#### INTRODUCTION

The NG-Constituency Development Act 2015 stipulates in part 5 section 27 subsection 1 and 2 that the chairperson of the NG-CDFC shall, within the first year of the commencement of a new Parliament and at least once every two years thereafter, convene open forum public meetings in every ward in the constituency to deliberate on development matters in the ward and in the constituency.

The NG-CDFC shall then deliberate on project proposals from all the wards in the constituency and any other projects which the Constituency Committee considers beneficial to the constituency, including joint projects with other constituencies, consider the national development plans and policies and the constituency strategic development plan, and identify a list of priority projects, both immediate and long term, out of which the list of projects to be submitted in accordance with the Act shall be drawn from.

Citizen participation in project planning, management and implementation planning requires the involvement of concerned stakeholders. This includes identifying public concerns and values and developing a broad consensus on planned initiatives. It is also about utilizing the vast amount of information and knowledge that stakeholders hold to find workable, efficient and sustainable solutions

Public participation encompasses a range of procedures and methods designed to consult, involve, and inform the public to allow those that would be potentially affected by a decision or policy to have input into the process. Community participation motivates the stakeholders to work together, recognize the benefits of their involvement and own the projects in their localities

Stakeholders play a central role in setting up priorities and objectives of development Initiatives in order to ensure relevance and appropriateness. It is important that

all stakeholders are involved in the development of projects and not just direct beneficiaries of an initiative.

#### ABOUT NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, 2003, amended in 2007 and repealed by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the CDF Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, being the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act. NG-CDF Act, 2015. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

The Constituency Development Fund (CDF) was introduced in Kenya in 2003 with the passage of the CDF Act 2003 by the 9th Parliament of Kenya which was repealed in 2013 by the CDF Act 2013. The CDF Act provides that the government set aside at least 2.5% of its ordinary revenue for disbursement under the CDF program.

The fund was designed to support constituency-level, grass-root development projects. It was aimed to achieve equitable distribution of development resources across regions and to control imbalances in regional development brought about by partisan politics. It targeted all constituency-level development projects, particularly those aiming to combat poverty at the grassroots and entrench equitable distribution of development.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanisms for supplementing implementation of the National Government development Agenda at the constituency level.

The CDF program has facilitated the putting up of new water systems, health and education facilities in all parts of the country, including remote areas that were usually overlooked during funds allocation in national budgets.

#### ABOUT MAKADARA NG-CDF

Makadara constituency is one of the seventeen (17) constituencies in Nairobi County. Since independence Makadara constituency interchanged its nomenclature such as Donholm constituency at 1963 and 1969 elections, then as Bahati Constituency and Makadara since 1997. It lies in the central east and southern parts of Nairobi City County. Makadara constituency has common boundaries with Embakasi south to the south, Starehe to the west, Embakasi East to the East and Kamukunji to the North. The constituency covers an area of approximately 20 KM2.

Makongeni/Kaloleni

#### PRELIMINARIES / COMMENTS BY THE AREA CHIEF

The area sub chief welcomed members to the meeting after an opening prayer. He thanked the people present for attending the important development forum.

#### COMMENTS BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY COMMISSIONER

He explained to the meeting the history of rural development funding in Kenya Since independence in 1963 aimed at fighting poverty at the grassroots level has been one of the key agendas of the Kenyan government. The government has initiated various rural development programs including Special Rural Development Programme, District Development Planning, Rural Development Fund and the District Focus for Rural Development Strategy with the aim of improving people's wellbeing.

However, most of these programs failed to address the needs of local people due to lack of political will, inadequate government funding, lack of appropriate technology, neglect of institutional development, lack of beneficiary participation and poor coordination from top to the bottom. However, in 2003 the government introduced Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF), to fight poverty at the grassroots and since its inception, NG-CDF has had tremendous impact among the rural communities in Kenya

#### COMMENTS BY THE FUND ACCOUNT MANAGER

He enlightened the members about the eligible projects fundable by NG-CDF and ineligible projects which are fundable by devolved systems, and also briefed the meeting on the statutory ceilings specified in the NG-CDF Act 2015 which guide the NG-CDFC during projects funding. She also stressed that after the exercise in all the wards the NG-CDFC will rank the projects in order of priority and that the that on-going projects shall take precedence over all other projects

#### COMMENTS BY THE NG-CDFC CHAIRMAN

The chairman appreciated the members concern for development, he highlighted that NG- CDF has achieved a lot towards development in the constituency, and the overall aim of this is to ensure active participation of people in the achievement of sustainable development.

#### COMMENTS BY THE AREA MEMBER OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

He mentioned that if the public is involved in the full decision making process during projects identification, their concerns may be met early on in the planning process when changes may be easier to make, rather than late in the process when even small changes may cost both time and money.

He drew the meetings attention that NG-CDF was established with the aim of improving service delivery, alleviating poverty, enhancing economic governance, and ultimately to spur development in the constituencies thereby contributing to socio-economic development of all the constituencies.



Late disbursement of project funds leads to projects not being implemented in time which lead to rise in project costs due to factors like inflation due to time value f money and bursaries not awarded to students when the schools open, hence students and pupils retention in learning institutions is greatly affected negatively.

There were no matters arising.

#### MIN 03/01/2023 ONGOING PROJECTS REPORT

As a requirement by the NG CDFB the fund manager told the committee that all the ongoing projects shall be given priority in funding in the new proposal before any new project is considered for funding. the fund manager presented a list of all ongoing projects and amounts needed for completion

#### I) St John's primary school - Construction of 6 classrooms

The fund manager informed the members that the contract price for this project was Kshs 12,513,640 and amount allocated in the previous budget was Kshs 12,000,000 hence the deficit of Kshs 513,640 needed to be allocated in the current proposal to fully cover for the contract price. The deficit was not earlier captured in the ongoing projects report because from the BOQ the Engineer had indicated that there was likely to be a saving in the project but due to escalations in material prices and some proposed landscaping around the project the entire contract price would be reached.

#### II) Kimathi primary school - construction of 20 door ablution block

A deficit of Kshs 1,330,190.80 was the difference between the contract price and the amount allocated in the previous years and needed to be allocated in the new proposal.

#### III) St. Annes Primary school - Drilling and equipping of bore hole

An allocation of Kshs 6,097,594.98 and a balance of Kshs 3,504,722.62 was needed to fully complete the project. However the project was still in its initial stages the FAM advised that Kshs 2,500,00 would be adequate for now to pay all the payments raised by the contractor before the end of the financial year with the balance to be factored in the coming reallocations of unspent 2020/2021 and 2021/2022 emergency funds for completed projects to be done immediately after the project proposals.

#### IV) Bahati primary school construction of classrooms

Jalloon Zeven

#### a) Construction of 2 classroom

This project was awarded at a contract of Kshs 3,975,378 unfortunately the contractor was un able to complete the project and abandoned it after a payment of Kshs 2,839,558 hence the

3

project has a balance of Kshs 1,135,820.00. Various attempts to reach the contractor to come and complete the project have been futile.

#### b) Construction of 6 classrooms and 2 offices

This project was awarded at a cost of Kshs.12,500,000 of which Kshs.6,000,000 was allocated in the last year's budget. And completed the 1<sup>st</sup> phase the balance therefore is expected to be factored in the 2022/2023 proposal.

To ensure the project is completed the Fund Manager consulted with the supervising engineer as to whether the second contractor can finish the abandoned 2 classes as he completes his project. The engineer advised that since there was a project balance of Kshs.1,135,820 on the first project it was enough to complete the first project hence the NGCDFC only needed to authorize the contractor to proceed with the abandoned works at the same price quoted in his contract and the engineer would pay for the works done accordingly.

#### V) Makongeni Secondary School - Construction of 2 Laboratories

Kshs.5, 611,678.63 was allocated for this project out of a contract price of Kshs.9, 966,350.00 hence Kshs.4, 354,672.00 is to be allocated in the current financial year. The NG-CDFC was advised by the Nairobi city county engineer that Kshs.4,000,000 will be adequate, since there was savings from contingency and the excavation works was not deep as earlier estimated.

VI) Jogoo road police station - Construction of Perimeter wall landscaping, roof repairs and painting of the entire police station.


This project was awarded at a contract of Kshs.4, 473,280.00. Kshs.3,516,895.31 was allocated for this project hence the project has a balance of Kshs 956,384.69 which needs to be allocated in the current financial year to complete the project.






