INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The NG-CDF Act 2015 stipulates in part % section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall within the first year of the commencement of a new parliament and at least once every two years thereafter convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The enactment of the NG-CDF in 2003 has significantly changed development dynamics at community level such that the constituency has increasingly become an important unit of engagement in development projects in Kenya. Within this initiative, citizens ought to not only exercise their civic rights within this jurisdiction, but also to engage more and more in planning, implementation of projects and programs as well as in monitoring and evaluation.

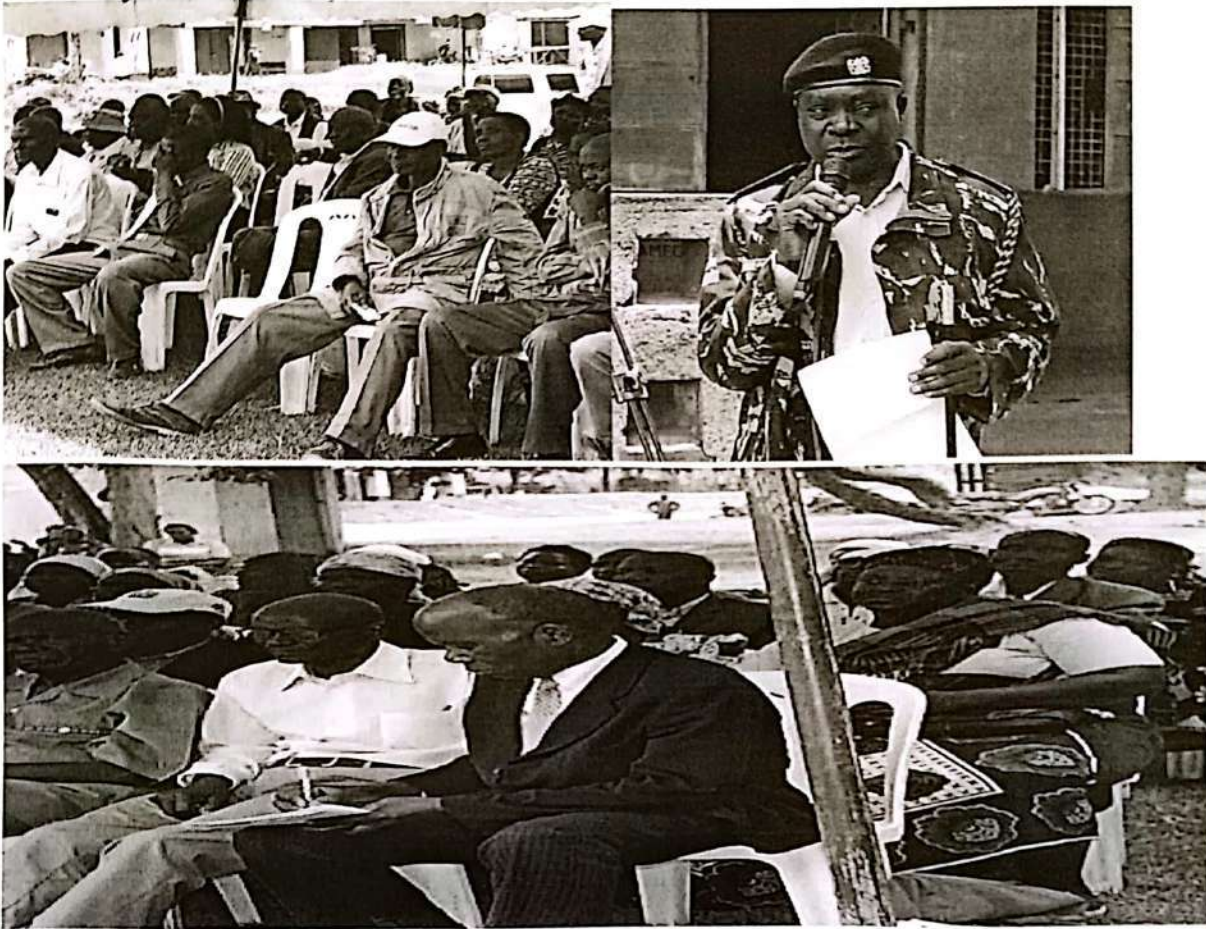

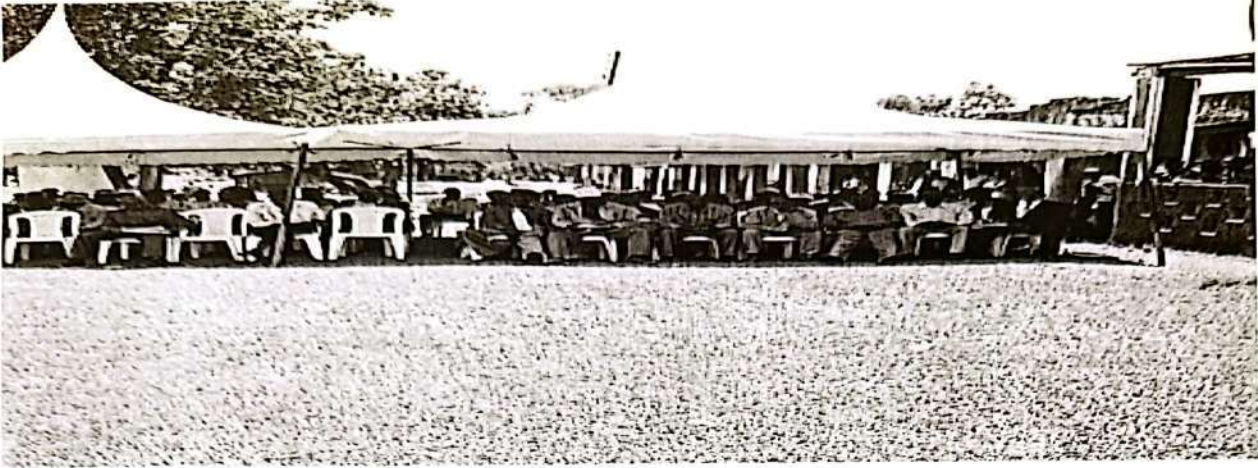

CHALLENGES IN PROJECT IMPLIMENTATION

PRELIMINARIES

The chief called the meeting to order and a word of prayer said by Ng-CDFC Chairman. later introduced members of the team from the NG-CDF Office.

AREA CHIEF

The area chief thanked NG-CDFC team for ensuring inclusivity and public participation in the implementation of NG-CDF Funded projects.

FAM

The FAM reminded the public that the overall aim of NG-CDF Fund was to avert escalation of chronic poverty and not to enrich a few people through the funded projects. He emphasized the need for active public participation for all the projects in

the ward. This he said would ensure project ownership and acceptability and ultimately sustainability of the funded projects.

The FAM equally informed members that NG-CDF offers equal opportunities for all interested parties and that women, youths and people with special interest should not hesitate to apply for jobs earmarked for implementation. In the same breath he encouraged the PMCs to tap local knowledge and resources before resorting to outsourcing.

He urged members to prioritize ongoing projects before identifying new projects for possible funding.

NG-CDFC CHAIRPERSON

The NG-CDF Chairperson thanked members of the public for turning out in large numbers and noted that they have taken part in an important chapter in harnessing conflicting development interests in the constituency. He emphasized on the need for inclusivity in identification, funding, implementation and monitoring of NG-CDF funded projects.

He urged members to identify projects that are tangential to the constituency's strategic plan 2023-2027.

The chairman CDFC informed the meeting that in support of Education, NG-CDF allocates between 25% and 35% of the total allocation towards bursary to support the needy and clever children in the constituency, and urged the parents, guardians to get the forms at chief's offices and the CDF office which are given free without discrimination. He also reminded the parents and guardians to attach all the documents required to avoid cheque replacements which has become a big issue in the office because of wrong names, admission numbers, wrong institution etc.

He said that all orphans and needy cases are getting almost full sponsorship or 80 -90% sponsorship and therefore encourage all the orphans not give up in pursuing their education but instead approach the Chiefs office or NG-CDF office for assistance, he also that all the pupils in public schools Mocks and CATs are being funded by CDF and no students should be at home because of examinations fees.

The chairman CDFC also informed the institutions that trees were planted from environmental kitty to nature them well and those that had not received they will receive them in this financial year, he noted that by planting trees and conservation of the environment it will aid in mitigation of climate change such as drought. He finished by thanking all the stakeholders

who joined up the NG-CDF office during environmental days to make the sites the way they are.

The FAM manager read through a list of all ongoing projects in the ward to the members. He equally read to the general public the stipulation as outlined in the NG-CDF Act regarding the nature of projects to be funded by NG-CDF. After thorough deliberations and discussions, the following projects were earmarked for funding in the FY 2024/25.

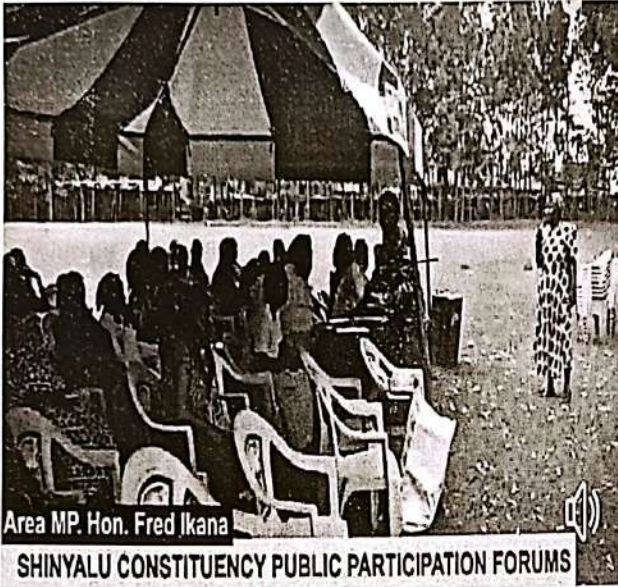

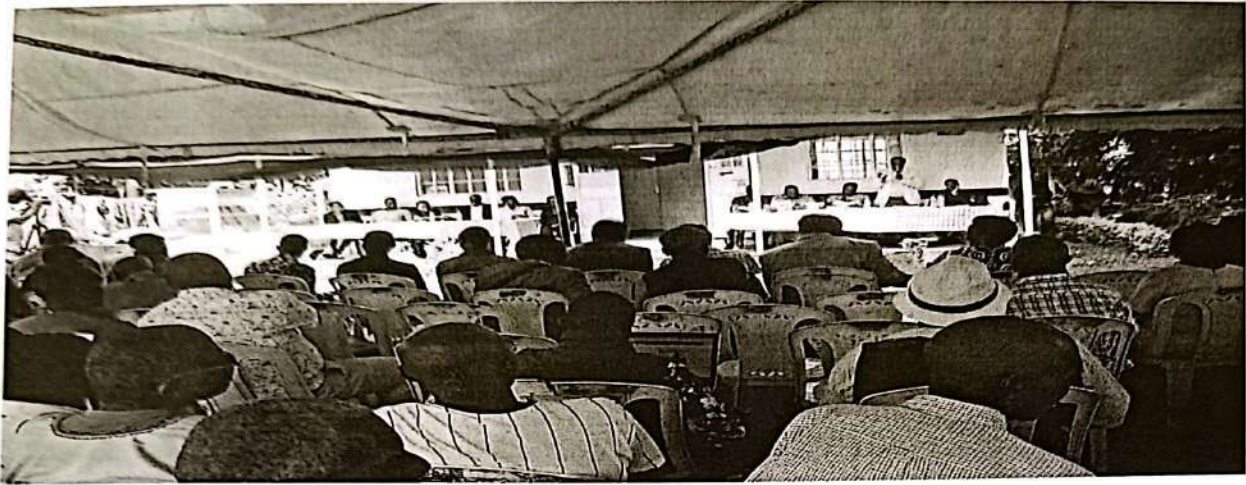
