REF: ROLE OF KENYA FOREST SERVICE IN THE TREE PLANTING INITIATIVE

KFS actively support the tree planting exercise through the following actions

- TECHNICAL GUIDANCE: providing expert knowledge on appropriate tree species selection ecological suitability and climate resilience. The forestry office shall participate in mapping out specific areas within the kayas that shall be planted, guiding the team on the tree planting day by demonstrating how seedlings should be planted and spacing.
- 2. PROVISION OF SEEDLINGS: Facilitating access to quality indigenous and exotic tree seedlings through our national nurseries.
- 3. COMMUNINITY ENGAGEMENT; Working with local community groups and stakeholders to promote participatory forestry, ensuring their involvement in planting and monitoring activities. capacity building the kaya elders and the Matuga constituency Environmental Conservation committee on how to care for the seedling by providing security to guard areas from encroaching herders and occasional watering of seedling to survival stage.
- 4. LOGISTICALSUPPORT; Assisting in coordinating and mobilizing resources for the successful implementation of the project.

MECHANISMS FOR ENSURING SUSTAINABILITY OF PLANTED TREES

To guarantee the long -term success and sustainability of this tree planting initiative KFS has put in place following measures.

1. Post-planting care & monitoring; Implementing and evaluation programs to access tree survival rates and address challenges such as pest infestations and water shortages.



- 2. Capacity building and training: conducting training sessions for local communities, school and stakeholders on the best practices tree maintenance; including watering pruning and soil management.
- 3. Integration with Restoration programs: Aligning this initiative with ongoing national and regional afforestation and reforestation programs, such as the 30% tree cover target outlined in Kenya's vision 2030 and the National strategy for Achieving and maintaining Tree cover.
- 4. Community -Based Forest Management; Collaborating with community forest to establish long-term stewardship and encourage local ownership of reforestation efforts.
- 5. Legislative support & Enforcement: Ensuring planted trees are protected from illegal logging, encroachment and other threats through enforcement of forest conservation laws and policies.

KFS remains committed to working closely with all stakeholders to restore and enhance forest cover in Kenya. We appreciate your collaboration in this initiative and looking forward to a successful tree planting and conservation program.

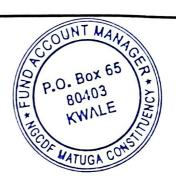

The chairman went ahead to table the items of agenda as listed and urged members to participate actively in the deliberations of the day's business.

MIN 5/21/11/2024 - PROJECT PROPOSAL BUDGET FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025

The chairman revisited the NGCDF Board Circular referenced NGCDFB/CEO/NGCDF CIRCULARS /VOL III (001) dated 22nd October 2024 that had triggered the urgent need for convening of public participation forums to collect views from the constituents for the preparation and submission of the Project Proposals for the financial year 2024/2025 as discussed in the previous sitting held on Thursday, 31st October 2024 that discussed the contents of the circular and resolved to prepare a program for the public participation forums that followed mobilization of the community through the ministry of interior and coordination of national government systems to attend the forums.

In the circular, Matuga NGCDF has been allocated kshs.179,441,954.47 for the financial year 2024/2025 project proposal budget.

The chairman further reminded members of the key guiding areas as per the circular that should guide the committee in preparation and submission of the proposal to the NGCDF Board for consideration as follows;

- 1. Project identification through ward forums
- 2. Consultation with the appropriate agencies on realistic project cost estimates
- 3. Consideration of ongoing projects as a priority in the proposal
- 4. Budgeting of administration and Monitoring expenses
- 5. Consideration of climate change mitigation and adaptation activities



- 6. Financing of Constituency Digital Hubs
- 7. Funding of social security programme and Social Support Programme
- 8. Construction of NGCDFC offices
- 9. Projects considered under Appropriation in Aid
- 10. Procurement of NGCDFC Motor vehicle
- 11. Aligning Projects to BETA, Constituency Strategic Plan and other National Residuence Plan and Other Plan an

a. Deliberation on the Ward Report

The Chairman tabled the ward forums report that was conducted between 8th November 2024 and 12th November 2024. During the ward forums, the participants were guided on types of projects and the basis of consideration which included the projects being exclusively falling within the functions of the national government and being community based in such a way that they benefit all citizens and foster sustainable development, promote human dignity and protect the marginalized in the society as per the outlined values and principles of good governance.

The chairman reiterated that participants of the ward forums were encouraged to propose projects guided by the constituency strategic plan and the National Government guiding policies and circulars.

The committee summarized all projects proposed in each ward exclusively falling within education, security and climate change mitigation measures as summarized below and supported by annexure III to the minutes.

b. Realistic Project cost estimates

All the allocations to the infrastructural projects were guided by the clerk of works who was representing the public works officer who is the project manager for all the national government projects within the sub-county. To ensure realistic project costings, the officer mentioned the following key issues to be considered by the committee.

- Specific Project activities and scope
- Market price adjustments on materials, labour and transport
- Project site Soil topology and topography
- Technical reports such as project variation reports for ongoing projects
- Projects designs and user preference and specifications
- Project site location within the constituency as the constituency is expansive with following roads network and bad terrain

The committee considered the above in determining the realistic costs of the infrastructural projects that were finally submitted to the Board for consideration and approval.

c. Ongoing Projects

The Fund Account Manager table the summary of the ongoing projects report as submitted to the NGCDF Board as at 31st October 2024. From the report, nine projects have been reported as ongoing. Some of these projects, notable Kwale Girls Secondary school laboratory, Mtsamvian secondary school laboratory, Mangawani primary school JSS tuition block, Waa primary school JSS tuition block and Ziwani primary school JSS tuition block were meant to be completed, however due to cost variations as advised by the public works office, the projects were appraised for additional funding to completion status. Other projects such as Tandaza Model school, Kwale primary school dormitory, Chitsanze Girls secondary school dormitory and Mtsamviani secondary school dormitory were to be funded in different phases and required additional funds to either complete a phase or final

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phase. The Fund Account Manager reminded members that funding of ongoing projects takes precedence and must be done within three financial years.

The tabled list of ongoing projects amounting to kshs.30,200,000 after deliberation by the committee is attached to the minutes in annex II

d. Statutory ceilings for administration and Monitoring and Evaluation

The Fund Account manager briefed members of the key guidelines by the NGCDF Board and informed the committee that the NGCDF Board laid more emphasis on the following areas;

- Provision of a detailed budget with clear breakdown of each component towards funds for administration and recurrent expenditure
- Allocation of funds to staff salaries to be informed by a documented staffing structure approved by the Committee with clear job description for each employee and must conform to the government guidelines on minimum wage.
- Consideration of other statutory deductions such as housing levy, National Social Security Fund (NSSF) and Social Health Insurance Fund (SHIF)
- Costing of the funds allocated to Monitoring and Evaluation to be informed by a proper work plan as provided in clearly elaborating the committee activities for the year

The Administration Recurrent, Monitoring & Evaluation and Capacity building budgets were tabled by the Fund Account manager and deliberated on by the committee to conclusion as attached in annex I to the minutes.

e. Climate change mitigation and adaptation activities

The Fund Account manager tabled guidelines on climate change mitigation measures as issued by the NGCDF Board to guide the committee on proposing projects for funding. The committee deliberated on the many applications received from various self help groups and institutions but were finally persuaded by the application made by the Matuga Constituency Environment Conservation & Climate Change Mitigation Committee that sought to re-afforest the destroyed kayas in the constituency namely; Kaya Bombo, Kaya Teleza, Kaya Tiwi and Kaya Chombo as these were understood to be strong water catchment areas that largely influenced cloud formation for rainfall as they cover the hills of Matuga constituency and for along time, had contributed to regular rain falls almost every morning until encroachments by loggers, charcoal burners and peasant farmers began infiltrating the forests. The conservation of these forests was most welcomed as they hold strong cultural heritages for the communities around them in as far as historical values are preserved.

In addition, the committee was convinced that Matuga Constituency Environment Conservation & Climate Change Mitigation Committee has the capacity to take care of the planted tree seedlings to survival stage as it is made up of dedicated young environmentalists.

f. Funding of Junior Secondary Schools

The chairman tabled a report from the County Director of Education - Kwale County indicating shortage of classrooms in Junior Secondary Schools especially for grade 8 class as captured below;

The committee deliberated on the tabled data and arrived at a contrary opinion on the assertions that grade eight students had shortage of classrooms arguing that grade eight was formerly known as standard eight and classrooms have all along been available since all the listed schools have administered KCPE examinations for many years. The committee was not persuaded by the postulations and instead argued that reported shortages of classrooms should have been for grade nine as that was the newly introduced unit in the primary division. However, the committee was reminded of its pivotal role in education infrastructural development in the constituency and after consideration of the availability of funds and other needy projects, the committee prioritized completion of ongoing JSS tuition blocks that had been started in the previous financial year and committed to consider for funding the schools that would still be experiencing shortage of classrooms in the subsequent financial years since information gathered at a briefing with the area member of parliament had alluded that the head of state had informed them - members of parliament at a meeting at state house in the month of January 2025 that the government had already set aside funds for construction of twenty thousand JSS classrooms throughout the country in the financial year 2024-2025.

g. Constituency Digital Hubs

The Fund Account Manager tabled the guidelines on the proposed Constituency Digital Hubs to be implemented as a presidential directive in every constituency.

The committee embraced this project as a special gift by the state that would go along way in engaging the youth in income generating online activities which would go along way in solving the joblessness pandemic in the constituency especially for the youth.

The committee resolved to allocate Basic Model Digital Hubs in Kubo south ward (at Lukore Chief's Office compound), Mkongani ward (at Mkongani Chief's Office compound) and Waa/Ng'ombeni ward (at Kombani Chief's Office compound) for a start and proposed the renovation of the Constituency Innovation Hub to the status of a Digital Hub located in

Tsimba/Golini ward at Kwale primary school. The basic model was estimated at kshs.4M by the public works officer and the renovation of the CIH to a Digital hub at kshs.1M respectively.

The committee settled for the basic model digital hub for a start considering the population size that would utilize the facility putting in mind that the constituency is majorly rural constituency and majority of the targeted beneficiaries prefer residing in major towns elsewhere and the current literacy capacity of the users. The construction sites were decided after consideration of adequate land availability for the project, general security of the project, ease of accessibility of the facility by users and centrally location of the facility within the ward.

The committee did not see the need to allocate recurrent expenditure for the Digital Hubs as they would still be under construction in the financial year 2024/2025 as proposed in the project proposal.

h. Funding of Social Security Programme and Social Support Programme Matuga NGCDF does supports the elderly, the vulnerable, disabled and economically burdened

terminal ill patients who are not in a position to support themselves.

Matuga NGCDF has been supporting 500 vulnerable families in the last two years and has proposed to increase the support to 650 vulnerable families in the financial year 2024/2025 by allocating kshs.4M towards social security program for provision of universal health care through SHIF.

Once beneficiaries are identified after thorough vetting, SHA officials come in to register the beneficiaries and issue them with membership numbers. The office works closely with SHA officials stationed at Ukunda branch to keep beneficiary data updated throughout the year for seamless utilization of the service.

The committee commits to continue helping the vulnerable through the program until at such a time when their economic conditions improves or another agency of support namely; free health care by the national government or medical cover by the county government takes over the responsibilities.

i. Proposed establishment of Security projects

Security projects proposed for funding during the ward forums are assistant chief offices which are constructed for already established administrative units (sub-locations) with posted assistant chiefs who are currently serving from their homes. The decision to construct offices for the assistant chiefs is fully supported by the Sub-county security teams chaired by the Deputy County Commissioners and land for the same has always been set aside for public use in every ward during land adjudication by the Lands Registrar in the county.

j. Final project proposed with list of all prioritized projects

After lengthy deliberations and consideration of all areas as advised by the NGCDF Board including but not limited to public participation forums, adequate consultation with public works, ongoing project reports, work plans and budgets for administration and monitoring votes, aligning project to BETA, constituency strategic plan and other National Government Policies and circulars, the committee proposed the below listed projects to be forwarded to the NGCDF Board for consideration, approval and funding
