

The committee agreed that the five days Public participation per ward was very fruitful. Kibra NG-CDFC agreed that the public is so conversant with the NG-CDF funds and the roles undertake in the constituency. The Kibra NG-CDFC members collected the projects from the public and prioritized them as follows:

MIN NGCDFC/KIBRA/8.0/2024PROJECTS

The committee members were brought to notice on the already approved projects and the implementation status as follows:

- Construction of Kibra Deputy County Commissioners Complex- It was reported that
 the project has already been approved by NG-CDF Board. The committee also
 agreed to fund this project in the current financial year to completion.
- Laini Saba Chief Office- It was reported that the DCC has already identified the land. The committee agreed that the redesigning of the project should be continue immediately. It was reported that the Architecture will be visiting the site the following week.
- 3. Ayany Primary School: It was reported that the construction of the tree classrooms is ongoing and almost 95% complete. There are additional five classrooms that had been approved by the Board. The committee approved that the construction work be started immediately. It was reported that the committee is waiting for the approval of the additional five classrooms from the board.
- Olympic Primary School: It was reported that the construction of the classrooms is ongoing. The project is 93% complete.
- 5. The committee were notified that Kshs 18,000,000/= had been transferred to Ralla Educational Centre Secondary School PMC Account. The procurement process is already complete and the project will commence as soon as possible. The project will only be delayed due to the on-going examination. The committee agreed to add an additional floor that they had requested.
- 6. In addition, it was reported that Kshs 6,500,000/= for the construction of perimeter wall and Kshs 3,500,000/= for the installation of modern swing gate and construction of centric house were transferred to Kibra TVC PMC Account. The project is 95% complete. It will be papeded gvAr sobirG C D F

- 7. Kibra TVC Computer Lab.It was reported that the principal had sent the request for Kibra NG-CDF to assist the institution with the infrastructure for computer lab that will be donated under Jitume program. Kibra NG-CDF agreed to forward the request for approval from the NG-CDF Board.
- Joseph Kang'ethe Primary School: The committee was notified that the request for the construction of the ten classrooms is waiting for the approval from the board.
 The committee agreed that the project should started immediately upon approval.

MIN NG-CDFC/KIBRA/9.0/2024 CLIMATE MITIGATION PROJECTS

The committee agreed that it will not fund Climate mitigation this financial year due to scarcity of land to plant trees and also, they are yet to implement climate mitigation project approved in financial Year 2023/2024

MIN NG-CDFC/KIBRA/10.0/2024 ICT HUBs PROJECTS

Kibra NG-CDF has implemented one ICT HUB at Kibra Technical and Vocational College which is fully operational and in Woodely Ward. The Committee agreed to implement other ICT Hubs in the remaining 4 wards once land/space is available.



0.0 INTRODUCTION OR BACKGROUND

0.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund NG-CDF) was created by the NG-CDF Act, amended 2023 with the primary objective of addressing poverty at grassroots level by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the ordinary national government revenue to grassroots development and the reduction of poverty.

The NG-CDF Board was created to replace the then CDF Board (NMC) as the top management organ and to deal with only National Government Functions.

0.2 ABOUT KIBRA

There are approx 2.5 million slum dwellers in about 200 settlements in Nairobi representing 60% of the Nairobi population. Kibra is a home to approximately 350,000-500,000 people. Kibra is the biggest slum in Africa and one of the biggest in the world. The Government owns all the land. 10% of people are shack owners and many of these people own many other shacks and sub-let them. All the rest are tenants with no rights. The average size of a shack in this area is 12ft x 12ft built with mud walls, screened with concrete, a corrugated tin roof, dirt or concrete floor. The cost is about Ksh 700 per Month (£6). These shacks often house up to 8 or more, many sleeping on the floor.

The slum is characterized by a number of social economic and political changes namely, poor housing, high rate of youth unemployment, illegal gangs, drugs and substance abuse among the youth, teenage pregnancy, poor access roads, illicit businesses, high rate of insecurity, poor hygiene and sanitation among others.

However, all is not lost, the government and other non-state actors are addressing some of the above challenges through various programmes namely, The national Youth Service: they are currently providing employment opportunity to a number of youths through community service initiatives, Kenya Power And Lightening Company lighting up low income households, non-governmental organization promoting youth employability skills through vocational skills training and the area member of parliament improving livelihoods of vulnerable households through sustainable initiatives focusing on education programme, water and sanitation programme, infrastructural development, talent cultivation and a management and
