Introduction or Background

About NG-CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established through an Act of the Kenyan Parliament in the Year 2003 and in the year 2015 the whole Act was repealed giving birth to the National Government Constituency Development Fund Act. The Fund is distributed to each of the 290 Parliamentary Constituencies for the purposes of development and in particular the fight against poverty at Constituency level.

The fund is allocated a minimum of 2.5% of all Government Ordinary Revenue collected in every financial year for distribution by the NG-CDF Board to each of the 290 Constituencies Equally.

About Starehe

Starehe constituency is a constituency in Nairobi County and it comprises of three divisions namely Nairobi south division, central division and cbd division which has six wards i.e. Central Ward, Ziwani Ward, Pangani Ward, Ngara ward, Nairobi South ward and Landimawe Ward. Starehe Ngcdf has 11 committee members and 3 oversight members

The role of the CDF Committee is to collect proposals for Projects from the Community at the grassroots, prioritize the projects for funding and subsequently disburse funds to these projects and Monitor and Evaluate their Implementation to ensure they achieve the stated objectives of the Fund.

In the Financial Year (2022/2023) the constituency is to receive Ksh.151, 960,174

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed by Lucy and seconded by Kevin.

MIN 3/13/01/2023: REVIEW OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND SUMMARY

The committee noted that the mobilization of the community was well coordinated since the turn up was above average. The committee had budget for around 250-300 persons but the turnout was around 400-500 persons. The highest turn up was in Nairobi South and Landimawe wards. The committee discussed the public participation process and noted that the community needs to be given proper information on the roles of NGCDF. The community did not focus on giving the relevant programs instead there was a mix up of the proposed projects. The community proposed even programs that are a reserve of the County Government. The committee therefore ruled that from the available list of projects as summarized to be sorted as per the relevance.


