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1.0 INTRODUCTION

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from. Thereafter, the list of proposed constituency based projects to be covered under this Act shall be submitted by NG-CDFC to the Board.

Public participation is the process that directly engages the concerned stakeholders in decision-making and gives full consideration to public input in making that decision.

Public's engagement is a vital part of many projects and the benefits of it are well documented, such as better outcomes for all stakeholders, community ownership and lower project costs. When the public is involved in a project, they feel motivated to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and have ownership of the projects and the decision making process, which is key to a successful project outcome and their sustainability.

Effective public engagement is about recognising that involving the public in a project is no longer about information dissemination and telling the people what is being done, but is a two-way information sharing tool. The more views gathered in the process of making a decision, the more likely the final product will meet the most needs and address the most concerns possible.

In summary stakeholders participation is important since:

- Providing information helps them understand the issues, options, and solutions available for the projects
- Consulting with the public aids in obtaining their feedback on alternatives or decisions
- Involving the public to ensures their concerns are considered throughout the decision process, particularly in the development of decision criteria, options and preferred solutions that are workable, efficient and sustainable .

1.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015 as amended in 2022. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of National Treasury & Economic Planning

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

1.2 About Kabondo Kasipul NG-CDF

Kabondo Kasipul lies within longitudes 34.85 North, 0.44 degrees East and latitudes 0° 20' South and 0° 50' South. It is bordered by seven (7) constituencies namely; Sigowet/Soin to the East, North Mugirango and West Mugirango to the South East, Kitutu Chache North to the South, Kasipul to the West, Karachuonyo to North West, and Nyakach to the North. The Constituency covers a total area of 249.80 km².

Kabondo Kasipul Constituency has four wards namely: Kakelo Kokwanyo, Kojwach, Kabondo West, and Kabondo East.

The eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF as stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF Act, 2015 as amended in 2022 as those that are in:

- Respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution
- Must be community based to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area.

The Ineligible Projects Include:

- Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities
- Projects supporting political bodies or political activities
- Recurrent costs of a completed projects
- Personal awards
- Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya

3.2.2 PRELIMINARIES

At 10: 00 AM the area NG-CDFC chairperson called the meeting to order. A volunteer said the opening prayers before the area chief took over and led in the introduction session.

3.2.3 COMMENTS BY THE AREA CHIEFS

The three chiefs from these locations attended the meeting in earnest, and unanimously appreciated the NG-CDF for giving the locals a public participation forum aimed at collecting feedback on proposed projects that they would like the NG-CDF to implement in Kakelo Kokwanyo.

3.2.4 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRPERSON

The Chairperson expressed gratitude to the constituents for attending the meeting, noted the importance of this meeting and urged the NG-CDFC to convene such public participation fora in all the four wards across the constituency to discuss development issues and projects in the community. He further explained the need to discuss the priorities areas in every location to meet the needs of the constituents.

3.2.5 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

He appreciated the participants for their attendance and encouraged them to actively participate in the deliberations, since they are the users of public projects being implemented in their areas of jurisdiction. He called upon members to exercise sobriety in their proposals and root for projects that are fundable within the NG-CDF framework.

He thanked the attendees for their active participation and implored them to expeditiously participate in the discussions, as they are beneficiaries of public projects implemented in their localities. He urged members to show moderation in their proposals and champion for projects that fall within the mandate of the NG-CDF.

3.2.6 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

To begin with, the Fund Account Manager explained to the attendees the nature of projects that merit for funding by the NG-CDF as those that are community based. This ensures that the inhabitants of a wider geographical area rip the benefits accruing from these projects implemented by the fund.

Additionally, to enlighten the gathering, he pointed out the ineligible projects not fundable by the NG-CDF which include: Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities, projects supporting political bodies or political activities, recurrent costs of a completed projects, personal projects, private projects and projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others

3.2.7 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

The Member of Parliament acknowledged the need to hold public participation meetings during the implementation of different projects across the constituency.

She called upon the Project Management Committees and other stakeholders to ensure accountability of funds disbursed in order to enhance value for money. She stressed on the need for equity in projects distribution to promote availability of basic services across the constituency.

3.2.9 CHALLENGES

Members mentioned about the NG-CDF Act's limitation of projects fundable and wished that the Act should be revised to enable funding of projects falling under the roads, health and agricultural sectors as before, however the area member of national assembly advised them to channel the projects to the area member of county assembly who was also present in the meeting, since the projects are under the county government's domain.

3.2.10 WAY FORWARD

The meeting therefore urged the area Member of County Assembly to also hold consultative meetings with all the stakeholders in order to get proposals of projects falling under county government functions.

The meeting was held on Thursday the 29th December, 2022, at Kojwach Chief's camp compound at 1400 hours

3.3.2 PRELIMINARIES

Kabondo Kasipul Constituency NG-CDFC chairperson declared the meeting open at 2:00pm by welcoming members. He then requested one of the members to offer the opening prayer. Thereafter, the chairman invited the area chiefs to welcome members. The chiefs thanked the NG-CDFC for giving the constituents an avenue where they give their inputs on priority projects they wish to be funded by NG-CDF, the chiefs advocated for equity in the allocation and transparency in projects implementation.

3.3.3 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

Educating the public on the type of projects fundable by the NG-CDF, the fund account manager, explained that only community-based projects that meet the society's needs and wellbeing in long term basis will be implemented. Also, he highlighted the nature of projects that are ineligible for funding.

Further, he stated that co-founding is permitted when a project can be funded jointly with a neighboring constituency or from avenues other than the Fund as long as the other financiers or donors of that project are in agreement, and that the part funding for the project obtained is in line with the NG-CDF Act 2015 must go to a defined unit or any phase of the project in order to ensure that the specific portion defined in the allocation is completed with the funds set aside under this Act.

3.3.4 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

The DCC informed the members about different funds available in the devolved units in line with the constitution, and urged all the partners to join hands not only during the planning but also the implementation of the agreed upon projects to ensure equity. Through the Member of the County Assembly, he challenged the county government to organize similar public participation forums. He added that this will give the public an opportunity to participate and own the projects implemented in their locality.

3.3.5 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

She thanked the members present for their attendance and noted that it is a sign of patriotic citizenry. She urged them to participate freely and propose projects within the set legal frameworks that will impact positively to their livelihood.

She further informed the members that all the projects proposed cannot be implemented at once in one financial year, hence the need of setting priorities.

She acknowledged the pivotal role played by the members who attended the public participation forum. The Member of Parliament implored the attendees to contribute

voluntarily and objectively as they give proposals on the NG-CDF fundable projects that will have huge impacts on their lives.

3.3.7 CHALLENGES

It was noted that there is overreliance on NG-CDF funds by the community and inadequate knowledge on projects fundable by the county government

Some members sought to know the fate of the Constituency Development Fund following the Supreme Court declaration on the unconstitutionality and illegality of the Fund.

3.3.8 WAY FORWARD

The Area Member of Parliament assured the members that the government will continue to deliver on its mandate through the Fund once the stalemate is resolved.

3.4.2 PRELIMINARIES / COMMENTS BY THE AREA CHIEF

The host, Rachuonyo East Sub County Assistant County Commissioner, requested one of the members to lead in the opening prayer. Consequently, he officially welcomed all the members to the meeting and appreciated them for devoting time to attend the public participation forum. He then requested the Ward Development committee members to introduce themselves before welcoming the NG-CDF chairperson to carry on with the business of the day.

3.4.3 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRPERSON

Acknowledging the critical role played by NG-CDF in steering development at the grass-root level, the chairperson appreciated the contribution and support of the public in identifying priority areas during the implementation of various projects. He added that the objective of the Fund is to ensure unwavering participation of the public in the achievement of sustainable development.

3.4.4 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

Weighing in on the matter, he added that the objective of NG-CDF is in conformity with the policy paper of Vision 2030. Moreover, he underscored the role of the Fund in the realization

of Kenya’s development projects geared at transforming the nation into a developed country since its concepts are people driven.

Also, he highlighted that public participation and involvement in decision making processes among all the stakeholders are some of the tenets of NG-CDF. He urged the area Member of National Assembly to rally his colleagues in the August House to enact laws aimed at enabling the government to allocate additional resources to infrastructural developments such as roads to improve access.

3.4.5 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF COUNTY ASSEMBLY

The area MCA acknowledged the joint development initiative in the constituency, and implored the members to dutifully work for the improvements of the different aspects of the community. Appreciating the NG-CDF for putting together the forum, he pleaded with the public to give the elected leaders ample time to deliver on their mandate, and that politics should be kept at bay until 2027.

3.4.6 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He quoted section 27 of the NG-CDF Act which states the NG-CDFC chairperson shall, within the first year of the beginning of a new parliament and at least every two years, hold open forum public meetings in each ward across the constituency to discuss development issues in the constituency, and that forum was, therefore, in accordance with the dictates of the law.

Also, he summarily outlined the difference between the projects that are ineligible and those that are eligible for funding by the NG-CDF.

3.4.7 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

She emphasized the noticeable change brought about NG-CDF cannot be watered down in transforming people’s lives in the country. In the academic sector for instance, NG-CDF has implemented various infrastructural development in both primary and secondary schools. As a result, the student enrolment has increased thus offering serene learning environment to the learners.

3.4.9 CHALLENGES

Delay in the disbursement of the Fund which hampers the implementation of proposed projects within a particular fiscal year. In turn, this leads to an increase in project costs and other underlying circumstances.

Untimely award of bursaries, on the other hand, adversely affects the retention of students in the learning institutions as the academic continuity is affected.

3.4.10 WAY FORWARD

NG-CDF Board should ensure that the Fund is disbursed on a timely basis within the financial year to ease the implementation of proposed development projects.

3.5.2 PRELIMINARIES

The area chief of Othoro location called the meeting to order and requested one of the members to lead in the opening prayer. Welcoming members to the meeting, he introduced colleague chiefs and their assistants in the wards and the ward development committee.

3.5.3 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

The chairperson began his remarks by welcoming members to the public participation forum and stated that as has been the practice, the office will organize continuous awareness creation exercises to the public to motivate them to participate in NG-CDF matters.

To ensure financial probity in the implementation of planned projects, the chairperson reiterated that M & E exercise, budget tracking and social audits will continuously be undertaken. He added that this will ensure increased efficacy and efficiency in the projects implemented by NG-CDF.

3.5.4 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

In light of the fact that they would be the ones to inform the NG-CDFC of the projects they would like to see executed in their communities as the first-hand users, he complimented the participants for taking time out of their busy schedules to attend the important exercise.

He requested that the projects be limited to those that were allowed by the NG-CDF Act 2015 and its rules. As the guardians of the projects in their communities in addition to being tax payers, he challenged them to be good stewards of government monies and initiatives.

3.5.5 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He briefed the meeting on the statutory capping set in the NG-CDF Act 2015 which guides the NG-CDFC during project funding and informed the members about the eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF and ineligible projects which are fundable by devolved government. He also emphasized that the NG-CDFC will rank the projects in order of priority in all of the wards following the exercise, with ongoing initiatives taking precedence over potential new projects.

3.5.6 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

She underscored the fact that public involvement in the decision making process during projects identification is key as this helps in addressing the concerns raised early enough. This helps in incorporating the suggestion besides enhancing value for money.

She informed the meeting that the NG-CDF was created with the intention of increasing economic governance, enhancing service delivery, reducing poverty, and eventually spurring growth in the constituency, hence promoting socio-economic development across the board.

3.5.8 CHALLENGES

The majority of rural initiatives in the constituency now use NG-CDF solely as their cure-all, however, due to the restricted allocation, people' needs are not being satisfied as quickly as they would want.


3.5.9 WAY FORWARD

The meeting agreed that financing for continuing devolved projects that NG-CDF had previously supported should be taken into account in order to use them if the county government is putting off finishing them.

3.6 CONCLUSION

- NG-CDF, County government and other development stakeholders should, from time to time, organize joint consultative forum to foster public participation.
- A resolution was reached that all the continuing projects be executed to the end for community's use.
- Project allocations should also be sufficient to enable project completion once it has begun since if completion is postponed, project costs will increase as a result of factors like inflation and wear and tear.
- The ability of Project Management Committees to carry out projects should be continually improved.
- The area Member of national assembly ought to champion and join hands with fellow legislators to advocate for additional funding from the exchequer.
- The public should be informed on the development activities being carried out by all the development partners and the various financing agencies through the holding of ongoing development forums.
