MIN 2/17/02/2022 READING AND CONFIRMATION OF THE PREVIOUS MINUTES

MIN 3/17/02/2022 MATTERS ARISING

Members discussed that there are 6 unpaid M&E'S and 3 unpaid meetings which should be sorted out soonest possible.  - a) Fully Sponsored the committee agreed to always prioritize these students and complete their fee payments on time
 - b) Partially sponsored
 - i. Total orphans but with able guardians 5,000-7000
 - ii. Single parents students 5,000-7,000
 - iii. Both parents but needy 5,000-7,000
- 3. Day Secondary schools
 - a) Fully sponsored the committee agreed to always prioritize these students to complete their fee payments on time
 - b) Partially sponsored
 - i. Total orphans but with able guardians 2,500-4,000
 - ii. Single parent students 2,500-4,000
 - iii. Both parents but needy 2,500-4,000
- 4. Boarding secondary schools
 - a) Fully sponsored the committee agreed to always prioritize these students to complete their fee payment on time
 - b) Partially sponsored
 - i. Total orphans but with able guardians 4,000-7,000
 - ii. Single parent students 4,000-7,000
 - iii. Both parents but needy 4,000-7,000

Those students with high school fees balances and depending on their category would be given priority. The committee agreed to replace bursary cheques as follows:
