1.0 Introduction or Background

1.1 About CDF

Since 2003/04 (Cdf Act 2003), the Fund supported projects mainly in the areas of education, health, agriculture, roads, security, environment and sports. However, the NG-CDF (Amendment) Act 2016 introduced a major shift in the scope of projects eligible for funding. Under this Act only projects falling within the functions of the National Government as outlined in the Constitution of Kenya will be funded. This effectively means that moving forward; the Fund will concentrate primarily on education, security, sports, environment sectors and other national government residual functions

2.0 The main purpose of the fund is to enhance infrastructural and socio economic development at the grass root level in order to reduce poverty by dedicating a minimum of two and half per cent (2.5%) of all national Government revenue.

2.1 About NAROK NORTH

Narok North Constituency is an electoral constituency in Kenya. It is one of the constituencies in Narok County. The constituency is currently represented by Hon. Richard Moitalele Ole Kenta who was elected on an Orange Democratic Movement (ODM) party ticket in the National Super Alliance coalition. It has six (6) wards namely

4.1 NKARETA WARD PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

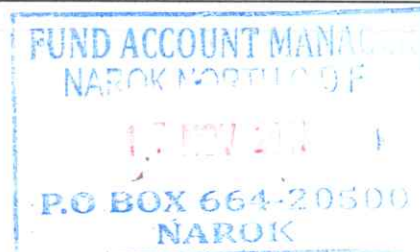


10.2 Conclusion
