0.0 INTRODUCTION OR BACKGROUND

0.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was created by the NG-CDF Act, 2015 with the primary objective of addressing poverty at grassroots level by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the ordinary national government revenue to grassroots development and the reduction of poverty.

The NG-CDF Board was created to replace the then CDF Board (NMC) as the top management organ.

0.2 ABOUT KIBRA

There are approx 2.5 million slum dwellers in about 200 settlements in Nairobi representing 60% of the Nairobi population. Kibra is a home to approximately 350,000-500,000 people. Kibra is the biggest slum in Africa and one of the biggest in the world. The Government owns all the land. 10% of people are shack owners and many of these people own many other shacks and sub-let them. All the rest are tenants with no rights. The average size of a shack in this area is 12ft x 12ft built with mud walls, screened with concrete, a corrugated tin roof, dirt or concrete floor. The cost is about Ksh 700 per Month (£6). These shacks often house up to 8 or more, many sleeping on the floor.

The slum is characterized by a number of social economic and political changes namely, poor housing, high rate of youth unemployment, illegal gangs, drugs and substance abuse among the youth, teenage pregnancy, poor access roads, illicit businesses, high rate of insecurity, poor hygiene and sanitation among others.

However, all is not lost, the government and other non-state actors are addressing some of the above challenges through various programmes namely, The national Youth Service: they are currently providing employment opportunity to a number of youths through community service initiatives, Kenya Power And Lightening Company lighting up low income households, non-governmental organization promoting youth employability skills through vocational skills training and the area member of parliament improving livelihoods of vulnerable households through sustainable initiatives focusing on education programme, water and sanitation programme, infrastructural development, talent cultivation and a management and women and youth empowerment.

These initiatives are not implemented in oblivion but compliment National Development Strategy Papers such as the Kenya Vision 2030, Poverty Reduction Strategy Papers, 2010 National Youth Employment



Creation Policy, 2010 Kenya Constitution and the Millennium Development goals focusing on extreme poverty reduction.

MIN 2: OVERVIEW OF PREVIOUS FINANCIAL YEAR PROJECT PROPOSAL

I. BURSARY ACTIVITIES

II. EDUCATION

Raila Education Center completion is already done and the school already handed over. Desks were also given to the school and that has enhanced improved learning environment.

A school bus was promised to Kibera primary school and has already been bought and already in use by the school. The members congratulated the CDF for considering that request.

The members requested to be assisted with the construction of Modern Kitchen and a Modern Dinning hall for Kibera Secondary school.

Kibera secondary school also requested to be purchased of a school bus that does not have less than 46 seaters

Members discussed about the water collection and they requested to be supplied and the water tank and construction of water bases in their schools to reduce the cost of the water.

Kibera Primary School requested for the support in renovation of schools.

Members felt its good for schools in Makina to be supplied with more Primary and Secondary School desks.

III. SPORTS

Kibra NG-NG-CDF held an interschool Sports Tournament as proposed by sports stakeholders in Kibra. On the other hand, the teams that participated requested for the kits were purchased for and they are currently using them as they fly their team's flags as well as that of Kibra high.

Members recommended the continuation of the interschool Soccer and the community soccer.

MIN 3: IDENTIFICATION OF 2022/ 2023 PROJECTS

The *Baraza* was informed of current financial year allocation and its breakdown in terms of ceilings. The *baraza* was advised to concentrate on major more impactful projects instead small ones.

Makina ward identified and proposed the following projects:

1. Boreholes and water points at Arusha area of Karanja Road, space next to Makina Law Courts, Darajani area and next to the Deputy County Commissioners compound. This will act as an income generating activity for Makina youth and women as it provides affordable clean water to the constituents.
2. Construction of a community library
3. Request to be made for constructions of energy saving jikos at Kibera Secondary School and Raila Education Secondary school.
4. The DCC requested for construction of Kibra DCC complex to handle all departments.
5. Purchase of garbage disposal tanks to act as garbage collection points.
6. Purchase of garbage recycling machines and garbage collection carts
7. The members requested for the public schools be given desks
8. Construction of Sansiro link road and renovation of Sansiro Parking
9. Construction of an Art Center and Resource Centre at the National Housing Corporation & Equity Bank Compound or within the Deputy County Commissioners Compound or spaces besides the railway project.

MIN 4: A.O.B

1. National Youth Service has already constructed toilets in Kibra so NG-CDF will not do the same as it will be duplication of projects.



2. Nairobi County government assigned one garbage truck to be shared between Langata and Kibra Constituencies. It is not enough but NG-CDF cannot purchase a garbage truck unless it will be handed over to the County Government to run and maintain it.
3. Kibra was awarded Kshs. 16m Uwezo Fund. 60 youth and women groups benefitted and have started repaying the interest free loans.
4. NG-CDF had budgeted for a police station but available land was very expensive hence the resolution is to rely on 9 police posts provided by NYS.
5. There was need for involvement from the community. Leaders in different levels were called to be proactive to step in and inspect NG-CDF projects frequently.
6. The members were urged to visit the office for any queries and also to educate the community on the CDF

There being no other business, the baraza was adjourned.

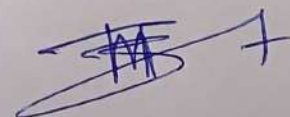
Introductions: The meeting started by a prayer from Mr. Omuga and the people present introducing themselves.

The opening remarks from the CDF office.

The Fund Account Manager opened the meeting by explaining to the wananchi the NG-CDF Act 2016 rules and regulations.

The chairman took them through overview of the previous proposals and the projects that has been carried out by the NG-CDF in Sarang'ombe Ward.

She reiterated the fact that Sarang'ombe are the largest beneficiaries of the NG-CDF monies. The ward has the highest population



PROJECT PROPOSALS for 2022/2023

1. Members requested for the construction of an administrative block and purchase of a 67-seater bus for the Raila educational school where the population had increases.

2. The members also agreed for the renovation of the Olympic Primary School classroom where the classes are old and in bad condition. It was also agreed construction of more classrooms and renovation of the classroom should be done in Olympic Secondary school.

3. A member talked about issues of land. That it's hard to do projects in Kibra Constituency due to limitation of land.

He supported the roads and youth empowerment in Kibra as a whole and Sarang'ombe in particular. He requested if the mama Okinda road could also be done to help access to emergency response units in case of emergencies.

4. The members suggested that the local sports teams should be supported. This could be even through purchasing for them the sports uniforms and this could be the football, boxing, volleyball and netball team. They also suggested that athletics should also be considered.

On women empowerment, she said women groups have received Uwezo Fund however she requested that the women sensitization program should be given priority.

5. A member requested if the allocation of the bursary could be increased so as many people get to benefit from. On Roads, he said that the many road construction are ongoing eg Bombolulu- Bypass. He commended the MP effort to improve infrastructure.

6. He proposed Ayany primary school to be elevated into a secondary school. He faulted the informal schools that are not producing good results. He said emergency fund should help more people.

7. A representative from Olympic Estate requested if the access roads to the estates could be tarmacked. He also requested if both primary and secondary schools could be facilitated with desks and lockers.

8. On education matters, he talked about the mushrooming of the informal school that does not produce good results. On Roads he reiterated the obstruction of traffic at Olympic stage.



9. Education: He said the informal and private schools that don't have licenses should seek the paperwork or close down. Although, those informal schools and private school that doesn't do well should up their performance.

10. Suggestion that the Olympic playing ground should be carpeted.

11. Proposed a Market sheds at 42 stage terminus and Olympic stage market sheds.

12. The members were grateful for the good work that had been done in Raila Educational Centre. They appreciated that the school fence had been constructed as it helps keep the school tidy and protect school land from grabbers. The community also requested for the secondary schools desks at the institution.

13. The community was happy with the performance of Olympic Primary school. The student through the headmaster requested the NG-CDF to support them in the installation of the window panes in the classrooms which will enable them to attend night studies comfortably. The parents also requested the NG-CDF to repair the wall that had collapsed to avoid illegal access to the school and also reduce the chances of land grabbing.

- Six water tanks in Kambi Muru and Kisumu ndogo.

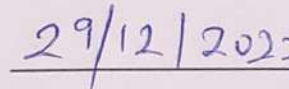
