

MIN: NG-CDFC/TONG/1/01/2023: PRELIMINARIES

The chairman thanked the committee members for arriving on time and asked Mrs. Linety Musundi to open the meeting with a word of prayer. The meeting started at 9.00 am.

MIN: NG-CDFC/TONG/2/01/2023: READING OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES AND MATTERS ARISING

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by Mrs. Linety Musundi, confirmed by Antony Khisa and seconded by Mrs. Florence Afandi.

MATTERS ARISING

The committee unanimously agreed that the issues discussed in the minutes were still pending and others ongoing and shall be discussed in the next meeting.

MIN: NG-CDFC/TONG/3/01/2023: REALLOCATION OF FUNDS

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The Fund account manager brought the issue of Tongaren KMTC receiving over and above the amount of money budgeted for to the attention of the NG-CDFC. He stated that the KMTC Tongaren has spent 19,016857.80 against 15,000,000 budgeted for the renovation of classrooms and hostels. He further informed the committee to request for re-allocation at the NG-CDF Board and hence the Kshs.15, 000,000 meant for renovation. Kshs. 8,200,000 was used to renovate classrooms and hostels and Kshs. 6,700,000 was used to erect ICT and library block without approval from the board. In addition the total amount paid to the contractor for the renovations and erection of ICT and library block was Kshs. 19,016,857.80 which is above the Kshs. 15,000,000 that was budgeted for

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renovation. The excess amount of Kshs. 4,016,857.80 affected some project and the project affected in this case is S.A Sirakaru see school. The FAM explained to the committee that after verification of the available records, it has been established that S.A Sirakaru see school project of purchasing a 51 seater school bus had its funds used to pay for contractual works at KMTC Tongaren to a tune of Kshs. 4,016,857.80.

He therefore requested the committee to re-allocate the said amount from S.A Sirakaru see school to KMTC Tongaren so that the deficit amount for S.A Sirakaru see school can be included in the proposal for financial year 2022/2023.

After a lengthy deliberation, the committee resolved to re-allocate the kshs. 4,016,857.80 from S.A Sirakaru sec school to KMTC Tongaren and agreed to include in the proposal Kshs. 4,016,857.80 for S.A Sirakaru sec school for the purchase of 51 seater school bus as additional funding.

MIN: NG-CDFC/TONG/4/01/2023: STATUS OF ONGOING TONGAREN PROJECTS

The FAM informed the committee members on the status of the ongoing projects,

He stated that specifically on KMTC Tongaren the project is ongoing and the contractor is at the site. He also confirmed to the committee members that the project has kshs. 9,000,000 pending at the NG-CDF Board and together with the previous committee members, submitted to the board reports based on the recommendation given by it to facilitate the release of the funds.

The chairman on his part wondered why it had taken so long for the funds to be released and yet the financial year was closing to an end.

The FAM informed that efforts had been put in place to ensure that the funds are released.

After a lengthy discussion on the matter, the committee resolved that no more allocation will be considered for the KMTC Tongaren Project until the funds pending at the board are released. The committee also resolved that upon the release of the pending funds at the NG-CDF Board, the committee will prioritize the KMTC Tongaren project in the next financial year 2023/2024. The chairman stressed that the committee will not continue allocating funds to the project yet there are pending issues which need to be addressed first and promised that the committee will consider all other ongoing projects as presented by the FAM except for the KMTC Tongaren which has pending issues at the board.

MIN: NG-CDFC/TONG/5/01/2023: IMPLEMENTATION OF HIGH IMPACT AND BEST PRACTICE PROJECTS

MIN: NG-CDFC/TONG/6/01/2023: BURSARY ALLOCATION

The Chairman NG-CDF Tongaren raised the issue of bursary saying that the 35% allocation of bursary to needy students is not enough considering the huge number of needy students that applied for bursaries in the concluded bursary application drive. He said a total of over 30,000 students applied for bursaries and that vetting process is ongoing and it is very clear that if not half of the students are needy, atleast 40% of the total applicants are needy.

He then emphasized of NG-CDF Tongaren to focus on increasing the limit to atleast 40% or 45% of the total allocation.

The FAM on the other hand advised the committee that the additional allocation to the bursary scheme, education days and other teaching and learning related activities must be justified through a minuted resolution of the committee. He further advised the committee to liaise with the chairman bursary committee on the issue.

After a lengthy discussion on the matter, the NG-CDF committee resolved to increase bursary allocation to Ksh 63,000,000 which is 42% of the total allocation to cater for the increased number of needy students considering that Tongaren Constituency harbors two sub-counties Tongaren Sub-county and

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Bungoma North sub-county. The additional allocation will also assist in funding education days and other teaching and learning related activities.

MIN: NG-CDFC/TONG/5/01/2023: ENVIRONMENT PROJECT

The chairman of the NGCDFC Tongaren informed the committee to deliberate on projects touching on environment. He stated that the constituency through the office of MNA Tongaren Constituency has established environment committee which will assist on matters environment within the constituency. He informed the members that six schools have expressed interest in purchasing and delivering of tree seedlings as well as planting the through the constituency environment committee. The schools will assist in generation purchase and distribution of seedlings to other schools in the constituency. The schools that have shown interest have stressed that they have capacity and enough land and manpower to accommodate over 20,000 tree seedlings. He then adviced the committee to assist in facilitating the six school in order to produce seedlings that will make Tongaren Constituency green again.

After a lengthy deliberations, the committee resolved to allocate Ksh 350,000 for the purchase or production, delivery and planting of over 15,000 tree seedling per school.

The NGCDFC members interrogated the ward report obtained from the concluded public participation and approved the following project to be included in the 2022/2023 project proposal. 



1.0 Background Information on NGCDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is established under Section 4 of the NG-CDF Act 2015 as amended in 2016, with an objective of addressing poverty and regional development imbalances by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the National Government share of annual revenue as divided by the annual Division of Revenue Act enacted pursuant to Article 218 of the Constitution. The funds are geared towards community driven development projects in every constituency identified and implemented at grassroots level.

The Fund is managed by the NG-CDF Board, which is a Body Corporate established pursuant to Sections 14, 15 and 16 of Act. At the constituency level, the day to day management of the Fund is vested on the National Government Constituency Development Fund Committees that are in place in each of the 290 constituencies countrywide.

The main mandate of NG-CDF Board is to consider project proposals submitted from various constituencies in accordance with the Act, approve for funding those projects proposals that are consistent with the Act and send funds to the respective constituency fund account of the approved projects.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION OF THE CONSTITUENCY

Tongaren Constituency is an electoral constituency in Kenya. It is one of the nine constituencies in Bungoma County. It covers an area of 378.30 km². It is bordered by Trans Nzoia County (Kiminini Constituency) to the East, Kakamega county (Lagari Constituency) to the South, Saboti constituency to the North, Webuye East Constituency to the West and Kimilili Constituency.

Politically, the Tongaren Constituency comprises of six electoral wards as listed below.


