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1.0 Introduction or Background

This report gives an overview of Rarieda Constituency in the context of National Government Constituency Development Fund.

It talks about NG- CDF in general and Rarieda National Government Constituency Development Fund in particular. The report also highlights the projects funded in the last financial year 2018/2019 and further analyses the same per sector, ward, number of completed projects, number of ongoing projects, Bursary allocations and analysis per ward and the total number of beneficiaries.

The report also focuses on ward stakeholders meetings for projects identification for the financial year 2018/2019 in terms of when the meetings were conducted, attendant, projects priorities from the wards and challenges facing implementation of NG-CDF projects in Rarieda Constituency.

1.1 About NG-CDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was established under the CDF Act 2003 amended in 2007, 2013 and 2015. The primary objective was to address Poverty Alleviation by dedicating at least 2.5% of annual ordinary Government revenue for development purposes at the grassroots level.

The Constituencies Development Fund (Amendment) Act of 2007 introduced key changes to the management of the Fund. Key Highlights of the 2007 Amendment included replacement of one of the top management Structure, the National Management committee with the CDF Board; and transformation of the Management from a committee under the Ministry of Finance to a State Corporation under the Ministry of State for Planning, National Development and Vision 2030

1.2 About Rarieda Constituency

Rarieda is one of the sub counties in Nyanza province. It was initially a district having been carved out of Bondo in 2007. It covers a total area of 644 sq.km of which 399.6 or 62% is land surface while the remaining 244.4 sq. or 38% is covered by Lake Victoria waters. It borders Siaya and Bondo sub counties to the Northwest; Kisumu West to the East; and Rachuonyo, Homabay and Mbita across the lake. To the West it shares a boundary with the Republic of Uganda. It lies on the latitude $0^{\circ} 26'$ to $0^{\circ} 30'$ and longitude $34^{\circ} 10' E$ to $34^{\circ} 35' E$.

This constituency has the largest portion of the waters of Lake Victoria of Lake Victoria running all the way from its west boundary with Bondo to east where it borders Seme constituencies respectively. It is also the home to some eight seasonal rivers as well thirty dams. The area is fairly flat with a few scattered hills, the main ones being Rambugu in Rarieda and Naya in Madiany. A few lowlands such as Uyoma plains also exist. The altitude of the constituency ranges from 1,140 metres to 1,350 metres above sea level

Politically and administratively the constituency is one of the 6 sub-counties that together make up the Siaya County. Administratively, the constituency is made of two divisions (Rarieda and Madiany), and five

electoral wards East Asembo, West Asembo, North Uyoma, South Uyoma and West Uyoma. In total it has 23 sub locations. Table 1 below illustrates the number of sub locations in each of the constituency's electoral and administrative wards.

1.1.1 When and Venue of the meeting

The people who graced the occasion were Chiefs, Assistant Chiefs, Sub location, ward Development Committee members, NG-CDFC members, Secondary Schools Principals and Primary schools heads from the ward, stakeholders and general public from the ward.

1.1.3 Comments by DDC/Chief/Assistant/MP/MCA

The Chiefs welcomed and thanked all the stakeholders who attended the meeting and encouraged all the ward members to participate in such forums even in future so that projects implemented by NG-CDF can reflect their felt needs from the ground.

1.1.4 Comments by FAM on the nature of projects in respect to NG-CDF Act

The FAM informed the members present that such forums are a requirement of the NG-CDF Act for the locals to identify the projects themselves. He further informed the stakeholders that the projects currently being funded by NG-CDF are those projects which are community based and are falling under the national government functions in the new constitution like education, security, environment, sports and bursary for students. FAM further informed those present that NG-CDFC no longer fund projects in some sectors they used to fund before for example health, water and roads. He also told them that as a committee they are aware that there are some health projects which were started by NG-CDFC and not completed but can no longer be funded by NG-CDF when the new act came into place in 2015. The problem is already being addressed by the NG-CDFC board because it is affecting all the 290 constituencies in the country.

The Chairman also encouraged the people present to contribute freely to the forum and also encouraged all the bright and needy students to apply for bursary when the time comes. He also told those present the NG-CDFC will also identify some public institutions where trees can be planted as part of environmental protection projects.
