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#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from.

Citizen participation in project planning, management and implementation planning requires the involvement of concerned stakeholders. This includes identifying public concerns and values and developing a broad consensus on planned initiatives. It is also about utilizing the vast amount of information and knowledge that stakeholders hold to find workable, efficient and sustainable solutions.

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow those that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the process. Community participation motivates the stakeholders to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and own the projects in their localities

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development Initiatives in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. It is important that all stakeholders are involved in the development of projects and not just direct beneficiaries of an initiative.

#### ABOUT NG-CDF 1.1

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) was established under the National Government Constituencies Development Fund (Amendment) Act, 2015. The NG-CDF is a fully-fledged parastatal under the State Department responsible for National Economic Policy, Planning and Development under the National Treasury. Its main objective is provision of mechanisms necessary for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the level of the constituency. The fund management is the responsibility of the NG-CDF Board.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the constituency level.

#### ABOUT EMBAKASI CENTRAL NG-CDF 1.2

Embakasi Central Constituency is in Eastlands area of Nairobi County with a rich urban setting. Currently the Constituency is located in Embakasi Sub-County.

Embakasi Central Constituency as a whole has five wards, namely Kayole North, Kayole South, Kayole Central, Komarock and Matopeni/Spring Valley.

The constituency is located in Nairobi county and boarders 4 constituencies, namely Embakasi East, Embakasi West, Embakasi North and Embakasi South.

#### 3.2.2 PRELIMINARIES

The NG-CDF Chairperson called the meeting to order and called upon one volunteer to lead in opening prayers.

The chairperson registered apologies by the Deputy County Commissioner and his team who were on another crucial assignment and informed the public that they would be joining them in due course should time allow.

### 3.2.4 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

The manager informed the public on the nature of eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF as community based to ensure that the prospective benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area and those in respect of works and services falling within the functions of the National Government under the constitution

Further to this he highlighted the ineligible projects which include: Projects supporting religious bodies or religious activities, projects supporting political bodies or political activities, recurrent costs of a completed projects, personal projects, private projects and projects targeting a specific club or group of people to the exclusion of others.

#### 3.2.5 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

The chairman thanked the constituents for attending the meeting, he explained the relevance of the meeting and the need for NG-CDFC to convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters and project priorities in the ward and the constituency.

The chairperson went ahead to introduce the newly gazette NG-CDF Committee and later welcomed the Fund Manager to speak the citizens.

## 3.2.6 COMMENTS BY THE MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

He reiterated on the need of equitable distribution of resources as opposed to equal distribution, to enable all the areas in the constituency get the requisite development initiatives for better livelihood and stressed on stewardship of funds by the community members since they are the development consumers and community watch dogs.

The MP reminded the public of the need for the public to remain vigilant and proactive in ensuring that the fund is utilized prudently and ensure accountability of the office every year on the development projects.

## 3.2.8 CHALLENGES

Members expressed concern on the restrictive nature of the projects fundable by NG-CDF, especially in the bursary, health and roads sectors, but the area member of national assembly urged them to forward the projects to the area member of county assembly who was also present in the meeting.

The meeting resolved that all the funds disbursed to projects be spent judiciously to promote value for money and boost the livelihood of the residents.

#### 3.3.2 PRELIMINARIES

The meeting was attended by the area Assistant Chief who thanked the NG-CDF for organizing a forum where the public have the opportunity to front the projects that they would like NG-CDF to implement within their framework. The Assistant Chief reiterated on the need to maintain peace and security within areas of residence and asked the public to embrace the Nyumba Kumi initative and ensure that they elect proactive members to represent them.

### 3.3.3 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

The manager reiterated the relevance of the forum as stipulated in the NG-CDF Act, and the nature of projects fundable by NG-CDF, to include projects that are communal and benefit a wide cross section of the inhabitants, leaving out project that benefit individuals, supporting political and religious bodies and those that are in respect of works and services falling within the devolved functions of the county government

## 3.3.4 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

He enlightened the meeting of the various devolved funds in the constituency, and stressed the need of all the stakeholders to come together during planning to avoid duplication and double funding of projects. He called upon the County Government to share their development projects publicly to enable the constituents be aware of projects being implemented in their areas.

The chairman also introduced the rest of the committee members and later called upon the MP to address the citizens.

3.3.5 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY
The MP urged the constituents to take advantage of the bursary kitty and focus on
development issues by putting politics at bay. He further informed the members that all the
projects cannot be implemented at once but gradually hence the need of setting priorities.

The MP also called upon the public to participate actively in elections of Nyumba Kumi representatives as reiterated by the Assistant Chief.

It was noted that there is overreliance on NG-CDF funds by the community. The community also noted that there was delay in the implementation of projects especially bursaries which was occasioned by delay in disbursement of funds by the exchequer.

The chairperson registered apologies by the Deputy County Commissioner and his team who were on another crucial assignment and informed the public that they would be joining them in due course should time allow.

#### 3.4.3 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBERS OF COUNTY ASSEMBLY

The area MCAs appreciated the joint effort towards development in the constituency and called upon the members to diligently work for the betterment of the area. He pointed out that the elected leaders should be given an opportunity to serve the citizens and that politics should now be kept at bay until 2027.

They thanked the NG-CDF team for organizing the forum since this is a vital road map towards people's driven development.

The MCAs also reminded the public that they would be issuing the County Bursary Forms on Wednesday 11th January 2023 and invited all parents to avail themselves in time.

### 3.4.4 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He enlightened the members about the eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF and ineligible projects which are fundable by devolved systems, and also briefed the meeting on the statutory ceilings specified in the NG-CDF Act 2015 which guide the NG-CDFC during projects funding. He also stressed that after the exercise in all the wards the NG-CDFC will rank the projects in order of priority and that the that on-going projects shall take precedence over all other projects

### 3.4.5 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

The chairman appreciated the members concern for development, he highlighted that NG-CDF has achieved a lot towards development in the constituency, and the overall aim of this is to ensure active participation of people in the achievement of sustainable development.

## 3.4.6 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

He mentioned that if the public is involved in the full decision making process during projects identification, their concerns may be met early on in the planning process when changes may be easier to make, rather than late in the process when even small changes may cost both time and money.

He drew the meetings attention that NG-CDF was established with the aim of improving service delivery, alleviating poverty, enhancing economic governance, and ultimately to

spur development in the constituencies thereby contributing to socio-economic development of all the constituencies.

#### 3.4.8 CHALLENGES

Late disbursement of project funds leads to projects not being implemented in time which lead to rise in project costs due to factors like inflation due to time value of money and bursaries not awarded to students when the schools open, hence students and pupils' retention in learning institutions is greatly affected negatively.

#### 3.4.9 WAY FORWARD

The NG-CDF Board should facilitate timely disbursement of funds to constituencies in order to fast track development initiatives.

#### 3.6.2 PRELIMINARIES

The NG-CDF Chairperson called the meeting to order and called upon one volunteer to lead in opening prayers.

The chairperson registered apologies by the Deputy County Commissioner and his team who were on another crucial assignment and informed the public that they would be joining them in due course should time allow.

#### 3.6.4 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF COUNTY ASSEMBLY

The area MCA appreciated the joint effort towards development in the constituency and called upon the members to diligently work for the betterment of the area. He pointed out that the elected leaders should be given an opportunity to serve the citizens and that politics should now be kept at bay until 2027.

He thanked the NG-CDF team for organizing the forum since this is a vital road map towards people's driven development.

The area MCA also reminded the public that the County bursary forms would be issued on 11th January 2023 from 0800Hrs and he went on to invite all eligible voters to participate.

## 3.6.5 COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He alluded that NG-CDF only funds community-based projects meant to serve community needs in the constituency and have long-term positive effects on people's wellbeing and also gave a briefing on the ineligible projects. He further asserted Cofounding is also allowed where a project can be financed jointly with neighboring constituency or from sources other than the Fund so long as the other financiers or donors of that project have no objection, and provided that the part funding for the project availed pursuant to the NG-CDF Act 2015 shall go to a defined unit or any part thereof or phase of the project in order to ensure that the particular portion defined in the allocation is completed with the funds allocated under this Act.

#### 3.6.6 COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

He stated that the office will undertake a continuous awareness exercise of the citizens to encourage them participate in NG-CDF affairs through M&E, budget tracking and social audits. This will increase efficiency and effectiveness in NG-CDF projects management by the people and enhance ownership of the projects by the community.

3.6.7 COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

He affirmed to the participants that he will be on the front line to promote development in the constituency. He called upon the stakeholders to preach constructive development agenda that would spur socio economic growth in the region and refrain from retrogressive politics. He promised to propel equitable distribution of resources in line with other national government agencies hand in hand with the county government.

#### 3.6.10 WAY FORWARD


The area Member of County Assembly should also hold consultative meeting with all the stakeholders to avoid duplication, double funding or concentration of similar projects in one locality.


#### 3.7 CONCLUSION



- ☐ There should be a joint forum where NG-CDF, County Government and other development stakeholders plan together to avoid duplication of projects.


- ☐ The meetings resolved that ongoing projects shall be given precedence, to fast track their utilization to enable the beneficiaries get value for money.

#### MIN01/30/01/23-PRELIMINARIES

The meeting began at 0925Hrs with a word of prayer from Maryann Kabui. The Chairman then welcomed the members to the meeting and a brief introduction of all the members followed. The Chairman then read the agenda for the meeting to the members.

## MINO2/30/01/23- SUMMARY OF THE WARD REPORT

Based on the public consultative ward forums held in 5 wards, members proposed projects be prioritized and the funds be utilized as follows (attached ward Meetings report)

#### KOMAROCK WARD

- 1. Komarock South Primary School- Construction of a non storey modern kitchen
- Komarock South Primary School- Installation of 4 20-Meters High Solar

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## 2. KAYOLE SOUTH WARD

1. Thawabu Primary School- Construction of One storey 8 Classrooms

#### 3. MATOPENI/SPRING VALLEY WARD

1. Kayole North Primary School- Construction of One storey 8 Classrooms

Kayole North/Kayole Central will benefit with more bursaries.

#### MIN03/30/01/2023-BURSARY 2022/2023

Out of the constituency allocation, it was noted that the Bursary allocation exceeded the normal ceiling of 35% of total allocation. This was occasioned by the previous massive applications received versus the allocation that has never been sufficient. More than 20,000 applications come in through the office and other institutions but merely does the 35% ceiling cater for even 50% of these applicants. Secondly, most constituents have never recovered from the COVID-19 aftermath that rendered most of them jobless. Most families have never stabilized. Many school goers dropped out of school due to lack of fees. As a result, the committee proposed to increase the allocation to about 40% of total allocation to try and assist more needy cases. The committee requested the NG-CDF Board to consider this plea with the utmost attention it deserves.

## MINO4/30/01/23- PROJECT PROPOSAL FINANCIAL YEAR 2022/2023

The committee was informed by the FAM that during the F/Y 2022/2023 Embakasi Central NG-CDF will receive an allocation of Kshs.145,087,603. The chairman although notified members that this financial year there was no any secondary school that will benefit among the 3 secondary schools available in the constituency since there was no any project that needed an emergency attention they were all in good conditions.

Additionally the Chairman noted that the more classrooms that were being constructed in Komarock South and Thawabu Primary Schools were creating room for further establishment of Secondary schools in the aforementioned schools in future.

The Fund Account Manager was then tasked by the committee to prepare and forward to the NG-CDF Board a proposal for F/Y 2022/2023 as follows:-
