## 0.0 Introduction or Background

### 0.1 About CDF

The Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) was established under the Constituencies Development Fund (CDF) Act, amended in 2007 and replaced by the CDF Act of 2013. In 2015, the Act of 2013 was declared unconstitutional and a new Act was enacted in 2015, called the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act NG-CDF Act 2015 amended 2016 and 2022. The National Government Constituencies Development fund (NG-CDF) was placed under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

The objective of the Fund is to provide mechanism for supplementing implementation of the National Government Development Agenda at the Constituency level.

### 0.2 About Nakuru Town West

Nakuru Town West Constituency was carved out of the former Nakuru Town Constituency. The constituency has six wards namely:- London, Kaptembwo, Shabaab, Rhonda, Kapkures and Barut wards. The Constituency shares part of Nakuru town with Nakuru town East Constituency. It borders Rongai, Nakuru town East and Njoro Constituencies.

The main economic activity is farming. Despite the constituency having factories and industrial area, most of the slum dwellings are found within the constituency and with poor infrastructures.

The committee finds a lot of challenges when allocating funds since project demands is always higher than the allocations. Most of the residents are poor and they highly depend on the funds.



He encouraged them they should own the projects funder NG-CDF since its them whom brought the proposals for funding.

He further emphasized that the completed construction of Mama Ngina Primary School 2 classrooms and removal of asbestos in Kenyatta Secondary School has improved education standards in the schools. He noted that currently completed construction of Sub-County Headquarters has greatly improved service delivery in the constituency.

#### 2.6.05 Comments by FAM on the nature of projects in respect to CDF Act.


The FAM highlighted the nature of the projects that are fundable currently under NG-CDF. She emphasized that once the fund is allocated to a project, the PMCs under the guidance of the NG-CDF office will implement the projects.

The Fam quoted the section of the Act 2015 Amemnded 2016 and 2022, Sec 24 (a) and (b) which states: -

*"A Project under this Act shall-*

*(a) only be in respect of works and services falling within the functions of the national government under the Constitution; and*

*(b) be community based in order to ensure that the benefits are available to a widespread cross-section of the inhabitants of a particular area."*

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### 2.6.06 Comments by FAM/Chairman on bursary and environment.

The NG-CDFC Chairman notified the public that Bursary will be always awarded to all successful applicants who meet the set criteria outlined in the bursary form. He noted that members should always freely pick the bursary forms from the office when advertised through social places, DCC notice board, Chiefs and Assistant chief office, social media and in the NG-CDF Office. He further emphasized that environment projects are funded to help conserve the environment, therefore such projects proposals should also be proposed or forwarded to the NF-CDF Office and when funded, the community should ensure such projects are fully implemented.



It was also noted that there were many projects that needed funding in schools, security especially chiefs and assistant chief's offices and roads.







#### 4. Bursary, Sports, Environment, Emergency, NG-CDFC Office

The members deliberated on the issue of bursary, sports and environment for some time. The manager informed members that emergency funds are set aside for the emergency purposes for the event of any unforeseen eventuality during the financial year under review as the members not prioritize any project for emergency funding.

The members deliberated on the issue of bursary and agreed to fund bursary schemes for secondary and tertiary school it was agreed to fund full amount of bursary at 35% of the total allocation as stipulated by the NG-CDF Act.

It was noted that Nakuru Town West Being a cosmopolitan with residents with low income and high poverty level with many not able to read and write and not able to pay school fees for their children. As a result of

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COVID-19, many parents were experiencing hard times and were not able to pay school fees for most of their children leading to many students opting to drop out of school.

The NG-CDF Committee deliberated and resolved to add **Ksh. 10,000,000** to cater for students in Day/Boarding schools, on top of the agreed maximum ceiling allocated of 35% totaling to **Ksh. 53,186,060.90**. Total Bursary allocation for Bursary is Ksh. 63,186,060.90 as tabulated below;

The members deliberated and agreed that during the financial year they consider the construction of laboratories in primary school for Junior Secondary Schools to help in transition.

It was noted that Nakuru Town West constituency being part of the city, it was very difficult to find enough parcel of land at a central place to construct the Office. Most of the administration offices i.e Kaptembwo Assistant County Commissioner (ACC), Shabaa Chief Office and Githima Assistant Chief Office, were equally lacking offices. Member deliberated and agreed to construct a 2 Storey offices that will accommodate NG-CDFC Office, Constituency Office and Administration Offices to help maximize the space available. Members agreed that the office will be constructed in 2 phases;
