INTRODUCTION

The National Government Constituencies Development Act 2015 stipulates in section 27 (1) that the Chairperson of the Constituency Committee shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

WHY PUBLIC PARTICIPATION?

Public participation is a constitutional requirement specifically; Article 1 that states that sovereign power belongs to the people. Public participation is a structured way of consulting with persons, groups and entities before decisions are made. It is designed to give a voice to the voiceless and cements the concept of agency by the Government, that is, the government becomes an agent of the people.

Public participation is not meant to convey decisions already made, but to generate and confirm decisions. It is not a political process but a non-partisan process that involves the agent going to 'take instruction and direction' from the people.

Public participation is having an open, accountable and structured process where citizens or people or segment of a community can interact, exchange views and influence decision making. It is critical that all stakeholders are involved in the development of projects and not just direct beneficiaries of an initiative.

Rangwe NG CDF committee in compliance with the law gave out notices and followed by having public participation forums in all the four wards in the constituency as from 17th December, 2024 to 20th December, 2024.

About NGCDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established by the Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2003, which was later repealed and replaced with the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2013. This NGCDF Act 2015 (Amended 2016) came into force in February of 2016, after the now repealed CDF Act, 2013 which was declared unconstitutional on 17th February, 2015, but the unconstitutionality was deferred for one year to give the legislature time to amend or pass a new law as well as for the purposes of the transition as there were still contracts being executed.

The primary objective of the Fund is to reduce poverty by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the national government ordinary revenue to all constituencies in Kenya to promote infrastructural development and socio-economic growth.

Specifically, the mandate of the Fund as derived from sec (3) of NG-CDF Act, 2015 is to:

a) Recognize the constituency as a platform for identification, performance and implementation of national government functions;

- b) Facilitate the performance and implementation of national government functions in all parts of the Republic pursuant to Article 6(3) of the Constitution;
- c) Provide for the participation of the people in the determination and implementation of identified national government development projects at the constituency level pursuant to Article 10(2)(a) of the Constitution;
- d) Promote the national values of human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality, human rights, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized pursuant to Article 10 (2) (b) of the Constitution;
- e) Provide for the sustainable development of all parts of the Republic pursuant to Article 10 (2) (d) of the Constitution;
- f) Provide a legislative and policy framework pursuant to Article 21 (2) of the Constitution for the progressive realization of the economic and social rights guaranteed under Article 43 of the Constitution;
- g) Provide mechanisms for the National Assembly to deliberate on and resolve issues of concern to the people as provided for under Article 95 (2) of the Constitution;
- h) provide for a public finance system that promotes an equitable society and in particular expenditure that promotes equitable development of the country by making special provisions for marginalized groups and areas pursuant to Article 201 (b) (iii) of the Constitution;
- i) Authorize withdrawal of money from the Consolidated Fund as provided 'under Article 206 (2) (c) of the Constitution;
- j) Provide mechanisms for the National Assembly to facilitate the involvement of the people in the identification and implementation of projects for funding by the national government at the constituency level; and
- k) Provide for mechanisms for supplementing infrastructure development at the constituency level in matters falling within the functions of the national government at that level in accordance with the Constitution

Eligible Projects Fundable by Rangwe NG-CDF

The eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF as stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF (amendment) Act, 2016 as those that are in:

- Respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution
- Must be community based to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area.

The ineligible projects include:

- o Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities
- Projects supporting political bodies or political activities
- Recurrent costs of completed projects
- Personal awards
- o Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya

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BACKGROUND INFORMATION OF RANGWE CONSTITUENCY

Rangwe Constituency is one of the 8 Constituencies that make Homa Bay County. It has an area of approximately 259.90 Square Kilometers. It comprises of 4 County Assemblies (Wards) namely: Kochia, Kagan, Gem West and Gem East.

The Constituency boarders Karachuonyo to the North, Kasipul, Bomachoge and South Mugirango to the East, Homa Bay Town to the West and Rongo to the South.

According to the 2009 census, the Constituency had a population of 103,966. Of this population, more than 50% are in the range of 5-20 years old. This implies that more resources need to be invested in programs that adequately cater for demands of this group.

Administratively, the Constituency has 3 Divisions that are further divided into six Locations which are further divided into 17 Sub – Locations.

The Constituency Road network can be termed as poor with only about 25% of roads being accessible throughout the year. Most of the roads are dry weather roads under management of KeRRA (Kenya Rural Roads Authority). Rangwe Constituency has 1 (one) class C19 road (Homa Bay - Kendu Bay Road) that cuts through Kochia Ward and 2 (two) C18 roads (Oyugis - Rangwe - Rodi) that cut across East Gem and West Gem Wards and (Oyugis - Omoya - Olare) that passes through Kagan Ward.

The Constituency can be described as water deficient Constituency when it comes to access of to clean safe water which is from safe improved sources. Rangwe has a variety of water sources including both surface and ground water; the Lake Victoria, streams, rivers, dams, machine drilled boreholes, shallow wells and harvested rain water. Despite the availability of potential sources of water, the Constituency continues to face serious water shortage during drought because existing water sources have not been developed to be sustainable through storage and sustainable use. To remedy the above, Rangwe Constituency intends to work with other willing organization and line ministry to improve water sources for safe use in the following areas:

- Kosiga Water Project
- Rangwe Water Project
- Komenya Water Project
- Nyandiwa Water Project.

The Constituency lacks organized urban centers. It, however, has several trading centers with the main ones being Rangwe, Sinema, Randung', Oboke, Ndiru, Onjinyo, Obwanda, Nyawita, Nyangweso, Olare, God Bondo, Omoya and Ohero. Rangwe is set to grow fastest as it hosts the Sub - County Headquarters which is under construction. It is expected to attract good investment based on its closeness to government services and institutions. The growth is further boosted by the construction of Oyugis – Rangwe - Rodi Road and Suneka - Olare Road.

Main economic activities in Rangwe Constituency include:

• Farming: subsistence farming of maize and cassava in Gem and Kagan, Sugarcane in Gem, Pineapples in Kochia and parts of Kagan, Rice in Kochia and parts of Kagan and groundnuts in Kagan and part of Kochia.

• Fishing: In Kochia

It should be noted that there are no major industrial economic activities in Rangwe that can provide direct employment opportunities to the residents. Economic activities productivity in Rangwe has remained poor due to the following diverse causes;

- · Poor fishing methods and gear
- Land fragmentation
- Failure to take up new crops and farming methods
- Poor soil due to exhaustions
- Limited extension services to farmers
- Unpredictable rainfall patterns
- HIV / AIDS high infection rates taking away strong work force
- Poor road networks
- Lighting hinders small scale traders from working late

Security is the basic platform upon which prosperity, stability and growth of Rangwe Constituency is based. It needs to be sound and resilient. Insecurity had been a challenge in major trading centers of Rangwe Constituency necessitating constructing and or improving existing security apparatus in the Constituency.

Challenges experienced are together with issues as political, social, economic, legal and global challenges influence implementation of NG-CDF projects. Other issues include late re-allocations approval and late approval of projects. As at 30th June, 2022, the Board had disbursed whole allocation for the financial year 2021 / 2022. This enabled Rangwe NG-CDF implements its project fully thus constituents enjoyed full benefits.
