0.0 INTRODUCTION OR BACKGROUND

0.1 ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was created by the NG-CDF Act, 2015 with the primary objective of addressing poverty at grassroots level by dedicating a minimum of 2.5% of the ordinary national government revenue to grassroots development and the reduction of poverty.

The NG-CDF Board was created to replace the then CDF Board (NMC) as the top management organ.

0.2 ABOUT KIBRA

There are approx 2.5 million slum dwellers in about 200 settlements in Nairobi representing 60% of the Nairobi population. Kibra is a home to approximately 350,000-500,000 people. Kibra is the biggest slum in Africa and one of the biggest in the world. The Government owns all the land. 10% of people are shack owners and many of these people own many other shacks and sub-let them. All the rest are tenants with no rights. The average size of a shack in this area is 12ft x 12ft built with mud walls, screened with concrete, a corrugated tin roof, dirt or concrete floor. The cost is about Ksh 700 per Month (£6). These shacks often house up to 8 or more, many sleeping on the floor.

The slum is characterized by a number of social economic and political changes namely, poor housing, high rate of youth unemployment, illegal gangs, drugs and substance abuse among the youth, teenage pregnancy, poor access roads, illicit businesses, high rate of insecurity, poor hygiene and sanitation among others.

However, all is not lost, the government and other non-state actors are addressing some of the above challenges through various programmes namely, The national Youth Service: they are currently providing employment opportunity to a number of youths through community service initiatives, Kenya Power And Lightening Company lighting up low income households, non-governmental organization promoting youth employability skills through vocational skills training and the area member of parliament improving livelihoods of vulnerable households through sustainable initiatives focusing on education programme, water and sanitation programme, infrastructural development, talent cultivation and a management and women and youth empowerment.

These initiatives are not implemented in oblivion but compliment National Development Strategy Papers such as the Kenya Vision 2030, Poverty Reduction Strategy Papers, 2010 National Youth Employment



Creation Policy, 2010 Kenya Constitution and the Millennium Development goals focusing on extreme poverty reduction.

A school bus was promised to Kibera primary school and has already been bought and already in use by the school. The members congratulated the CDF for considering that request.

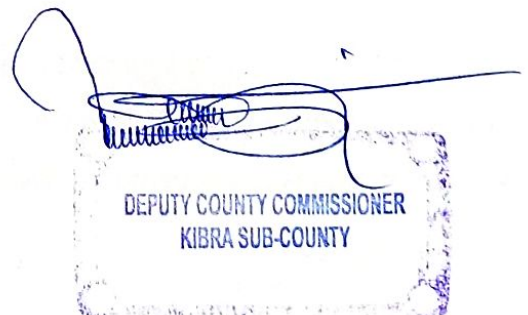
The community members had requested for an ablution block to be build at Kibera primary school. This was done by the CDF and already handed over to the school. This has helped improved sanitation in the school.

Raila Education Centre primary school was to be constructed for an ablution block. The Members were told that it is yet to be done as they were still awaiting some analysis from the engineers.

Members congratulated Kibra NG-CDF for the good work at Kibera Secondary School. The school is already constructed and already handed over.



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III. SPORTS

In the FY 2020/2021 Kibra NG-NG-CDF held an interschool Sports Tournament as proposed by sports stakeholders in Kibra. On the other hand, the teams that participated requested for the kits were purchased for and they are currently using them as they fly their team's flags as well as that of Kibra high.

Kibra NG-CDF had prioritized construction of daises at Joseph Kangethe Sports Ground and rehabilitation of Joseph Kangethe Social hall, both which are under the county government. It had to request for permission from the County government which declined, claiming that they had set aside Kshs. 260 million accompanied with a very colorful plan but nothing has been done up to date.

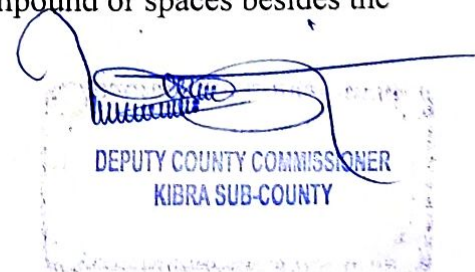
MIN 3: IDENTIFICATION OF 2021/ 2022 PROJECTS

The *Baraza* was informed of current financial year allocation and its breakdown in terms of ceilings. The *baraza* was advised to concentrate on major more impactful projects instead small ones.

Makina ward identified and proposed the following projects:

1. Boreholes and water points at Arusha area of Karanja Road, space next to Makina Law Courts, Darajani area and next to the Deputy County Commissioners compound. This will act as an income generating activity for Makina youth and women as it provides affordable clean water to the constituents.
2. Construction of a community library
3. Request to be made for constructions of energy saving jikos at Kibera Secondary School and Raila Education Secondary school.
4. The DCC through the A.P requested for the completion of the administration houses that were being constructed
5. Purchase of garbage disposal tanks to act as garbage collection points.
6. Purchase of garbage recycling machines and garbage collection carts
7. The members requested for the public schools be given desks
8. Construction of Sansiro link road and renovation of Sansiro Parking
9. Construction of an Art Center and Resource Centre at the National Housing Corporation & Equity Bank Compound or within the Deputy County Commissioners Compound or spaces besides the

railway project.



10. Construction of Raila educational Centre Primary School.

MIN 4: A.O.B

1. National Youth Service has already constructed toilets in Kibra so NG-CDF will not do the same as it will be duplication of projects.
2. Nairobi County government assigned one garbage truck to be shared between Langata and Kibra Constituencies. It is not enough but NG-CDF cannot purchase a garbage truck unless it will be handed over to the County Government to run and maintain it.
3. Kibra was awarded Kshs. 16m Uwezo Fund. 60 youth and women groups benefitted and have started repaying the interest free loans.
4. NG-CDF had budgeted for a police station but available land was very expensive hence the resolution is to rely on 9 police posts provided by NYS.
5. There was need for involvement from the community. Leaders in different levels were called to be proactive to step in and inspect NG-CDF projects frequently.
6. The members were urged to visit the office for any queries and also to educate the community on the CDF

There being no other business, the baraza was adjourned.



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
