MIN1/12/01/2023 PRAYER

The chairperson called the meeting to order at 10:05am. The word of prayer was offered by Rose Nakhumicha. Self-introduction was done.

MIN2/12/01/2023 READING & CONFIRMATION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES AND MATTERS ARISING

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The secretary read through the previous minutes which was proposed Rose Akisa and seconded by Rose kapchanga, to be a true record of the deliberations.

Matters arising: -The fund account manager reported that the signatories were changed and they were now operational.

MIN 3/12/01/2023 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION REPORT

The chairperson welcomed the fund account manager to take the members through the public participation. The fund account manager thanked members for arriving early for the meeting and congratulated them for the work well done during the hectic ward meetings. Members were so delighted and embraced the process. Mrs Janerose Ekirapa said that the process was so interactive and on behalf of the committee, she appreciates. Mr.samuel sitati said that there was a mix up in typing of the projects as some of the projects for kapkateny location are typed in Kamuneru location. He requested for a correction to be made. The Fund Account Manager took the members through the report, they unanimously agreed that the report reflects all the deliberations from the field.

MIN 4/12/01/2023 PROJECT PROPOSAL

The chairperson welcomed members to the agenda. He told members that time was not on their side and they need to work with speed so that the proposals are forwarded to the board and funded before schools open, as most of the students relied on NG-CDF bursaries. He welcomed the fund account manager to brief members. The fund account manager informed members that the board had allocated ksh. 153,432,774, out of which ksh1,472,600 was AIA through disposal of moto vehicles and sale of tender. She took members through a circular from the board and explained to them the requisites of project proposal. Members went through the ward report, discussed it at length and resolved as follows: -

- Since all the on-going projects had sufficient funds and most of them were complete as at the time of the project proposal, they will not be included in the financial year's proposal.
- Members were concerned that there were areas that were non- accessible, had loose loamy soil, unstable ground and the natural poor terrain of the constituency. They tasked the fund account manager to write to public works for bills of quantities to justify the expenditure of ksh 2,000,000 Per class on some project, and different amounts on other projects.
- The money received of kshs.1,472,600 from AIA through sale of vehicles and sale of tender to do grading and gravelling of Kapkateny market - Kapkateny police station.
- Members unanimously resolved that the projects be funded based on the priorities from the public participation. The projects can be summarized as follows: -

About NG-CDF
