MINUTE 3-11/01/2023: ONGOING PROJECT STATUS REPORT

The Manager reported to the committee of ongoing project status report sent to the board on 5th December, 2022 and asked the chairman to inform the committee on the current status of those projects

The committee was informed that during the FYR 2018/2019 Mutuini Police Post Toilet and Kirigu Chief's Camp Toilet were both allocated Ksh. 500,000 each. Thereafter the works were awarded to Marshall Group of Companies (Kirigu Chief Camp) at Ksh. 763,930.00 and Glotime Logistics (Mutuini Police Post) at Ksh. 715,000. Both projects required additional funding. When submitting ongoing projects on 5th December, 2022, Kirigu Chief Camp was omitted. Therefore Members agreed to allocate Ksh. 300,000 to Kirigu Chief's Camp Toilet project and Ksh. 250,000 to Mutuini Police Post toilet projects to ensure the contract amounts are fully paid.

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LOINTRODUCTION

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from.

Citizen participation in project planning, management and implementation planning requires the involvement of concerned stakeholders. This includes identifying public concerns and values and developing a broad consensus on planned initiatives. It is also about utilizing the vast amount of information and knowledge that stakeholders hold to find workable, efficient and sustainable solutions

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow those that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the process. Community participation motivates the stakeholders to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and own the projects in their localities

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development Initiatives in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. It is important that all stakeholders are involved in the development of projects and not just direct beneficiaries of an initiative.

1.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was established under the National Government Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, NG-CDF Act, 2015, this act was then re-amended in 2022 after NGCDF was again declared unconstitutional. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.



The National Government Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the NG-CDF Act 2013. The NG-CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government development Agenda at the constituency level.

The NG-CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

12 ABOUT DAGORETTI SOUTH CONSTITUENCY

Dagoretti South constituency was curved from the former greater Dagoretti. It's in Nairobi County and its sub county is Dagoretti South Sub County with its offices based in Riruta Ward. It has five wards namely: - Mutu-ini, Uthiru/Ruthimitu, Waithaka, Riruta and Ngando Wards.

The constituency borders Kibra constituency, Kikuyu Constituency, Dagoretti North, Langata Constituency and Kabete Constituency.

The main economic activities of the constituents are sale of animal products, real estate, entrepreneurial businesses, partly farming some of the wards.

The constituency's population of persons as per the 2019 census is 279,161 persons.

Minute 2/17/11/2022: School Infrastructure Projects/Funding

To create a clear picture of the ongoing/proposed school projects to every member, member were taken round the different sites.

(i) Site visit - Ngando

This is the proposed site for Lenana Primary School. It is at the corner of the school land-around Ngando area. Members had a short consultative meeting with the Senior chief, Mr.Richard Kikuvi, the area elder, Mr. Meshack Nyabuto, bodaboda operators (who had been provided with a shade by the school) and a number of area citizens. The BOM chairperson on behalf of the committee thanked the area administration and wananchi for making it possible for the school to get back part of its land which had been turned into a road. He informed the residents that the BOM and administration had agreed to the request by the Ministry of Education to provide land for construction of a primary school. He told that work will begin soon once the necessary approvals and funding had been sought and acquired. He informed them that the primary school will be part of Lenana School and will be run by the Lenana school BOM and administration. He made it clear that the school land was not going to be hived off or given out.

The chief, village elder and members of public present greatly appreciated the school management for making that decision and consideration saying it will go along way in providing a secure and reliable school for their children to get quality education. This, according to them was going to greatly assist in improving security in that area. The school chaplain Rev. Joe Karanja then prayed and dedicated the proposed site.

(ii) Visit - Golf Course

From Ngando, members headed to the Lenana Talent Academy gold course to assess its progress. They were received by the technical officers working on it. Mr. Joseph Murungi (Technical officer- Kenya Golf Union) took members through the work done already. 9 greens had been fairly done and nearing completion while work on the other 9 was already going on. He said it was important that piping and installation of sprinklers be fast tracked so that grass on the greens can be planted. He reported that the storage tank was already in place. He assured members that in the next two (2) months the golf course should be done and ready for use. The N.Y.S. officer incharge, Eng. Nyamu said that progress was good and the final batch of sand, ballast and

hardcore will start being delivered from Monday, 21st November, 2022. Grass will be delivered later after the irrigation system has been fixed. Members appreciated for the good work done so far and hoped that timelines will be observed.

(iii) Site Visit - Tom Mboya House

Members also visited the new Tom Mboya house which has been under construction since late 2021. The clerk of works who has been in-charge of the construction reported that the House was complete safe for a few touches here and there and especially effecting additional instructions which had been given. He informed members that the house will be ready for handling over to the school in two week's time. Furnishing will be done by the school administration later.

The BOM members appreciated the work done and observed that the new house/dormitory will go along away in ensuring students were comfortably accommodated.

(iv) Site visit CBE. Classrooms

Members then visited the site for the C.B.C. classrooms. The foreman assured members that though, work was just starting, the classrooms will be made ready for use at the beginning of the year.

Members were happy with the progress made so far.

(iv) Proposed Laboratory Complex

Members then converged at the Music school and were taken through the designs for the proposed laboratory complex.

Martin Sissey (alumni) displayed soft copies of the design for the proposed complex. It is proposed that the complex will occupy the space where the Old Tom Mboya stands, adjacent to the new block of classes. The complex will have enough room for 9 laboratories, 3 for each of the science subjects, Biology, Physics and Chemistry. It will have 7 offices and ablution block. It will also have 4 ICT laboratories.

The design assumes the shape of half of a conical flask. It is a proposed twin tower – the other half of the conical flask can be put up later to provide additional facilities depending on the school's need.

The design has also provided a space for astronomical/ meteorological activities (club) on the top floor (roof top). The BOM chairman appreciated Martin and his team for coming up with such a meticulous design. He asked members to put in their suggestions/amendments which they did and the technical team of Marvin promised members that he will redesign it factoring in the proposal changes.

The Regional Director of Education (RDE) who was present, appreciated the efforts the BOM was putting in making Lenana School a centre of excellence. He promised to give all the necessary support the school needed from the Ministry to help it achieve the objectives already set.

Minute 3/17/11/2022: Resolutions

The BOM members made the following resolutions:

(a) Lenana School Primary

That: (i) The site was identified and endorsed for the proposed Lenana school Primary.

- (ii) Project Management Committee (PMC) which comprise of the school BOM, the constituency CDF fund manager, the area provincial administration, the area M.C.A. and community member to monitor and effect implementation of the proposed primary school.
- (iii) The Lenana Primary school was being initiated upon the request by the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Education.
- (iv) It is a public primary school established by Lenana School and managed by the BOM.
- v) No excision or transfer of land from the land owned by Lenana School. The Primary school land will be part of the Lenana School land.
- vi) The BOM will liaise with the Ministry of Education to fund the implementation of the project.
- vii) Public works chief architect has provided the architectural drawings and is finalizing the BOQs.
- (viii) The MOE will give an additional KSh.5 million and CDF Dagoretti is expected to give KShs.20 million at the beginning. The PMC committee members for bank opening signatories are:

 - Members were also informed that courtesy of Eng. Kinoti, a member of the Board, the school will get a facelift of the roads within the compound courtesy of the Ministry of roads (KURA). Budgeting for the internal roads was already complete and work was to start soon.
 - Members appreciated Eng. Kinoti for the efforts he had made to ensure the school got a roads facelift.
 - The chairperson appreciated all members for their attendance and contributions.


