

# **KITUTU MASABA NG-CDF**

## WARD REPORT

## **2021/2022 FINANCIAL YEAR**

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## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from. There after the list of proposed constituency based projects to be covered under this Act shall be submitted by NG-CDFC to the Board.

Public participation is the process that directly engages the concerned stakeholders in decision-making and gives full consideration to public input in making that decision.

Public's engagement is a vital part of many projects and the benefits of it are well documented, such as better outcomes for all stakeholders, community ownership and lower project costs. When the public is involved in a project, they feel motivated to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and have ownership of the projects and the decision making process, which is key to a successful project outcome and their sustainability.

Effective public engagement is about recognizing that involving the public in a project is no longer about information dissemination and telling the people what is being done, but is a two-way information sharing tool. The more views gathered in the process of making a decision, the more likely the final product will meet the most needs and address the most concerns possible.

In summary stakeholders' participation is important since:

- Providing information helps them understand the issues, options, and solutions available for the projects
- · Consulting with the public aids in obtaining their feedback on alternatives or decisions
- Involving the public to ensures their concerns are considered throughout the decision process, particularly in the development of decision criteria, options and preferred solutions that are workable, efficient and sustainable.

#### 1.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013.

In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Development Planning

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The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

#### 1.2 ABOUT KITUTU MASABA NG-CDF

Kitutu Masaba Constituency is in a rural setup with a two sub counties headed in Keroka for Masaba North sub county and Manga for manga sub county.

Kitutu Masaba Constituency has Six wards, namely Manga Ward, Magombo Ward, Kemera Ward Gesima Ward, Rigoma Ward and Gachuba Ward.

The constituency is located in Tombe Market and boarders 6 constituencies, namely Nyaribari Chache, Nyaribari Masaba, Borabu, West Mugirango, Kitutu Chache South and Kitutu Chache North.

#### Eligible Projects Fundable by Kitutu Masaba NG-CDF

The eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF as stipulated in section 24 of the NG-CDF (Amendment) Act, 2016 as those that are in:

- Respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution
- Must be community based to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area.

#### The Ineligible Projects Include:

- Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities
- Projects supporting political bodies or political activities
- Recurrent costs of a completed projects
- Personal awards
- Projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others
- Projects addressing devolved functions as outlined in the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya

#### **3.2.2 PRELIMINARIES**

The area NG-CDFC chairman called the meeting to order the meeting and requested one volunteer to lead in opening prayers, thereafter he called upon the area chief to steer the introduction session.

### 3.2.3 COMMENTS BY THE AREA CHIEFS

The meeting was attended by the three chiefs from Nyangena Location, Irianyi Location and Kiangoso Locations and Motembe Locations that form the Kemera ward to give a brief about the understanding and importance of the NGCDF in their areas of jurisdiction. The chiefs expressed their satisfaction to the NG-CDF committee for organising a forum where members of the public have an opportunity to suggest the projects that they would like NG-CDF to undertake within their areas.

#### 3.2.4 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

Chairman thanked those present for sparing time out of their busy schedules to attend the meeting, he highlighted the importance of the meeting and the need for NG-CDFC to convene open forum public meetings at in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters and project priorities in the ward and the constituency, which is also in line with the provisions of the constitution


#### 3.2.5 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

He acknowledged the participants' presence and encouraged them to participate freely in the deliberations, since they are the end consumers of public projects being implemented in their localities. He encouraged the community and relevant stakeholders to be good stewards of the NG-CDF resources in order to enhance development initiatives in their areas.

#### 3.2.6 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

Firstly, The fund account manager highlighted to the gathering the importance of the meeting and the regulatory provisions, he then briefed members on the nature of eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF as those that are community based, so as to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area, and those projects in respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution

Secondly, he noted the ineligible projects not fundable by the NG-CDF which include: Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities, projects supporting political bodies or political activities, recurrent costs of a completed projects, personal projects, private projects and projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others



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## 3.2.7 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

He thanked the members for their presence in the meeting. He highlighted on the need public participation in development and impressed upon the Project Management Committees and other stakeholders to ensure accountability of funds disbursed in order to uphold value for money. He further informed the members that all the projects proposed cannot be implemented at once in one financial year, hence the need of setting priorities.

#### 3.2.9 CHALLENGES

Members mentioned restrictive nature of projects fundable under the National Government functions and with that the Act should be reviewed to enable funding of projects falling under sectors like the roads, health and agricultural sectors as before, since NG-CDF is the most immediate public fund under the mandate of the public in terms of projects identification, the area member of national assembly advised them to channel the projects outside NG-CDF's mandate to the area member of

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county assembly who was also present in the meeting, since the projects are under the county government's domain.

#### 3.2.10 WAY FORWARD

Members tasked the area Member of County Assembly to take note of the proposed projects falling in their jurisdiction and champion for their funding.

#### **3.3.2 PRELIMINARIES**

The NG-CDFC chairman called the meeting to order at exactly 2:00pm, he welcomed members to the meeting after leading in opening prayer. He called upon the area chiefs to welcome members to the forum, in unanimity the chiefs appreciated the NG-CDFC for presenting the stakeholders with a platform where they can propose the projects they wish to be funded by Government through NG-CDF, they called for equity in distribution of the prosed projects to ensure that the effect of the fund is felt across the constituency.

#### 3.3.3 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He cited the members on the provisions of the NG-CDF Act section 27 stipulates that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency, and this forum was therefore in line with the requirements of the law.

He also explained in detail the nature of projects funded by NG-CDF in relation to eligible and ineligible projects.



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### 3.3.4 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

He welcomed members to the meeting and pointed out the importance of community involvement in any development process and the benefits emanating from them proposing the projects to be implemented.

He called upon members to exercise sobriety in their proposals and root for projects that are fundable within the NG-CDF framework

## 3.3.5 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

He acknowledged that the changes in livelihoods attributed to NG-CDF cannot be looked down upon in the country.

He noted the sectors that have benefitted from the NG-CDF kitty which include, the education sector, where NG-CDF has implemented several infrastructural developments in primary, secondary schools and tertiary institutions, and this has contributed immensely in students' enrolment in the learning institutions and offering of conducive learning environment.

The NG-CDF bursary has helped retain needy but bright students in schools hence, as such the legislature should champion for laws that will protect and retain the fund in the constitution for prosperity.



#### 3.3.7 CHALLENGES

It was noted that there is overreliance on NG-CDF funds by the community and inadequate knowledge on projects fundable by the county government and the youths' participation in development initiatives was minimal in projects that do not award cash benefits to them.

The county government should hold public forums in order to educate the public on the mandates of the county government and the youths were encouraged to take lead in development initiatives and front for also projects that benefit them too

#### 3.4.3 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN



#### 3.4.4 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

He commended the participants for sparing some time out of their itinerary to attend the vital meeting, since it is them who should tell the NG-CDFC the projects they would like to be implemented in their localities being the first hand users.

He called upon the participants to restrict the projects within those permissible by the NGCDF Act 2015 and its regulations. He further urged them to good stewards of the government funds and projects, since they are the custodians of the projects in their localities in addition to being tax payers.

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#### 3.4.5 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF COUNTY ASSEMBLY

The area MCA appreciated the joint effort towards development in the constituency and called upon the members to diligently work for the betterment of the area. He pointed out that the elected leaders should be given an opportunity to serve the citizens

He thanked the NG-CDF team for organizing the forum since this is a vital road map towards a people's driven development

#### 3.4.6 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He alluded that NG-CDF only funds community-based projects meant to serve community needs in the constituency and have long-term positive effects on people's wellbeing and also gave a briefing on the incligible projects.

He further affirmed Co-founding is also allowed where a project can be financed jointly with a neighboring constituency or from sources other than the Fund so long as the other financiers or donors of that project have no objection, and provided that the part funding for the project availed pursuant to the NG-CDF Act 2015 shall go to a defined unit or any part thereof or phase of the project in order to ensure that the particular portion defined in the allocation is completed with the funds allocated under this Act.

#### 3.4.7 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

The thanked the members present for their attendance and noted that it is a sign of patriotic citizenry. He urged them to participate freely and propose projects within the set legal frameworks that will impact positively to their livelihood.

He stressed on the need of equity in projects distribution to promote availability of basic services across the constituency.

#### 3.4.9 CHALLENGES

Delayed disbursement of project funds leads to proposed projects not being implemented within the financial year, hence delays which in turn lead to rise in project costs and other unforescen occurrences and bursaries not awarded to students in coherent with the school's calendar, hence students and pupils retention in learning institutions is greatly affected negatively.

The NG-CDF Board should disburse funds within the respective financial year in order to enable implementation of proposed development initiatives in time

#### 3.5.2 PRELIMINARIES

The area chief of Rigoma location called upon a volunteer to lead in opening prayer. He welcomed the people present and thanked them for their attendance. He introduced the ward development committee and appreciated their efforts towards development on the area. He then welcomed the NG-CDFC chairman to proceed with the day's agenda.

#### 3.5.3 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

The chairman also welcomed members to the forum and stated that the office is committed towards service provision to the people and will continuously undertake public awareness exercise so as to sensitize people on the mandates and functions of NG-CDF as a means of enhancing public participation in NG-CDF affairs. Continuous M&E exercise, budget tracking and social audits will also be undertaken to ensure that projects are implemented as planned, the community own the projects in order to uphold value for money. This will in turn increase efficiency and effectiveness in NG-CDF projects implementation.

#### 3.5.4 COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

He mentioned that NG-CDF's goals are in tandem with Kenya's Vision 2030 development blueprint, he added that the fund has been hailed as one the country's developmental projects and has the ability to make over Kenya into a developed country as its concepts are owned by the people and are aimed at their own uplifting.

Beneficiary participation and involvement and consultative decision making among all parties involved, prioritizing needs by the locals through consultations, effective communication and good leadership are some of the virtues NG-CDF is known of. He challenged the area Member of National Assembly to marshal his collogues and enact laws that will enable the government allocate more resources particularly to infrastructure such as roads to ensure that rural areas are chairman' Mmma. easily accessible

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### 3.5.5 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He clarified to the members about the eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF and ineligible projects which are fundable by devolved systems, and also briefed the meeting on the statutory ceilings specified in the NG-CDF Act 2015 which guide the NG-CDFC during projects funding. He also stressed that after the exercise in all the wards the NG-CDFC will rank the projects in order of priority and that the that on-going projects shall take precedence over other new projects, as such not all projects prioritized shall be funded at once.

#### 3.5.6 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

He drew the meetings attention that NG-CDF was established with the aim of improving service delivery, alleviating poverty, enhancing economic governance, and ultimately to spur development in the constituencies thereby contributing to socio-economic development of all the constituencies.

He mentioned that if the public is involved in the full decision making process during projects identification, their concerns will be met early during the planning process when changes may be easier to make, rather than late when even small changes may cost both time and money.

### **3.6.2 PRELIMINARIES**

The NG-CDF Chairman called upon the area chief to start off the meeting before embarking on the day's agenda. Nyakongo chief led the meeting in prayers and invited the other chiefs present who welcomed members to the meeting and introduced the members of the ward development committee.





#### MIN1: 25/09/2021 PRELIMINARIES

The chairman thanked members for attending the meeting on a short notice. He requested the secretary to read the previous minutes which were agreed by Peterson Nyamato and were seconded by Norah Nyaboke as the resolved minutes.

## Chairman's remarks

The chairman reminded the committee that the Act requires that the allocation of projects should be balanced in all wards and the ongoing projects should be given priority.

He thanked the Fund Account Manager for being with the committee for continuous advice on projects implementation.

### Fund Account Manager's Remarks

The Fund Account Manager also thanked the committee for their commitment in projects implementation and informed the committee that the circular about the submission of projects proposals for 2021-2022 financial year's dated 26th August REF: NG-CDFB/CEO/BOARD CIRCULARs Vol II (030)

The Fund Account Manager explained the basis of identifying projects proposals as: aretory to

- Ward proposed projects by the general public
- 2. Eligibility of projects under the Act
- 3. Constituency interventions in response to Covid 19 pandemic
- 4. Projects co-funded with other agencies
- 5. Ongoing projects
- 6. Adherence to finance management act, procurement and assets disposal act
- 7. Labeling and branding of projects
- Adherence to statutory ceilings
- 9. Implementation of constituency strategic plan.
- Timeline for submission of project proposal

He informed the committee that the total allocation for the 2021/2022FY is Ksh. 137,088,879.00 which must be apportioned according to the guidelines as follows

#### **MIN 2:** 25/09/2021: Discussion on proposal for projects funding 2021/2022 fy

## i. Ongoing projects - Stalled

The committee observed that there were projects that were initiated by NGCDF as far as 2013-14 financial years on wards and are stalled. Due to demand from the community about the value of money, they were proposed for completion. The Ward meetings prioritized them for funding hence included in the list of ongoing projects. Those projects were for instance; Manga Model Girls school, St. Paul's Manga Orotuba secondary school and St. Paul's Gekano secondary school and Tombe Mixed secondary school

### ii. Schools infrastructure

The committee agreed that most schools need renovations especially roof replacement (Irons sheets and Timber), plastering, steel doors and windows, floors, veranda and painting as a priority instead of constructing new classrooms.

It was further noted that some schools have bigger classrooms that can accommodate many students/pupils while others are small hence there will be variations in activities.

The committee agreed to allocate Kshs. 1,000,000 to each school for the renovations ranging from 5 to 6 classrooms depending on the activities, rooms capacity and the degree of repairs.

School buses. Due to change in quotation of chassis for the 2 school buses funded in 2020/2021 financial year, the difference had to be proposed and be considered for approval to challe foretar a completion of the school buses on purchase.

The committee therefore approved additional of Kshs. 1,150,000 per piece for the buses to make it a total of Kshs. 8.6 from 7.450m as was approved in previous financial year.
