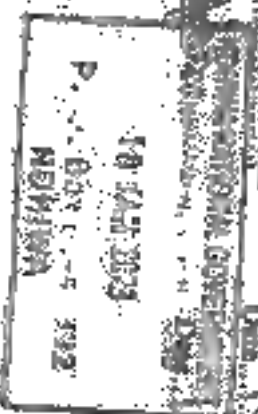

**a. Allocation to Nursery**

The manager informed members of the sub-committee during the previous financial year. It was reported that nursery allocation has never been enough to accommodate all the applicants. The manager informed members that the provided NC-CDF Act 2002 provides that committee members may, with the approval of the Board, allocate additional funds to cater for education nursery schemes and education days and other teaching and learning related activities as provided in section 4B (A) of the Act. The committee therefore resolved to allocate more funds as per the CDF Act to the nursery scheme to cater for the many needy cases in the constituency.

**b. Consideration of High Impact Projects**

Members identified two projects which has greater impact to the constituency, one being was identification of boys' club in school which contributed to enough water to the surrounding communities. On the other hand is purchase of school bus which is also considered has a greater impact to the constituency.

**c. Regional Sporting activities**

The manager informed the community of a new directive by the Board in the issued Circular to consider participating in at least one regional sport tournament. He also informed members that the regional sports

committee come up with a budget of Kshs. 300,000 to be contributed by all the constituencies in Homabay County towards facilitation of Homabay Regional Sports tournament.

#### d. Constituency Oversight Committee budget

The Committee was informed of the new development on a provision of not more than 1% of the constituency allocation towards facilitation of the Constituency Oversight Committee activities in a financial year. The committee upon deliberating on this matter approved Kshs.1,568,327.45 for the Constituency Oversight Committee activities.

#### e. Funding of Strategic Plan

The Fund Account Manager informed members that there was the need to have a new strategic plan as a result of emerging issues that need to be captured in the new strategic plan. Members after a lengthy discussion resolved to have Kshs 2,000,000 to be set aside for the development of new strategic plan in the budget of financial year 2022/2023.

#### f. Constituency Motor vehicle

Members were informed on the status of two (2) Office Land rovers (GKA191X and GKA738N) by the Fund Account Manager. Members after a lengthy discussion resolved to have the two vehicles based on their frequent services which consumes a lot of funds, be donated to other Government Institutions and budget for a new purchase. Members in their previous proposal allocated Kshs 8,900,000 for purchase of Toyota Hilux- Double Cabin.

#### g. Environmental Projects

The committee discussed at the length issues on environmental activities. It was reported that for the last 4 financial years, the committee has been financing planting of trees in schools. The challenge that was recorded on the tree planting programme was the issue of sustainability. The committee resolved to fund 32 primary schools with 200 seedlings each. The committee further suggested that in the future, they should be allowed to use the environmental vote to undertake environmental needs assessment.

#### h. AG-CDF Office

Members were informed on the status of the NCCDF office which was occupied by Ndlovu KAMUC during the period of construction of their Administration block. The members further engaged clerk of

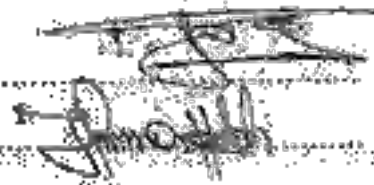

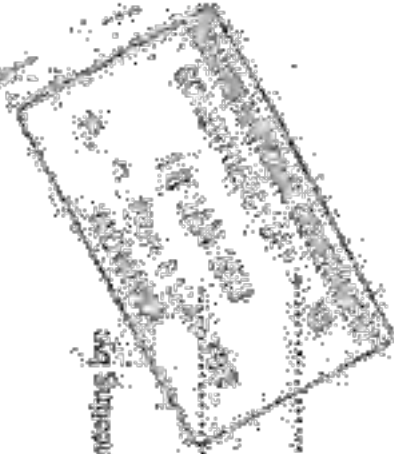

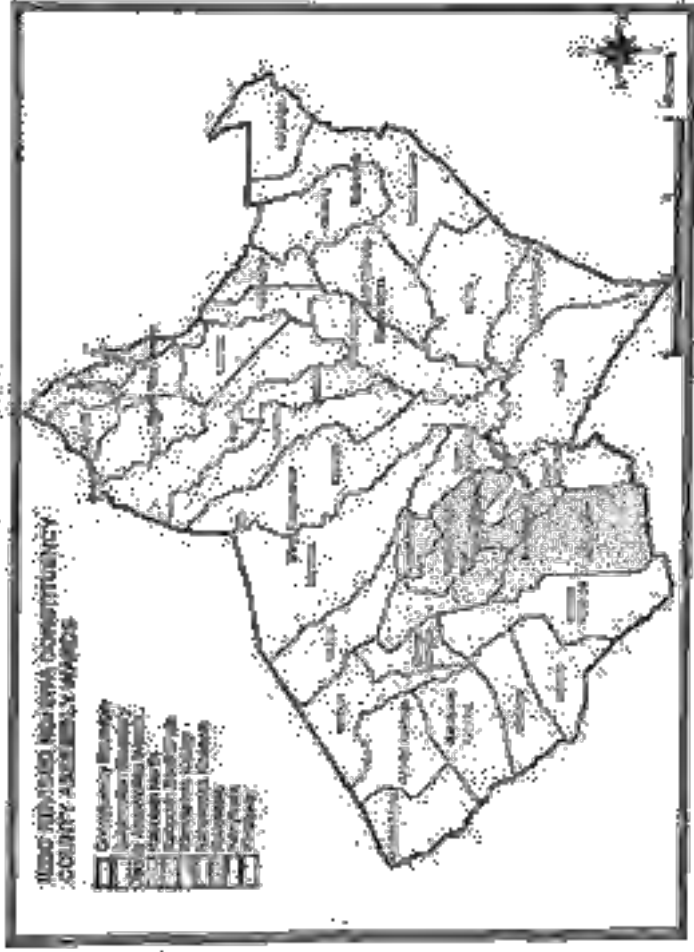

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2013, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act, 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act, 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and enhance equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the pulling up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

## 3.1 BACKGROUND INFORMATION – NDIHIWA CONSTITUENCY

### 3.1.1 Introduction

Ndihiwa Constituency is an electoral constituency in Kenya. It is one of the constituencies in Homa Bay County whose current Member of Parliament is Honorable Martha Karita Ovingo, Ndihiwa Constituency Delegate.

The Mother NC-CDF has received funding from CDF Board for all the previous financial years and the funds have mainly been used in the following areas with percentages varying from year to year depending on the budget ceiling. CDF Board guides and priorities of the wards:

1. Bakery
2. Education
3. Health
4. Sports
5. Environment
6. Roads
7. Vocational Administration

#### 1.1.2 Key Development Challenges in the Constituency related to key function of under NC-CDF Programme and beyond

**Low-literacy levels:** The constituency has low literacy levels at

23.8 per cent. This is as a result of early marriages, female genital mutilation and exploitation of women among other negativities. Other factors include absenteeism by pupils to attend home chores and in some instances shortage of role models. Staffing levels are low with teacher/pupil ratio of 1:88 and 1:22 at the primary and secondary levels respectively. Interventions need to be put in place to fully address both socio-economic and cultural factors affecting education with special interest in girl-child education.

**Inadequate school infrastructure:** Most of the schools (especially secondary) lack adequate learning facilities and equipment. This has greatly affected the quality of education in the constituency which is clearly reflected by the performance in the national examinations. To improve the current education status, concerted efforts by all education stakeholders in the constituency to address both physical infrastructure and learning facilities will be enhanced.

**Environmental Degradation:** Continued charcoal burning, tree cutting, overgrazing and overstocking have led to massive environmental degradation. A proper waste disposal system is lacking in all market centres. This has led to non-degradable waste accumulation in the market centres.

**Insecurity and Clanism:** There have been increased cases of insecurity which manifests itself in form of inter-clan conflicts caused by fighting over resources such as land, water and grazing land.



**Inadequate Water Supply and Sanitation:** The constituency is faced with acute water scarcity with only 40 per cent of the population having access to safe water. Most of the constituency population lives in rural areas and mostly uses unsafe water drawn from the dugwells, borewells, shallow wells and ponds. The average distance to the nearest water point is 57 km. Water treatment has aided in providing water to settlements expected with acute water problems.

**Poor Roads:** The constituency has a poor road network consisting of only earth surface roads. Earths are the most common mode of transport in the constituency despite their poor state. The entire feeder road network is in bad condition. All roads are rendered impassable during rainy season thus curtailing all movements by road within the constituency.

**Inadequate Health Facilities and Services:** Provision of health services is affected by the few health facilities available within the county. The doctor patient ratio is 1: 132,000 which is very low comparing with the national ratio of 1:5,000. There is need for the county government to invest in more doctors. Due to scarcity of the facilities, residents travel long distances to access health services with an average distance to the nearest health facility being 38km. In addition, poor road network leads to many patients opting to forego treatment. There is need, therefore, to put up staff houses and equip more health facilities so that community access healthcare within 10 Km.

**Low Agricultural and Livestock Production:** Low agricultural productivity has been witnessed in the constituency. Lack of access to farm inputs such as fertilizers, improved seed varieties, pesticides, machinery, and water shortage for effective irrigation form the bottlenecks to increased farm productivity. Poor access to markets for local farmers to sell their produce and earn income maintains them in the vicious cycle of poverty. The constituency lacks processing plants for value addition to agricultural and livestock products. The value addition is expected to increase products penetration to the wider markets.

**Food Shortage:** A large percentage of the constituency population (62%) is food poor. This is caused by over reliance on rain fed farming, poverty, lack of modern farming methods and high dependency on relief food. Hence, it, therefore, need to introduce modern farming methods such as green houses and provide sufficient water for irrigation farming.

**Poor Access to Markets:** Due to poor state of the road infrastructure, markets are inaccessible especially during the rainy season. This leads to agricultural and livestock produce not reaching to the markets in time hence huge losses to farmers. Inadequate market information is a big hindrance to market access and also price trends.

The constituency lacks appropriate technology and skills to process and preserve agricultural and dairy products. Lack of market information and skills amongst the farmers and business community has hampered the expansion of the market for products from the constituency. Poor storage facilities affect production with 80 per cent of farmers using traditional storage methods, hence farmers, cooperative societies and associations equipped with poor roads are a hindrance to the marketing process. Livestock farmers are forced to deal with exploitative intermediaries due to the lack of proper marketing strategies and cooperative movement in the constituency. There is need to strengthen farmers' institutions to improve marketing of farm and livestock products.

**Human Wildlife Conflicts:** The constituency lacks protected wildlife conservancy hence increased cases of human-wildlife conflicts exhibited through snake bites, attacks of livestock by hyenas and lions. The common wildlife types are gazelles, gnarles, hyenas, ostrich and lions which are left to move freely. There is need to establish a protected area to avert these conflicts.

**Land Ownership:** All land in the constituency is held in trust by the government hence populace hold no title deeds. This limits farmers' capacity to develop their land for sustainable development. Consequently, this has led to poor land use systems leading to environment degradation. Land adjudication survey and issue of title deeds should be addressed urgently.

### 1.1.3 Eligible Projects Fundable as per NG-CDF Act 2018

The eligible project fundable by NG-CDF is stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF (Amendment) Act 2018 as those that are in:

- **Essence of works and services falling within the function of the National Government under the constitution**
  - **Must be commonly best to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a wide spread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area.**
- 1.1.4 The eligible projects include:**
- **Projects support religious bodies or religious activities.**
  - **Projects supporting political bodies or political activities**
  - **Recurrent costs of completed projects**
  - **Personal awards**
  - **Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others**
  - **Projects addressing derived functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya**

### 1.1.5 Establishment of Ndlovu NG-CDF Committee

The Ndlovu Constituency Development Fund Committee is established under the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act of 2018. The Committee is expected to play the following roles:

- **Allocation of funds to various projects, determining the quantum of installments as without projects in the constituency, taking into account the disbursement received and the requirement of different projects;**
- **Submission of a list of constituency based projects to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board within the stipulated time;**
- **Determination of the allocation of the emergency reserve in accordance with the NG-CDF Act, 2018;**
- **Making appropriate consultations with the relevant Government departments to ensure that cost estimates for the projects are as realistic as possible; and**

- Identifying the constituency projects in order of priority, among other activities.

#### 1.1.6 Implementation of Projects in Ndiwa.

As has been stipulated in NG-CDF Act 2015, the Ndiwa Chairperson of the NG-CDFC, has been convening open forum public meetings in the seven (7) wards of the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and the constituency. Each Ward prepares a list of priority projects and submits to the NG-CDF for deliberations. All the NG-CDF projects are implemented by the project management committee with the assistance of the relevant department of Government officers.

#### 1.1.7 Review of Key Achievements.

Between 2017 and 2022, the Ndiwa Constituency Development Committee disbursed a total of Kshs. 411,266,637 million towards the implementation of various projects in the sector of Education, Security, Environment, Sports and Burury. All the projects were done to completion and currently in use.

To improve on retention rates, a total of Kshs. 100 million was used as burury to assist needy students continue with their education at both secondary and tertiary schools. The constituency allocation for burury has been increasing since 2015/14, from Kshs. 7.6 million to Kshs. 20.5 million in 2016/17, representing 169.7 per cent increase.

#### 1.1.8 Major Lessons learnt

- Bottom-up approach in priority identification enhances project programme ownership.
- If well managed, devolved funds can go a long way in improving accessibility, affordability and availability of services to communities. This would in turn improve the living standards of the constituents.
- The fund has empowered the Ndiwa Community to realize their felt needs in development.
- The fund has accelerated development at the grass-root level; and
- Devolved funds have the capability of easing social burdens e.g. payment of school fees, protection of water wells/springs protection.

#### 2. RATIONALE FOR PUBLIC WARD FORUMS

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 as amended in 2022 provides that the chairperson of the shall within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency. The Committee shall deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn.

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow stakeholders that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the development programmes.

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development programmes in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. The NG-CDF Committee through public participation identifies public concerns and values that will help their develop it, broad consensus on sustainable programmes in the constituency. The chairperson shall therefore ensure adequate consultation with local leaders and shall participate public ward meetings so as to reach as many constituents as possible. The main purpose for the public forum is to:

- Sensitize the community on matters NG-CDF especially on the key mandate and functions applicable to the Ward.
- Give the community opportunity to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The expression and harmonization of the mentioned challenges informs key programmes to be considered for Funding through NG-CDF Programmes in the constituency. For clarity and consultation of the same, NG-CDF Committee undertook public ward forums that was scheduled for 29th November 2022 to 5th December 2022. The exercise was carried out for seven days covering all the seven wards in the constituency namely Kolegi, North Kabwoch, South Kabwoch, Kinyikela, Kanyadolo, Kyabwani and Kooewe as per the notice below
