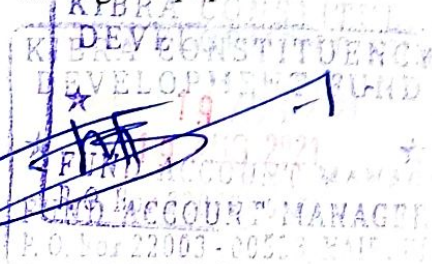
Introductions: The meeting started by a prayer from Mr. Jacob Seje and the people present introducing themselves.

The opening remarks from the CDF office.

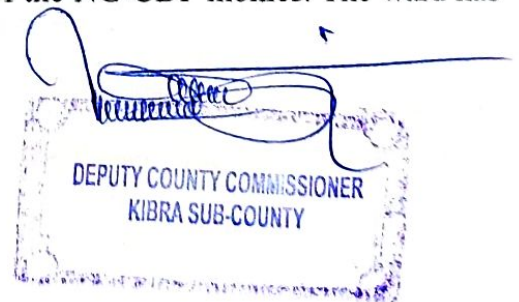
The Fund Account Manager opened the meeting by explaining to the wananchi the NG-CDF Act 2016 rules and regulations.

PROJECT PROPOSALS for 2021/2022

1. Woodley stadium in Woodley Golfcourse Ward should be renovated for home teams. It is the homeground for Black stars foot ball club from Sarang'ombe ward.

2. Members suggested that the schools should be bought for desks considering the increase in student population among the schools.

3. A member talked about issues of land. That it's hard to do projects in Kibra Constituency due to limitation of land. He said that he has and will support the NYS program to the fullest since all Kenyans are tax payers.

He supported the roads and youth empowerment in Kibra as a whole and Sarang'ombe in particular. He requested if the mama Okinda road could also be done to help access to emergency response units in case of emergencies

4. The members suggested that the local sports teams should be supported. This could be even through purchasing for them the sports uniforms and this could be the football, boxing, volleyball and netball team. They also suggested that athletics should also be considered.

On women empowerment, She said women groups have received Uwezo Fund however she requested that the women sensitization program should be given priority.

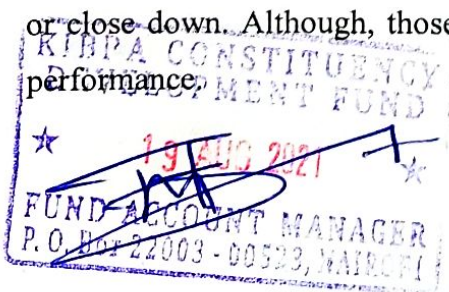
5. A member requested if the allocation of the bursary could be increased so as many people get to benefit from. On Roads, he said that the many road construction are ongoing. eg Bombolulu- Bypass. He commended the MP effort to improve infrastructure.

6. He proposed Ayany primary school to be elevated into a secondary school. He faulted the informal schools that are not producing good results. He said emergency fund should help more people.

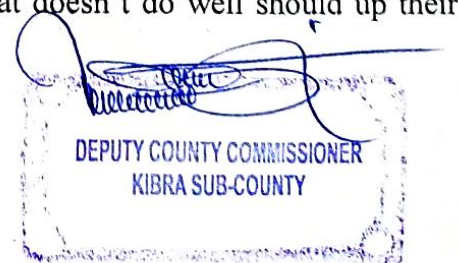
7. A representative from Olympic Estate requested if the access roads to the estates could be tarmacked. He also requested if both primary and secondary schools could be facilitated with desks and lockers.

8. On education matters, he talked about the mushrooming of the informal school that does not produce good results. On Roads he reiterated the obstruction of traffic at Olympic stage.

9. Education: He said the informal and private schools that don't have licenses should seek the paperwork or close down. Although, those informal schools and private school that doesn't do well should up their performance.

11. Proposed a Market sheds at 42 stage terminus and Olympic stage market sheds.

12. The members were grateful for the good work that had been done in Raila Educational Centre. They appreciated that the school fence had been constructed as it helps keep the school tidy and protect school land from grabbers. The community also requested for the secondary schools desks.

13. The community was happy with the performance of Olympic Primary school. The student through the headmaster requested the NG-CDF to support them in the installation of the window panes in the classrooms which will enable them to attend night studies comfortably. The parents also requested the NG-CDF to repair the wall that had collapsed to avoid illegal access to the school and also reduce the chances of land grabbing.
