Social Security programs not more than 35%
- Emergency reserve -5%
- Office Administration and recurrent Expenditure -6%
- Monitoring, Evaluation and Capacity Building -3%
- Sports Activities not more than -2%
- Environmental Activities not more than -2%

The Fund is managed through a 4 tier structure as follows:

- National Assembly Constituencies Select Committee(NACSC)
- National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board(NG-CDFB)
- National Government Constituency Development Fund Committee(NG-CDFC)
- Project management Committee(PMC)

0.1 About Likuyani constituency

Likuyani Constituency was created prior to the general election of 2013 having been annexed from the former giant Lugari Constituency. It is located in Kakamega County and comprises Five Wards namely, Sinoko, Nzoia, Likuyani, Sango and Kongoni. The Sub County Head Quarters is located at Kongoni Market.

The constituency borders with Kiminini Constituency of Trans Nzoia County in the North, Tongareni Constituency of Bungoma County in the West, Soy and Turbo Constituencies of Uasin Gishu County in the East and Lugari Constituency of Kakamega County in the South.

There is high demand for improvement of infrastructure in most of the educational institutions and in addition there are so many new primary and Secondary Institutions. This has resulted into thinly spreading of the funds allocated to provide basic learning infrastructure throughout the constituency to avoid Public outcry. We believe after ten years most of these institutions will have achieved the required facilities. Note that, the NG-CDF Funds have been withdrawn from the projects that are under the county Government Functions such as ongoing construction of bridges and river crossings. The Committee therefore is making arrangements to hand over these projects to the County Government of Kakamega with a view of completing them. We are happy to note that all health facilities under construction have been fully completed and handed over to the County Government for use.
